Oregon Recreational Boating Fatality Statistics – 2024

The following statistics were taken from boating incident reports received by the State Marine Board for 2024. Incidents involving death, injury, or boat and/or property damage of \$2,000 or more must be reported.

Oregon had 19 recreational boating fatalities in 2024 – six more than the 13 in 2023. The oldest victim was 72 and the youngest was 11 years of age; with five women and 14 men.

Four of the 19 victims were wearing life jackets. Of those four, two involved towed watersports where one was being pulled on a tube and was swung into another boat and the operator of another didn't realize where the wakeboarder was and accidentally was pulled into the propeller. Three fatalities involved one boat in which two of the three were trapped in the boat when it capsized due to heavy weather. Four out of the 19 fatalities involved alcohol. Of the 19 fatalities it is likely that 16 of the victims would have survived their incidents had they worn a life jacket.

Six of the 19 fatalities were in non-motorized boats; 10 were in motorized boats (three fatalities in one boat). Eight of the 19 fatalities were over 50 years old; nine were between the ages of 26 to 50; one between the ages of 18 to 25, and one was under 18 years of age. The victims in four of the 19 fatalities were the operator and sole occupant on the boat; 10 were passengers; and five were the operator. The three of the four sole-occupant fatalities were in a non-motorized boat.

The primary cause of fatal incidents this year were capsizing. The primary, secondary and tertiary contributing factors this year were operator inattention, heavy weather, and a tie between operator inexperience and hazardous water.
