

Evidence Based Practice Web Cites

There is a wealth of Evidence Based Practice information available on the internet. Some tips for using them to have useful references:

- **Prepare a summary form to keep information available so you can find and use it, or it becomes too easy to lose track of where you found various materials**
- **Categorize your resources by type**
- **Explore sites listed below. Use Google**

Remember to search for “best evidence” and print abstracts of highest quality studies. Explore online resources, check at local college and public libraries. Check internet tutorials on how to evaluate the evidence. Summarize the study with your comments and keep track of your information.
