## Oregon Dept. of Motor Vehicles Informational Bulletin

### SB 515 – Lemon Law Buyback brands

Senate Bill 515 was passed by the 2009 Oregon Legislature. This legislation requires DMV to add the notation "Lemon Law Buyback" to a title and vehicle record when the manufacturer repurchases a motor vehicle under Oregon's consumer warranty law and must title the vehicle in the manufacturer's name.

SB 515 **only applies to motor vehicles** (no trailers, campers, etc.) and **only to motor vehicles purchased or leased on or after the operative date of September 21, 2009.**

In addition to the title brands that are currently printed on Oregon titles, DMV will add a new title brand for "Lemon Law Buyback" when a manufacturer repurchases a motor vehicle under the requirements of SB 515. The following table lists the new Lemon Law Buyback brand in **bold**, along with possible brand combinations, the type of title the brand is applied to, and then the code that will display on vehicle record:

New Lemon Law Buyback Brand and Combinations	Title Type	New Brand Codes
Lemon Law Buyback	Regular, Salvage	LLB
Totaled, <b>Lemon Law Buyback</b>	Salvage	TLB
Totaled, Reconstructed, <b>Lemon Law Buyback</b>	Regular, Salvage	CLB
Branded with two-letter state abbreviation, <b>Lemon Law Buyback</b>	Regular, Salvage	HXX*
Flood with two-letter state abbreviation, <b>Lemon Law Buyback</b>	Regular, Salvage	JXX
Totaled, Branded with two-letter state abbreviation, <b>Lemon Law Buyback</b>	Salvage	SXX
Totaled, Flood with two-letter state abbreviation, <b>Lemon Law Buyback</b>	Salvage	QXX

*\*XX refers to the state name abbreviation.*

In addition to vehicle titles, the new Lemon Law Buyback brand will also be printed on vehicle registration cards and renewal reminders in the same location that brands currently appear.
