Smoke Alarms are designed to detect smoke and alert you to a fire inside your home, giving you more time to escape.

Smoke Alarms should be tested every month by pushing the test button. A smoke alarm that doesn't work, can't help you.



Smoke Alarms make a short chirping sound when their batteries are low, and three long beeps when there is smoke in the air.





Smoke Alarms can be silenced by pushing the test button to quiet a nuisance alarm for up to 15 seconds.
