

House Bill 3343 (2023)



Why is Rulemaking Needed?

Implement HB 3343 (2023)

Modifies qualifications for water well constructor's license.

Provides that the Department can determine which types of wells require evidence of welding proficiency in order to issue a drillers license.

ORS 537.747(3)(e)

Provides evidence that the person has completed an arc welding training course from a community college, received a professional welding certification, passed a welding proficiency test or otherwise completed professional welding training, if the evidence is required under rules adopted by the Water Resources Commission that are based on the type of well for which the water well constructor is qualified.

Purpose of Rulemaking

The Department is using its discretion to remove the welding proficiency requirement for monitoring well license applicants.

Water Supply Well Constructor Licensing

 690-205-0020 Water Supply Well Constructor's License, Experience Requirements, Trainee Card and Temporary Authorization

Summary

 Update to remove welding proficiency waiver for water supply well constructor license applicants that currently hold a monitoring well constructors license.

Statutory Authority (Oregon Revised Statutes, ORS)

- Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.747: Water well constructor's license; rules; fees
- ORS 537.505-537.795: Appropriation of Water Generally (Groundwater)

Monitoring Well Constructor Licensing

 690-240-0065 Monitoring Well Constructor License, Experience Requirements, Trainee Card and Temporary Authorization

Summary

 Remove requirement to provide evidence of welding proficiency to obtain a monitoring well constructors license.

Statutory Authority

- Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.747: Water well constructor's license; rules; fees
- ORS 537.505-537.795: Appropriation of Water Generally (Groundwater)
