New Reporting Requirements Effective January 2021

During the 2019 legislative session, HB2045B was signed into law. This resulted in two new sex offender reporting requirements. **These requirements went into effect on January 1st, 2021.**

1. Legal Name Change (also required under federal law)

Sex offenders with reporting requirements who legally change their name must report **within 10 days of that change taking effect.**

Failure to report a legal name change is punishable by up to 364 days imprisonment, a \$6,250 fine, or both. If the sex crime requiring reporting is a felony, the law punishes failure to report a legal name change by a maximum five years imprisonment, a \$125,000 fine, or both.

2. Intended International Travel (also required under federal law)

Sex offenders with reporting requirements who intend to engage in international travel must report **at least 21 days prior to any travel outside of the United States.**

Failure to report intended international travel is punishable by up to 364 days imprisonment, a \$6,250 fine, or both. If the sex crime requiring reporting is a felony, the law punishes failure to report intended international travel by a maximum five years imprisonment, a \$125,000 fine, or both.
