### WHAT IS A STRUCTURE?

A structure is an assembly of materials forming a construction for occupancy or use to serve a specific purpose. This includes, but is not limited to, buildings, open platforms, bridges, roof assemblies over open storage or process areas, tents, air-supported structures, and grandstands.

- A building is a structure with a roof and walls (includes green house & carport).
