
State of Fire Services

Structural Fire Service Overview

- 300 active responding structural fire agencies in Oregon
 - 212 Rural Fire Protection Districts
 - 59% provide EMS
 - 24% provide Ambulance Transport Service
- 49 Rural Fire Protection Districts currently contract with a responding agency for services
- Other agency types include tribal partners, private subscription agencies, and a special county district

March 2026







Staffing Levels

- Total staffing reported to the OSFM is tied closely to our survey response rate
- Oregon structural fire service averaging ~7,500 firefighters total since 2018
- Volunteers make up just over half of these firefighters

2010 - 2024





Total Reported Incidents 1980 - 2024










