Revised LEPC manual available

The OSFM has updated the [Oregon Local Emergency Planning Committee \(LEPC\) Member Manual](#) that covers all facets of LEPC responsibilities, including guidance on how the responsibilities should be addressed. Topics include: how LEPCs use information from facilities subject to the reporting law, incorporating information into LEPC emergency plans, identifying community areas that may be affected by a hazardous substance release, and recommendations on educating the public on protecting themselves and their families during a release. The manual also covers types of funding options available to LEPCs. Even if you are not an LEPC member, information in the manual can help with understanding the types of activities occurring in your community that helps protect you and others from hazardous material releases.
