

Sample Interview Questions

Early literacy projects:

- ✓ Young children develop the six early literacy skills by the time they start kindergarten.
 - Has your child learning anything new at storytime? If so, what they learn?
 - How does your feel about being read to?
- ✓ Adults enjoy reading, singing, talking, writing, and playing with their young children regularly to help them develop early literacy skills.
 - Why did you come to storytime today?
 - Has storytime change how you do early literacy activities with your child at home? If so, what do you do differently?

Summer reading projects:

- ✓ Youth maintain or improve their literacy skills over the summer.
 - Has your reading level has changed because you did the summer reading program?
 - What were you reading at the beginning of the summer? What are you reading now?
- ✓ Youth demonstrate their love of reading and learning by choosing to engage in these activities during their free time.
 - What did you learn at the library this summer?
 - Will you come back to the library after school starts? If so, what do you want to do at the library during the school year?
- ✓ Adults enjoy spending time engaging in literacy activities with youth regularly to help them develop literacy skills.
 - Why are you/your children participating in the summer reading program this year?
 - How does your family benefit from the summer reading program?

Documenting answers to interview questions:

It's important to establish a process that works for you to document answers to interview questions and save/file that documentation so you can refer to it when you fill out your report at the end of the year.
