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In our continuing quest to better serve the citizens of Oregon, it is my pleasure to announce that the Forensic Services Division (FSD) will be implementing a public-facing web portal that will allow for expedited discovery and public records requests. The Forensic Document Portal (FDP) is accessed via this link (no username or password is required to enter the portal).

The FDP contains those forensic manuals and other controlled documents in effect starting in 2018 to present. Public users of the portal can search all available documents to determine those relevant to a particular forensic analysis. Documents may be downloaded and printed.

If you are tasked with requesting or reviewing forensic documents for Discovery purposes, we ask that you use the months of November and December to familiarize yourself with the FDP. **Beginning January 1, 2024, any requests for records that are publicly available on the website will not be directly fulfilled by the FSD.**
