OLST Intent

A multi-agency team that emphasizes community risk reduction, shares best practices, coordinates, develops and implements consistent statewide fire prevention and life safety education.

HISTORY

Life Safety 2000 is Oregon's model plan to reduce the risk from fire and related emergencies to Oregon residents. A Life Safety 2000 task force recommended that an Oregon Life Safety Team be organized to change society's perception about fire, increase personal responsibility about fire safety, and coordinate statewide fire prevention efforts.

The moral: this groups been around for a LONG time!
