Applications Received:

- 1. 224-9902-22741 Acquisition and Ecological Use of Wood River Valley 1864 Priority Water Right. The applicant, California Waterfowl Association, proposes to complete an instream lease that will improve streamflow in Crooked Creek, the Wood River, Agency Lake, Upper Klamath Lake, the Klamath River, and Lower Klamath Lake. The improved streamflow will benefit habitat for native fish and wildlife and water quality. The project is located northwest of Chiloguin, in Klamath County.
- 2. 224-9903-22749 South Fork Little Butte Creek Water Acquisition. The applicant, The Freshwater Trust, proposes to complete irrigation water efficiency and management upgrades and leave the conserved water instream to benefit native fish. The project is located in Jackson County, east of Medford, on South Fork Little Butte Creek—a tributary of the Rogue River.
