Oregon Dept. of Motor Vehicles – Training Bulletin

Beginning on January 1, 2010, the traffic offense of refusal to take a breath test (ORS 813.095) is being expanded to include refusal to take a urine test. The revised offense applies to anyone who is arrested for driving under the influence of intoxicants on or after January 1, 2010, and refuses to take a breath test or urine test requested pursuant to the provisions of Oregon's implied consent law.

DMV has revised form 735-75 (Implied Consent Combined Report) in Section 1 of the "rights and consequences" portion of the form to inform the person of these additional consequences of refusing a urine test.

Beginning January 1, 2010, law enforcement agencies must stop using all previous versions of the Implied Consent form and begin using the new version. Your agency should have received a small supply of the new form earlier this month, with instructions for how to obtain additional forms as needed. To obtain additional supplies of the form please fax your request to: ODOT Storeroom at 503-986-2801. You may use a "Request for DMV Forms" Form 735-6110, or you may use business letterhead, being sure to include the complete name and address for delivery of the forms.

You should continue to use the current forms through December 31st, but **please be sure to discard all remaining supply of any of the previous version(s) of this form you may have on hand, and only use the new version of the form for arrests occurring on or after January 1, 2010.**
