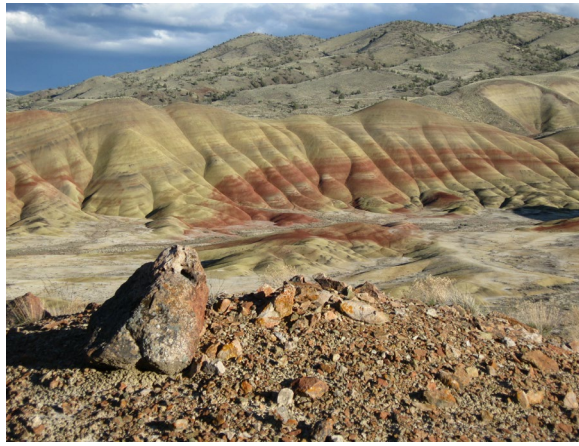

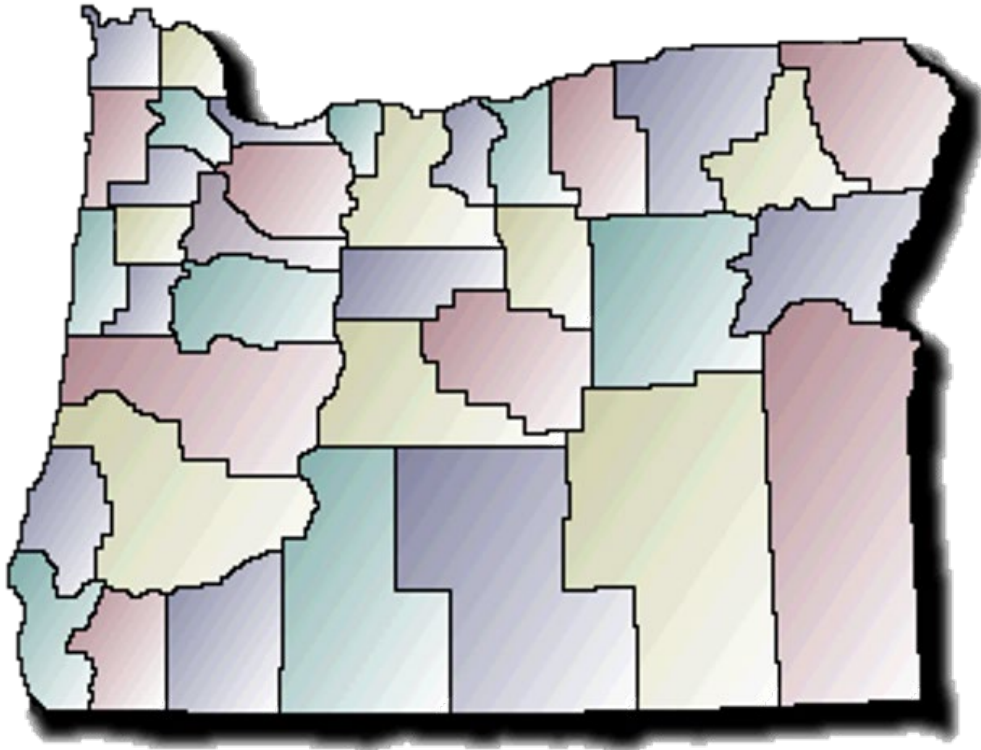


Oregon's Land Use Planning Program

- Uniquely established within a state-level framework of 19 goals
- Community vision in local “comprehensive plans”
- Local governments implement the program
- State technical assistance and grant funding

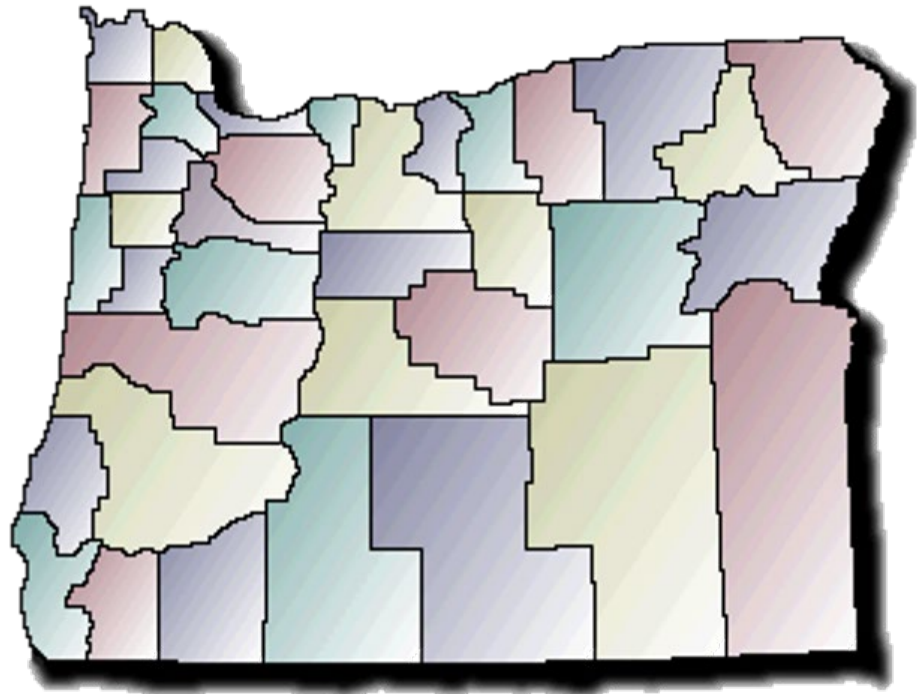


Why Oregon is a National Model for Planning, Conservation, and Development

- Inventory-based
- City and county comprehensive plans
- Conservation of natural and working lands
- City urban growth boundaries, directing development into town, where infrastructure and services are available

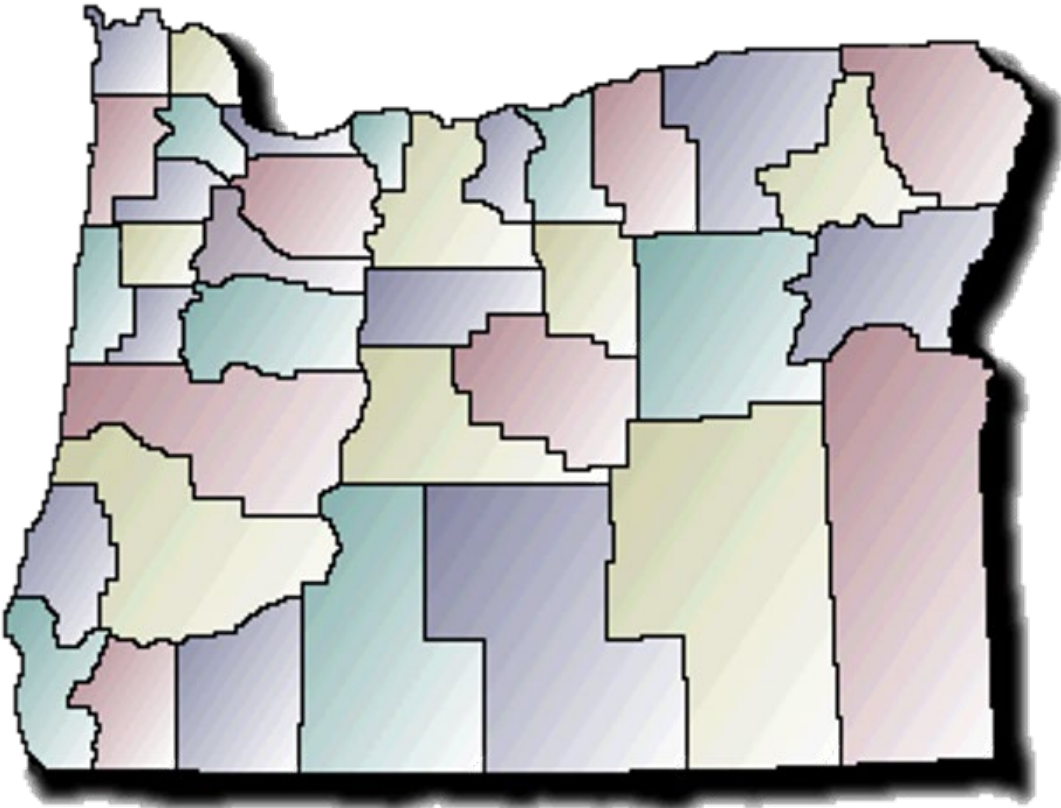
Program Modernization
