FINAL MINUTES

Dr. DeBess took roll and convened Executive Session at 8:30 a.m. for attorney advice and case review. The following old cases were reviewed: 19-0022B; 19-0035; 19-0059; 20-0021.

The following new cases were reviewed: 19-0047; 19-0049; 19-0051A&B; 19-0053; 19-0055; 19-0056; 19-0057; 19-0058; 20-0002; 20-0003; 20-0004; 20-0007; 20-0009.

Dr. DeBess convened Public Session and welcomed guests Cristina Keef, executive director of PVMA, and Glenn Kolb, executive director of OVMA.

Ms. Yates moved, Dr. Wilson seconded and the Board unanimously approved the agenda and minutes of the May meeting.

Dr. Lamb moved, Ms. Yates seconded and the Board unanimously approved issuance since May of 121 veterinary licenses, 72 intern licenses; 57 CVT licenses; 8 CET licenses and 78 facility licenses.

Dr. Wilson moved, Ms. Pate seconded and the Board voted unanimously to issue a temporary rule requiring compliance with Governor's executive orders.

Mr. Kolb requested that the Board consider delaying implementation of OAR 875-015-0040 and asking whether parasite control prescription drugs need to be secured in locked storage. The Board noted that this is a question for the Oregon Board of Pharmacy.

Dr. Wilson moved, Ms. Pate seconded, and the Board voted unanimously to retain Dr. Emilio DeBess as chair for an additional year.

Complaint Resolution:

19-0022A—Dr. Wilson moved, Dr. Davis seconded and the Board voted by majority to withdraw its notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction. Dr. Hamilton opposed the motion.

19-0035—Dr. Davis moved, Ms. Yates seconded and the Board voted unanimously to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction/stipulated agreement for violation of the Veterinary Practice Act, require Continuing Education in veterinary dentistry, and impose a \$250 civil penalty.

19-0059—Dr. Wilson moved, Ms. Pate seconded and the Board voted unanimously to withdraw its notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction for violation of the Veterinary Practice Act.

19-0047—Ms. Pate moved, CVT Mair-Williamson seconded and the Board voted unanimously not to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction in this case.

19-0049—Dr. Wilson moved, Dr. Lamb seconded and the Board voted unanimously not to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction in this case.

19-0051A & B—Dr. Wilson moved, Dr. Davis seconded and the Board voted unanimously not to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction in this case.

19-0053—Dr. Wilson moved, Ms. Yates seconded and the Board voted unanimously not to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction in this case.

19-0055—Dr. Davis moved, CVT Mair-Williamson seconded and the Board voted unanimously not to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction in this case.

19-0056—Ms. Yates moved, CVT Mair-Williamson seconded and the Board voted unanimously not to issue a notice of intent to propose a disciplinary sanction in this case.
