Community Navigator

The Quarantine Fund provides temporary financial assistance to Oregon agricultural workers who are 18 years or older, recovering from COVID-19, seeking healthcare regardless of immigration status, and practicing quarantine and isolation. Navigators can help find out if you quality for immediate assistance, and answer questions to help you find a place to stay.
