



# Profile: Oregon's Occupational Therapist Workforce – 2012

## Quick Facts

The number of active licensed occupational therapists (OTs) working in Oregon increased nearly 12% between 2010 and 2012.

OTs identified a practice address in 27 of Oregon's 36 counties.

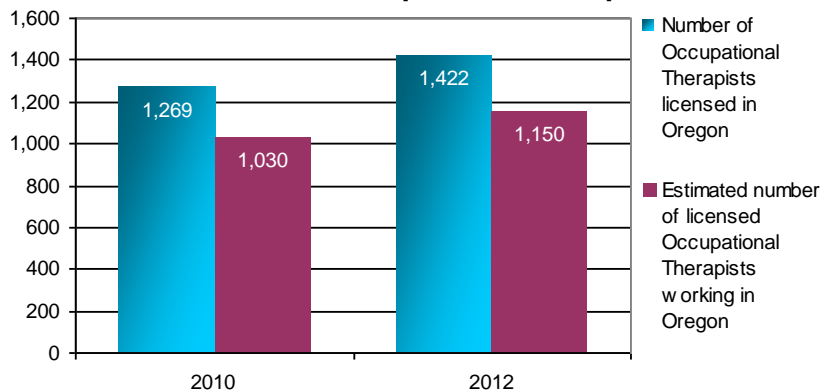
Multnomah County has the largest number of OTs (27%), followed by Washington County (15%) and Clackamas County (9%).

Geriatrics was the most frequently reported practice specialty (512), followed by physical rehabilitation (429).

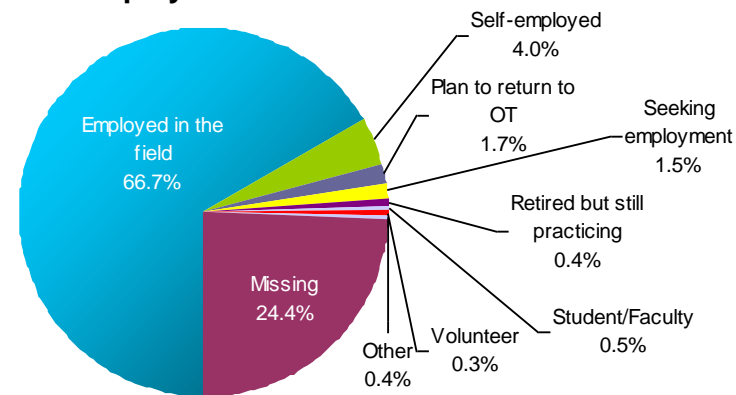
The percentage of OTs 55 years of age and older decreased from 28% in 2010 to 26.7% in 2012.

Among OTs, Spanish was the most frequently reported language spoken (7%) in addition to English. In 2010, 3.4% of Oregon's OTs reported speaking Spanish in addition to English.

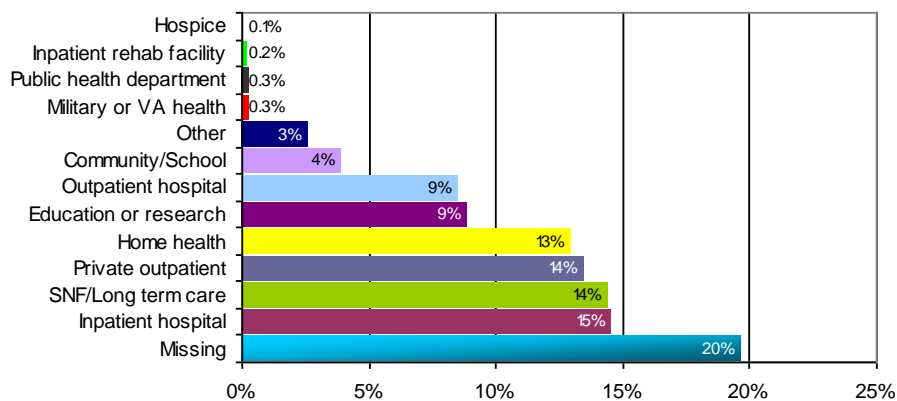
### Number of Occupational Therapists



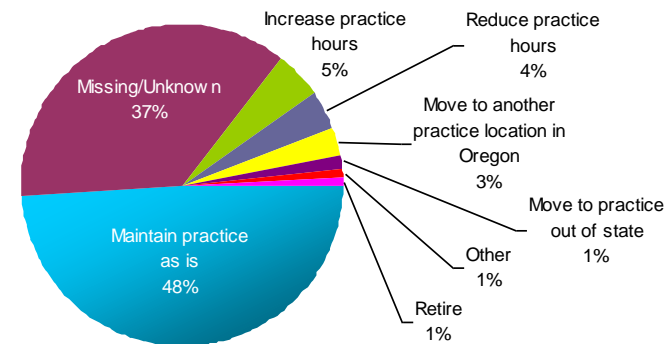
### Employment Status



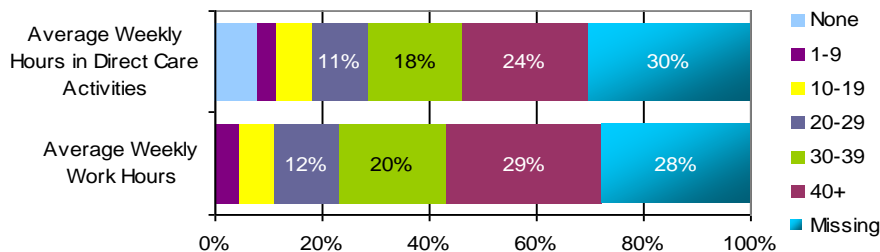
### Work Setting



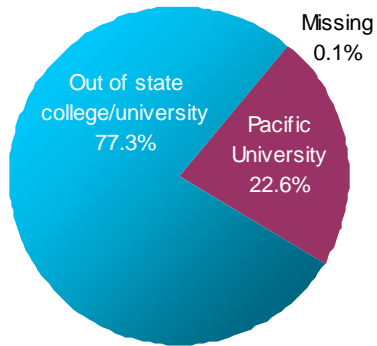
### Future Practice Plans in the Next Two Years



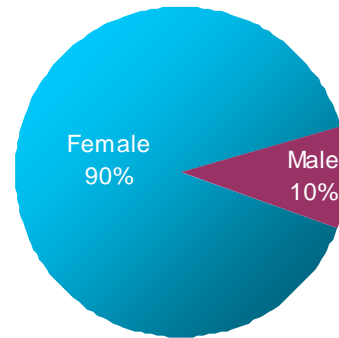
### Average Weekly Work Hours Compared to Average Weekly Hours in Direct Patient Care Activities



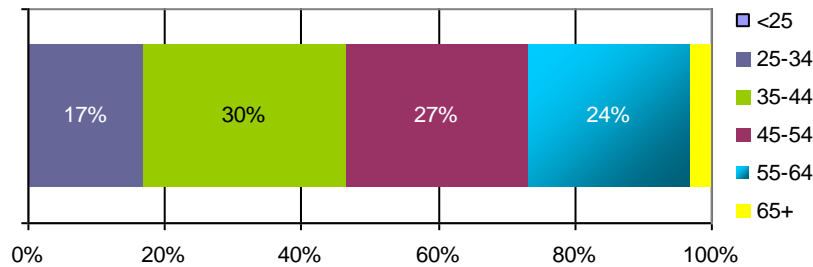
### OT School Location



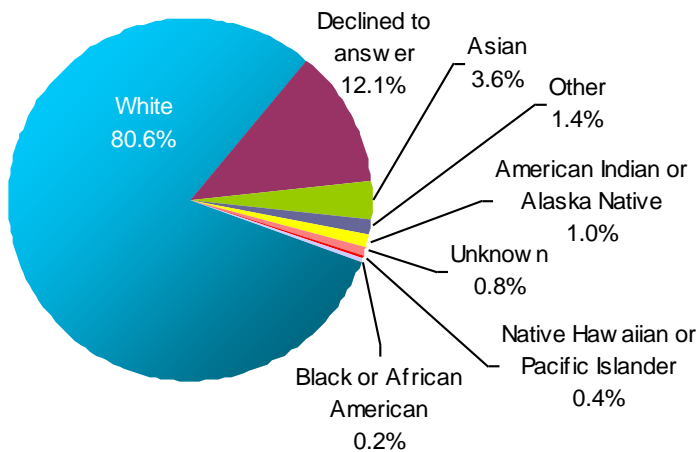

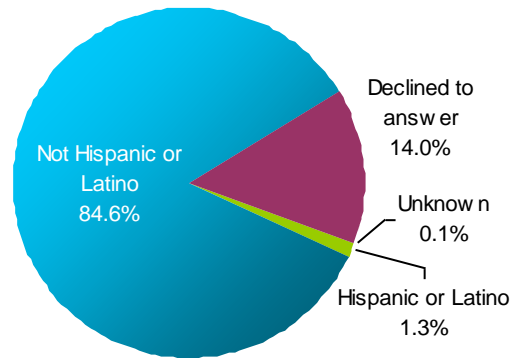
