

# Oregon Recreational Boating Fatality Statistics – 2023

The following statistics were taken from boating incident reports received by the State Marine Board for 2023. Incidents involving death, injury, or boat and/or property damage of \$2,000 or more must be reported.

Oregon had 13 recreational boating fatalities in 2023 – three less than the 16 in 2022. The oldest victim was 76 and the youngest was 15 years of age; with two women and 11 men.

Two of the 13 victims were wearing life jackets. Of those two, one was on white water and was pulled into a rock strainer and the other was wearing an inflatable life jacket that malfunctioned. One serious fatality to mention is that two of the 13 were victims of CO poisoning during the night in a cabin cruiser. Of the 13 fatalities it is likely that eight of the victims would have survived their incidents had they been wearing a life jacket.

Seven of the 13 fatalities were in non-motorized boats; six were in motorized boats. Seven of the 13 fatalities were over 50 years old; four were between the ages of 20 to 50 and two were 18 and younger. The victims in three of the 13 fatalities were the operator and sole occupant on the boat; six were passengers; and four were the operator. The three sole-occupant fatalities, all were in a non-motorized boat.
