Re: NOTICE OF SEIZURE OF VESSEL OR 313 DD

Dear Mr. Livermore:

An Ericson Yacht sailboat, 25' in length, with Hull Identification Number 115356, registration number OR 313 DD, is scheduled to be seized by the Oregon State Marine Board Friday, September 22, 2024. This vessel is currently beached at Tom McCall Waterfront Park in Portland. The enforcement agency posted a pre-seizure sticker on the vessel Wednesday, August 7, 2024.

This vessel will be seized under authority of ORS 830.911 as a derelict vessel due to it being in imminent danger of sinking. ORS 830.918(4) this vessel is considered derelict as it has no manageable way to underway, it lacks a motor and/or a sail. This vessel will be seized unless the problems identified in the notice are remedied within the time specified in this notice. As the owner of the vessel, you may be cited for possession of a derelict vessel if you fail to remedy the problems identified in this notice with the time specified in this notice.



Oregon State Marine Board records indicate that you are the owner of this vessel. As the owner, you are liable for all costs arising from salvage, towing, storage and disposal.

To prevent seizure and potential disposal of this vessel, you must remove the vessel from its current location.

If you fail to reclaim the vessel prior to the date specified in this notice, the title to the vessel will be vested with the Oregon State Marine Board. The vessel will be destroyed, and you will remain liable for unpaid costs. The total cost of salvage, towing, storage and disposal is estimated to be \$5,737, but the final costs could be higher or lower than this estimate.

You have the right to request a hearing to challenge the seizure of the vessel. If you wish to request a hearing, you must submit your request in writing to the OSMB prior to the deadline given above. You must indicate the specific grounds on which the seizure of the vessel is challenged.
