



BOAT RENTAL BUSINESS GUIDE

What is a livery or boat rental business? Any person who is engaged full or part-time in the business of leasing or renting boats (including personal watercraft, kayaks, SUPs, etc.) to other persons.

What is an outfitter guide? An Outfitter Guide is a person, or someone affiliated with a business that offers outdoor recreational services (leading, instructing or assisting) for any sort of compensation.

Oregon Revised Statute 830.425 requires boat rental businesses to register with the [Marine Board](#). Registration can be done electronically by going to the [Boat Oregon Store](#), logging into your account, then **click "Online Services", and selecting "Boat Rental Business Registration."** Please complete all the information required, if applicable. What if I am already registered, how do I renew?

Once you have registered with the Marine Board you will be required to renew every two years. The renewal process can be done by going to the [Boat Oregon Store](#), logging into your account, then going to **"Online Services", and selecting "Boat Rental Business Registration Renewal"** where you will then fill out the application and submit online to the Marine Board.

Motorized Boat Equipment & Registration Requirements

State law requires all motorized rental boats to be equipped with specific safety equipment that is in good serviceable condition and boats must be currently registered displaying valid decals. There must be a properly fitted US Coast Guard approved life jacket for everyone on board the rented boat.

Non-motorized Boat Equipment & Waterway Access Permit Requirements

If you rent non-motorized boats, you must purchase the Waterway Access Permit for each boat. There is a discount on bulk permits for rental businesses, liveries, and Outfitter Guides that can only be purchased through the Marine Board online store. Non-motorized boats that are rented, including stand-up paddleboards, must include a properly fitted US Coast Guard approved life jacket and a sound making device like a whistle.

Boating Safety Education Requirements

Oregon's [Mandatory Boating Education](#) law requires individuals operating any boat with a motor greater than 10 hp, including personal watercraft, to carry a Boating Safety Education Card issued by Oregon or another approved state. There are age restrictions for operation of motorboats and personal watercraft.

Renters who do not have an approved issued Boating Safety Education Card have the option of completing a ["Watercraft Rental Safety Checklist"](#) for motorboats and a ["PWC Safety Checklist"](#) for personal watercraft (jet skis). The dates on the checklist signatory page must match the dates of the rental agreement. The bottom portion of the checklist must be carried by the renter while operating.

To promote safe boating practices, the Marine Board provides a [Paddling Safety Checklist](#) that outlines the legal requirements and safety information needed for non-motorized boating. The paddling checklist is not mandatory, but we recommend going over the checklist with all paddling rental customers.
