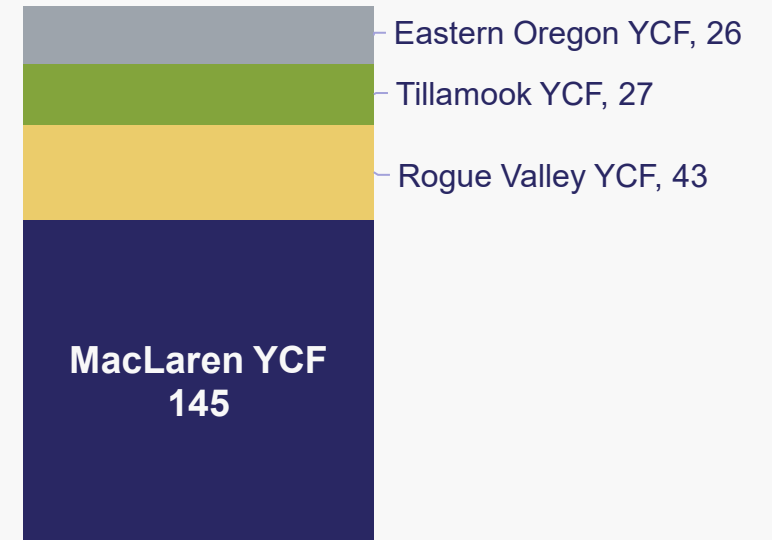
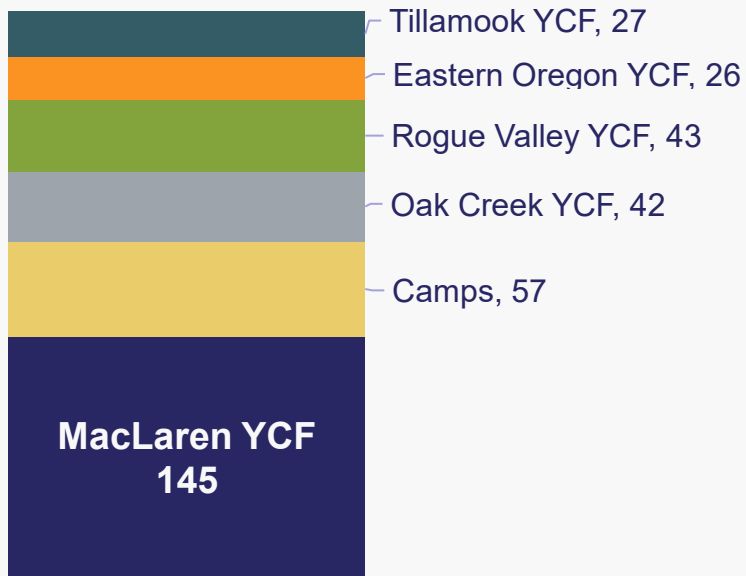
Term	Definition
Youth Incident Report (YIR)	Formal documentation of behavioral problems, injuries, and/or illnesses. Documentation includes date/time, location, youth involved, staff involved, and any behavior problems, restraints, or resolutions associated with the event.
Violent Behaviors	Youth behaviors logged in YIRs that (a) have a problem type of <i>Assault</i> or (b) have a problem type of <i>Peer Fight</i> that also required <i>Physical Intervention</i> and/or <i>Isolation</i>
Assaults on Workers	Count of YIRs where one or more staff members were listed as the victim of an <i>Assault</i> problem type.
Youth Injuries	Count of unique youth injuries logged in YIRs.
Staff Injuries	Count of unique staff injuries logged in YIRs. Staff workplace injuries that are not associated with a YIR are not counted.
Isolation	A crisis intervention where a youth is temporarily placed alone in a room with a locked door due to the youth’s crisis behavior.
Positive Youth Engagement (PYE)	PYE includes all activities for which attendance hours are tracked in JJIS (Education, Vocation, Work Experience, Treatment, Large Muscle Activity, OIIR Activities, and Other Enrichment Activities). OIIR = Office of Inclusion and Intercultural Relations
Average PYE Hours	Total number of attendance hours divided by the facility population
Safe Community Skills Group	Core treatment group designed to strengthen prosocial skills such as problem solving, emotion regulation, and conflict resolution
Group Life Coordinator (GLC)	Frontline direct service staff who supervise and program youth in close-custody and make up a majority of the OYA workforce.

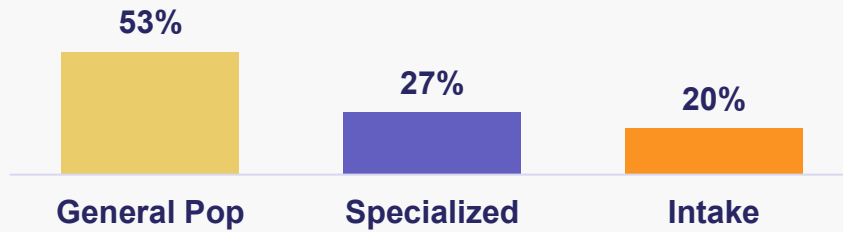

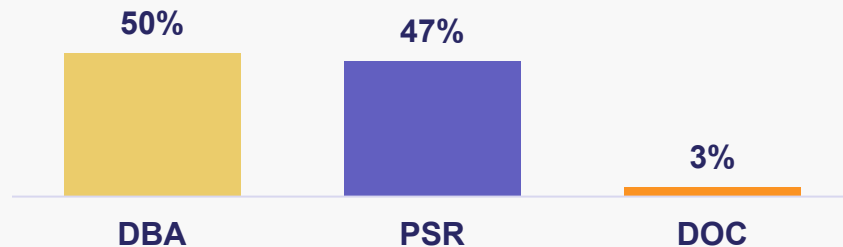

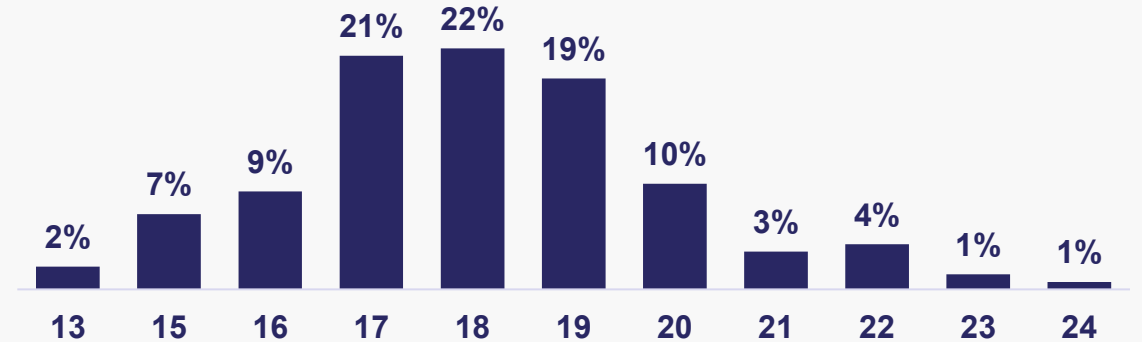

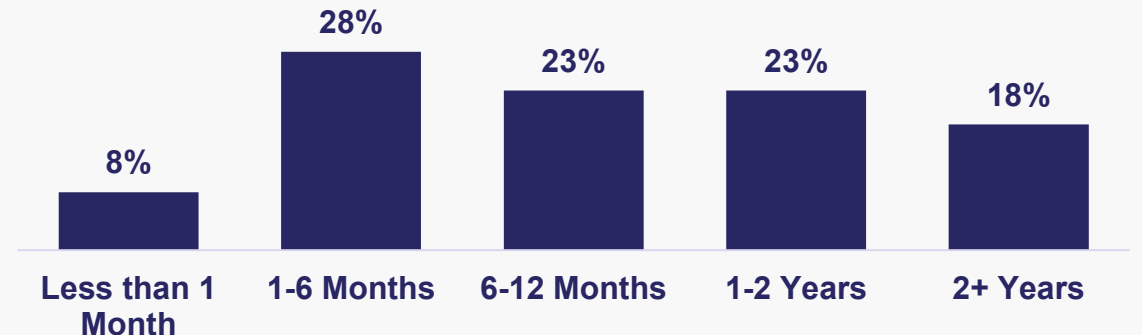

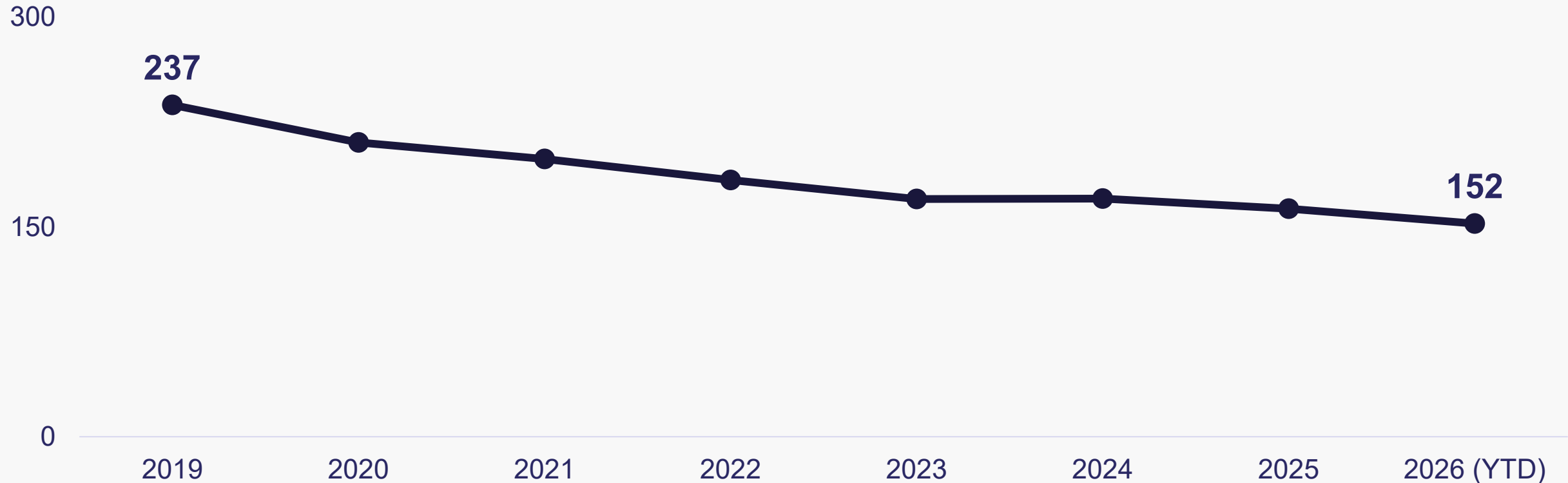

MacLaren Average Daily Population by Year

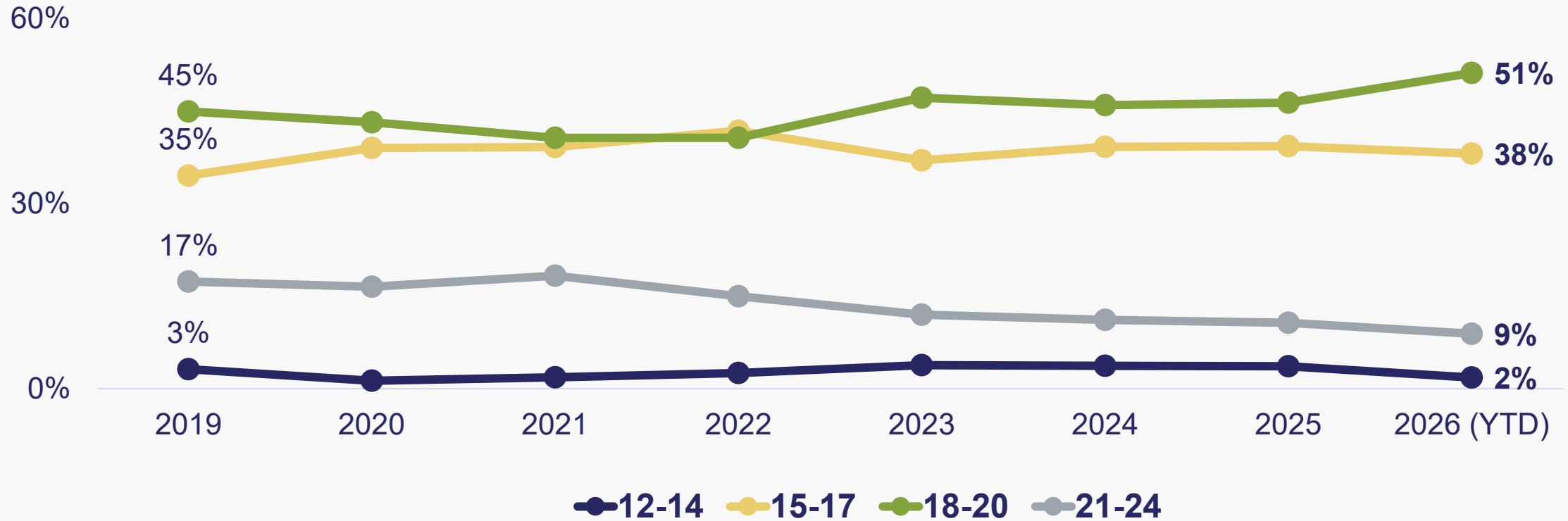




MYCF Demographics Over Time

The proportion of youth 21 and older has dropped from 17% to 9%

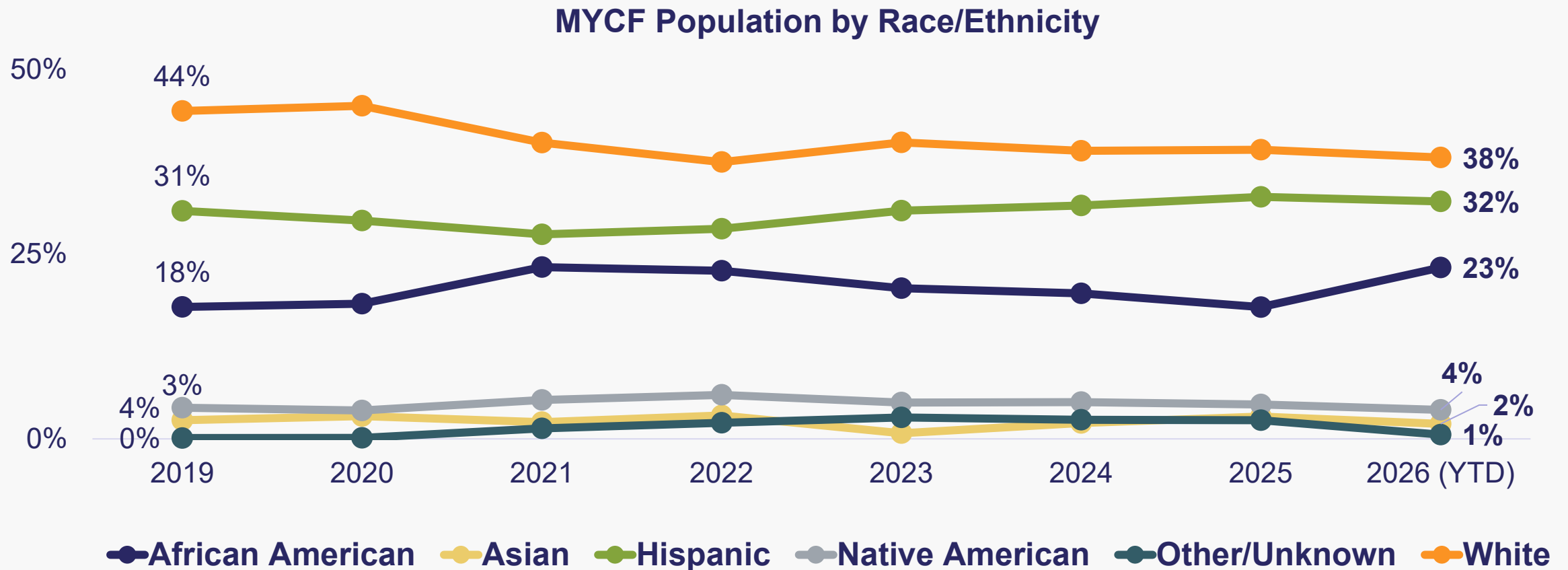
MYCF Population by Age Group

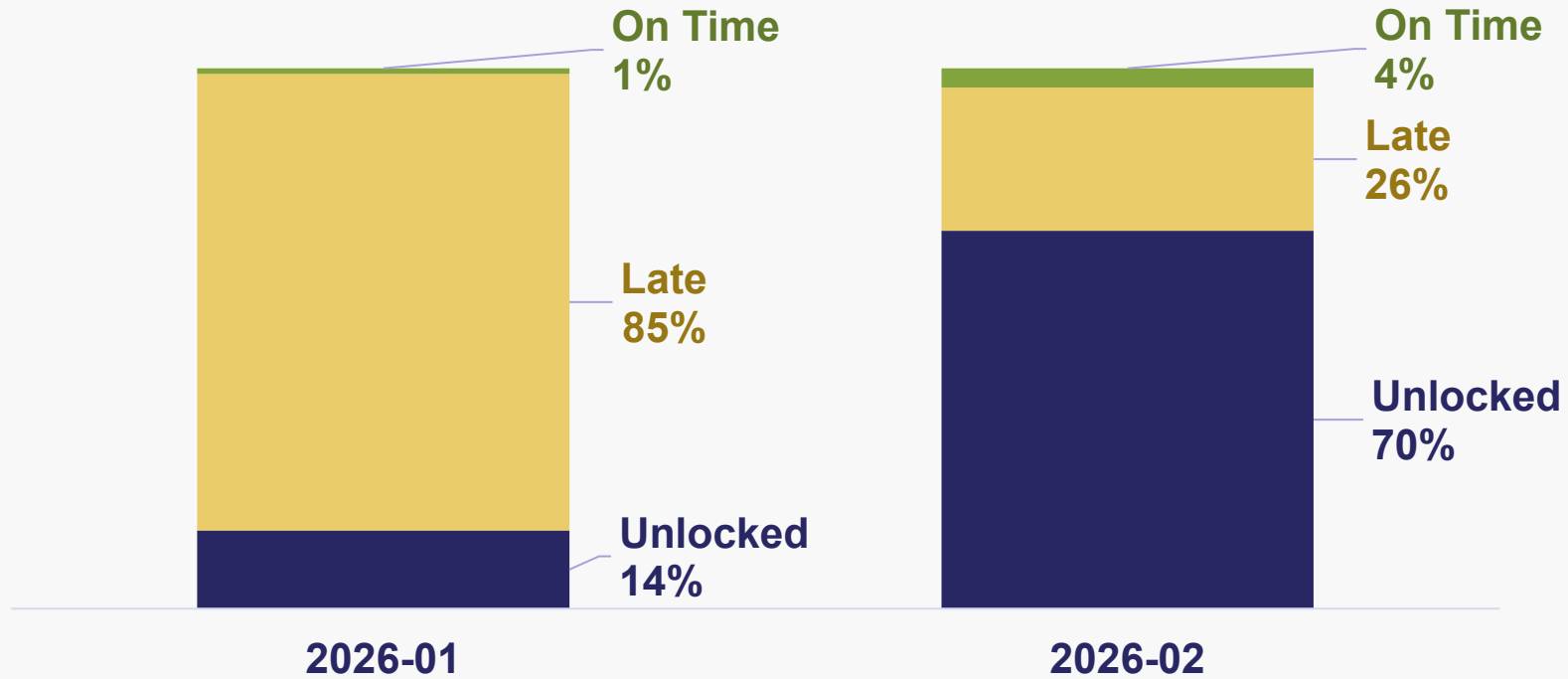

4% of last month's YIRs were locked within 72 hours

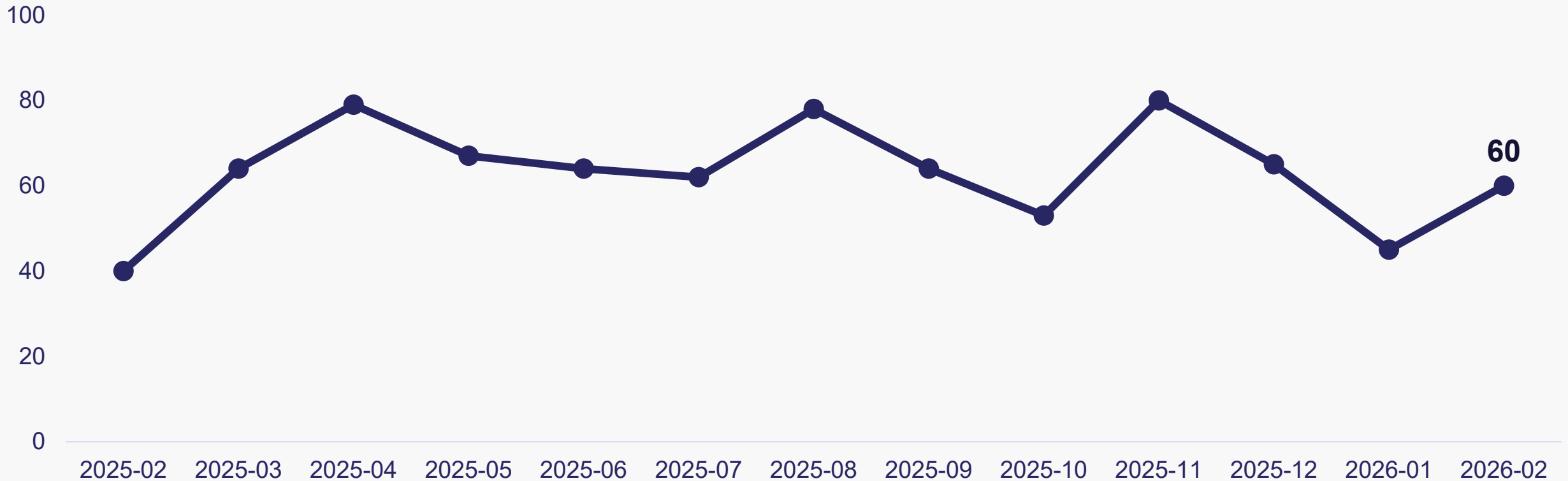
Current YIR Completion Status (as of 3/9/26)

Last month's 60 assaults/fights involved 40 distinct youth

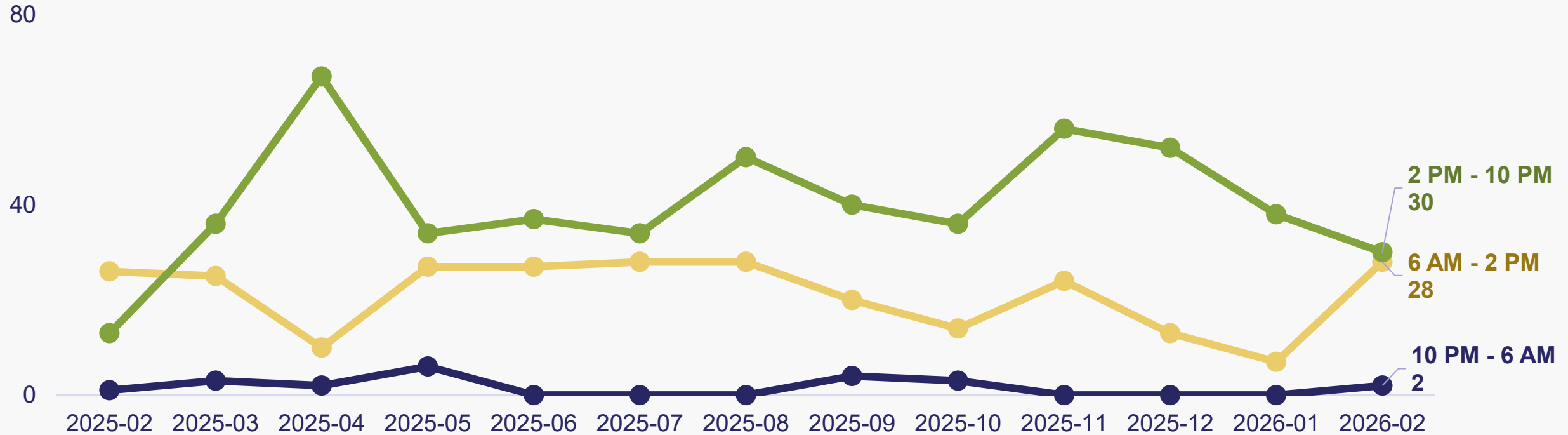
11 youth were responsible for 50% of assaults/fights





Second Shift (2PM-10PM) Assaults/Fights declined last month

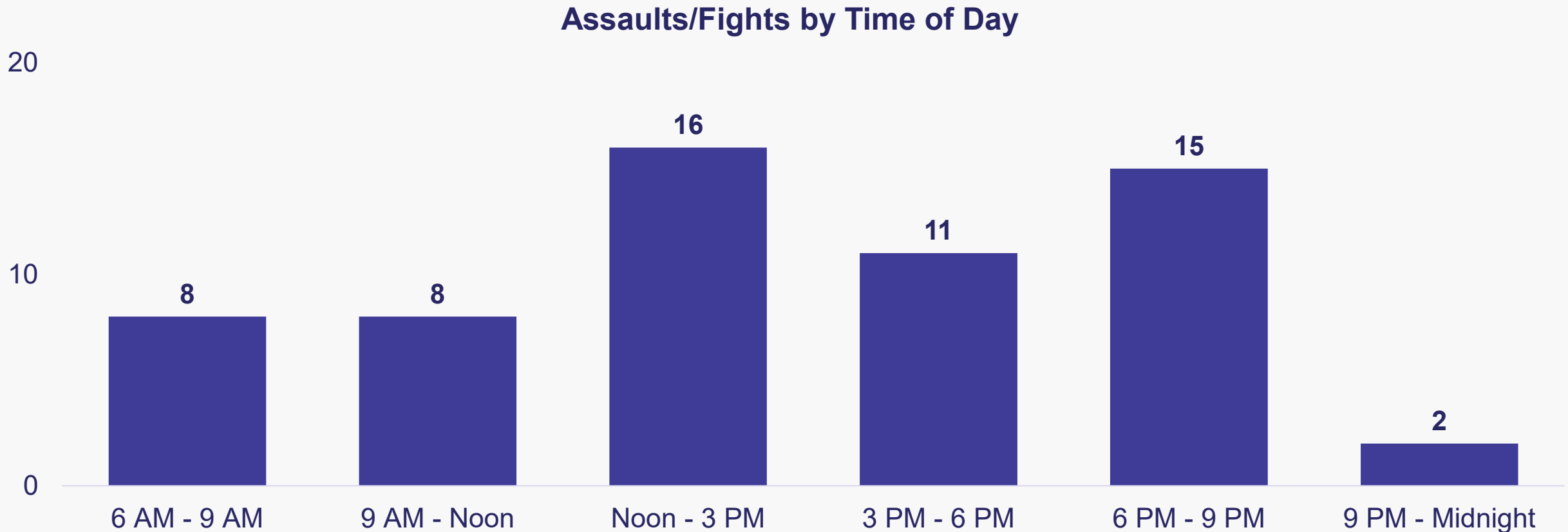
Assaults/Fights by Shift

Last month, Assaults/Fights were most common between noon and 3pm

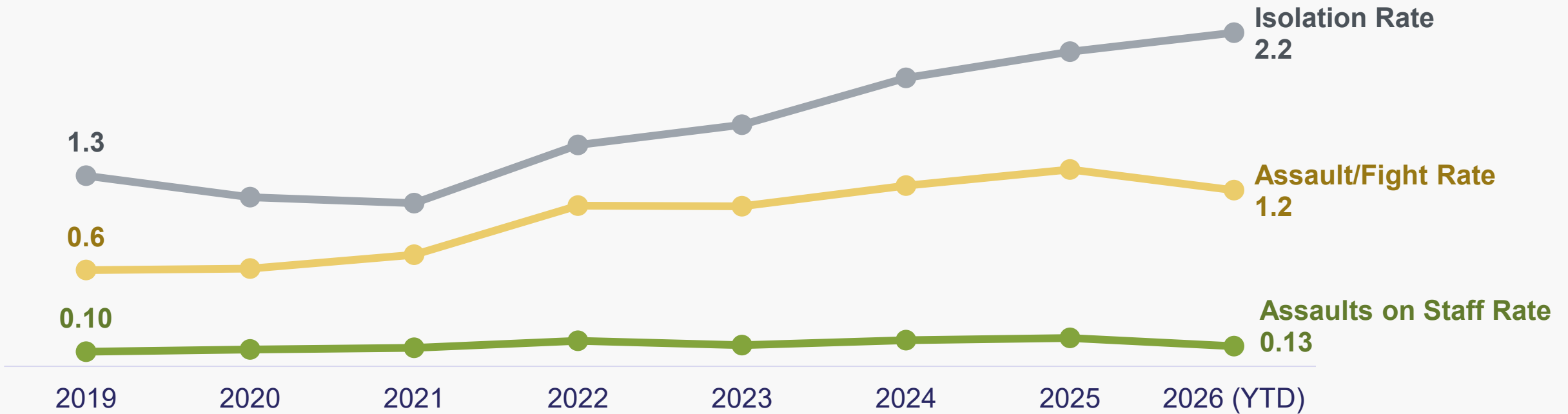




Supplemental: Violent Incidents and Isolation Over Time

Assaults/Fights and Isolation have become more frequent in recent years

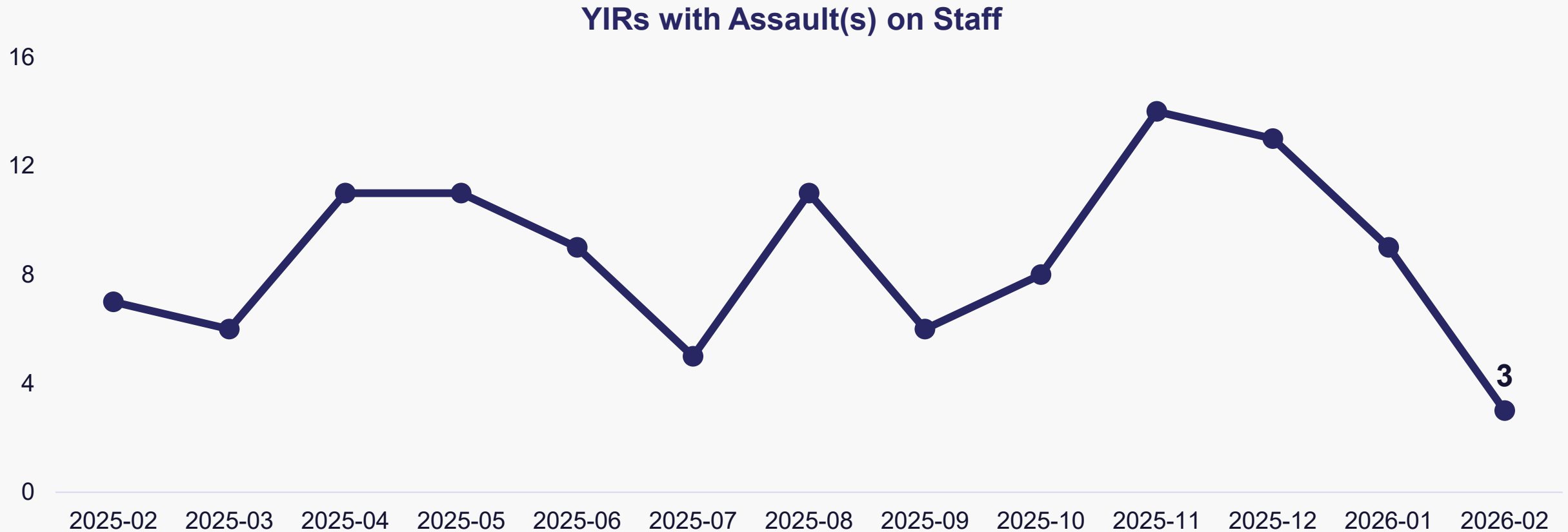
Incident and Isolation Rates by Year

Last month, 3 YIRs involved an assault on staff

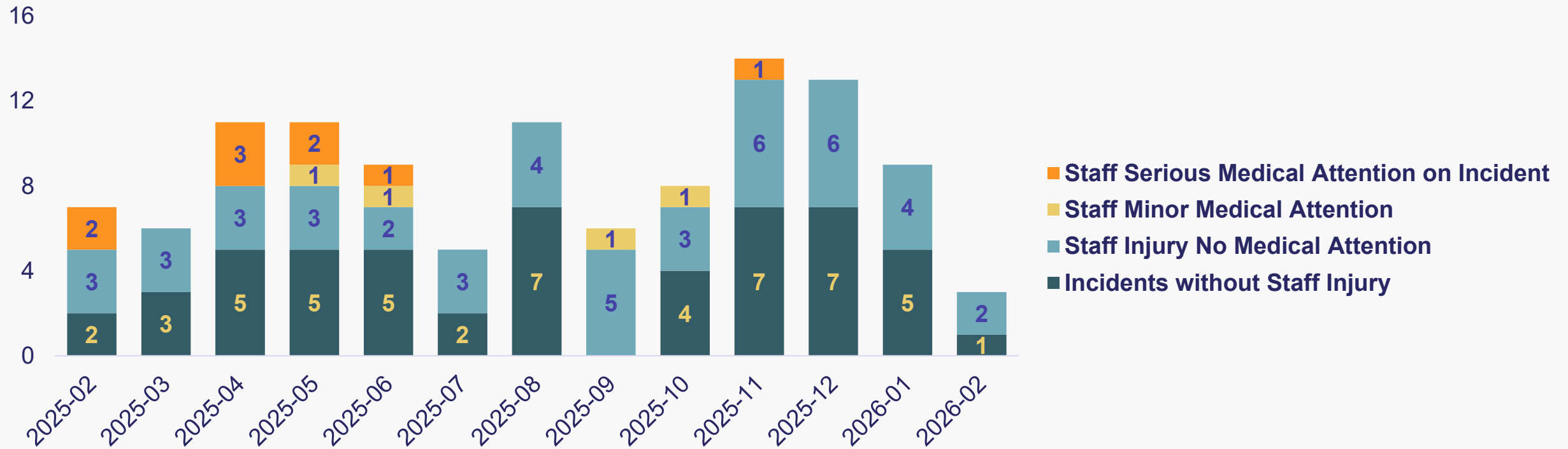

Staff Assault YIR Count

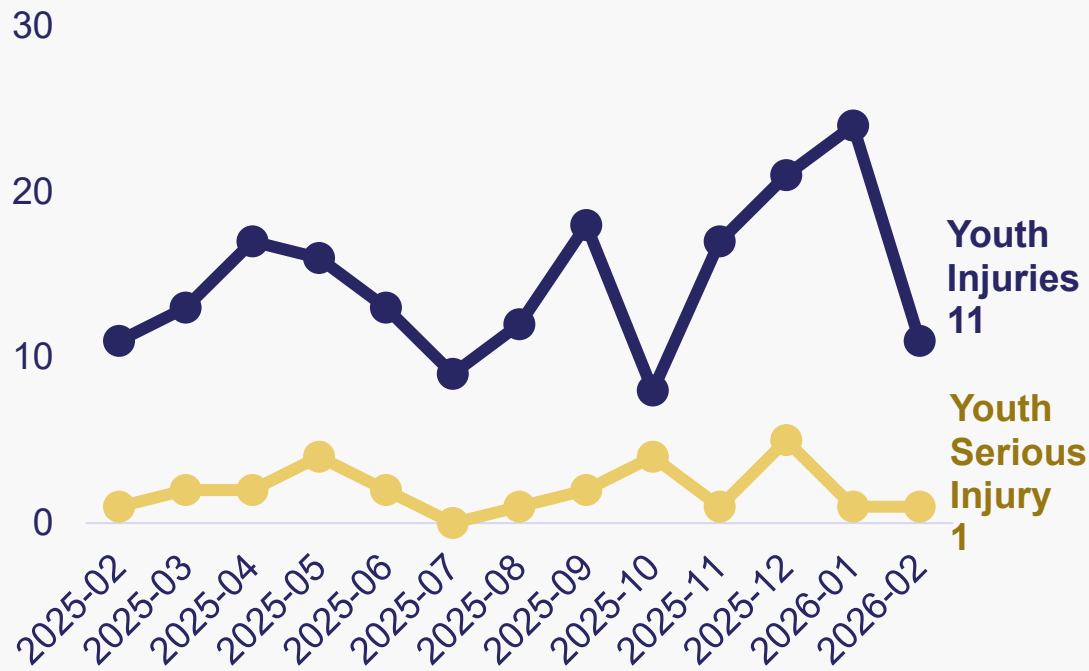




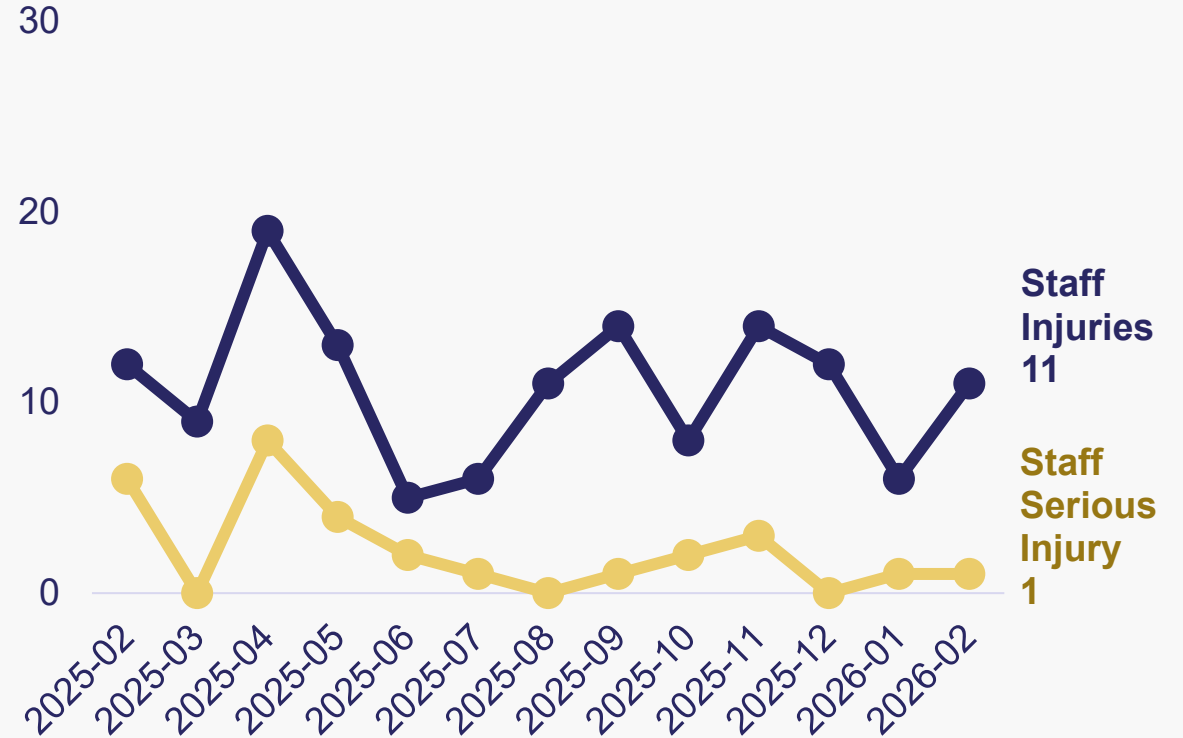

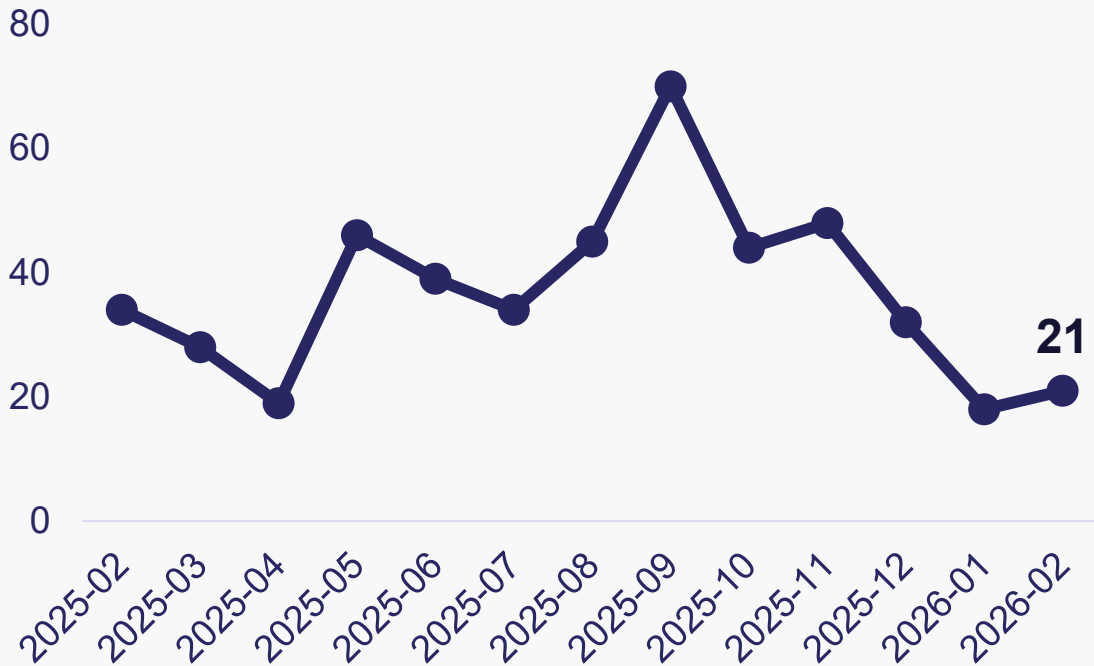




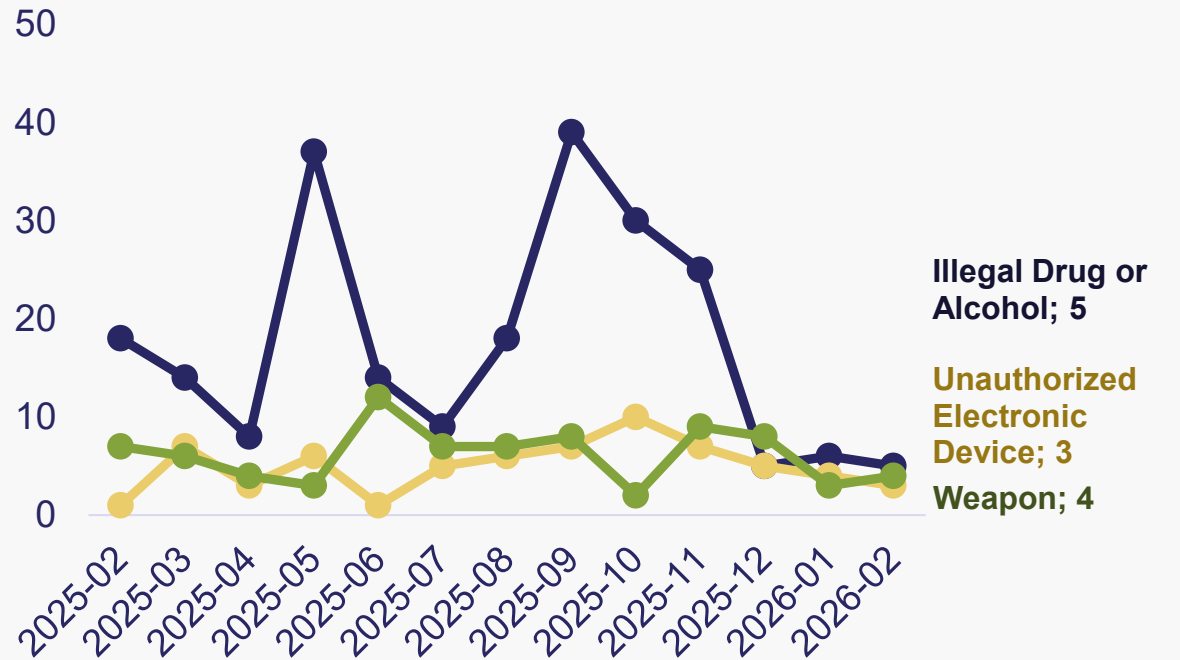
Contraband from YIRs

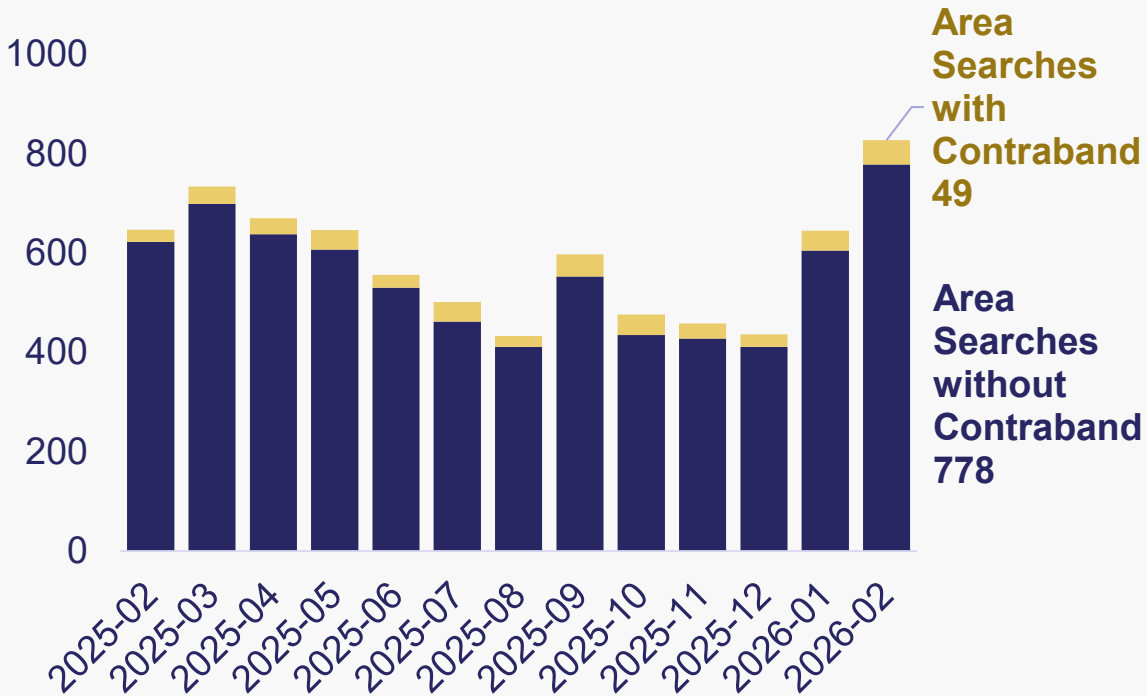




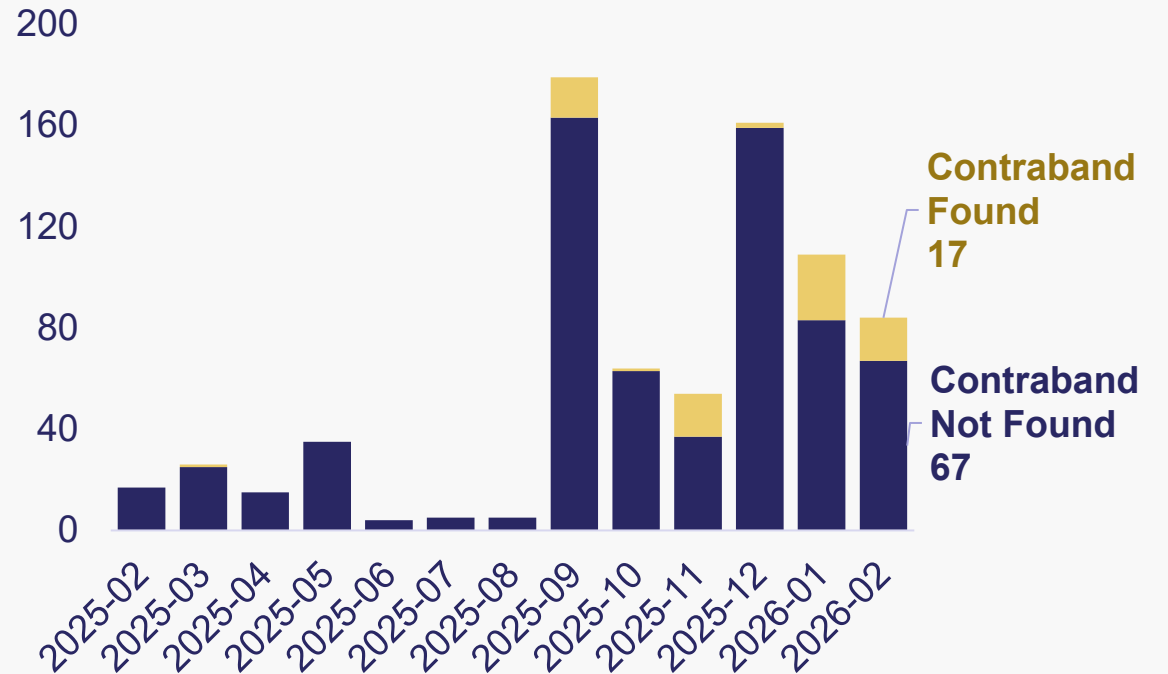
Contraband from Searches

6% of Area Searches discovered Contraband



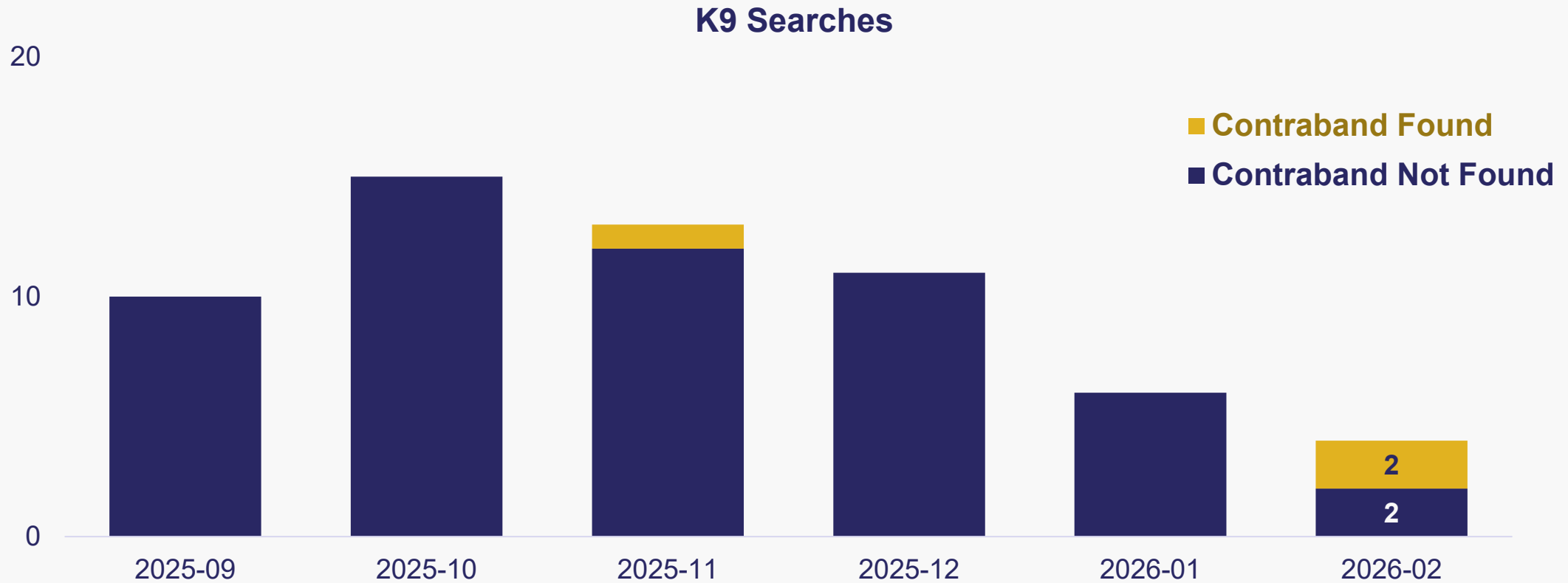

K9 Searches

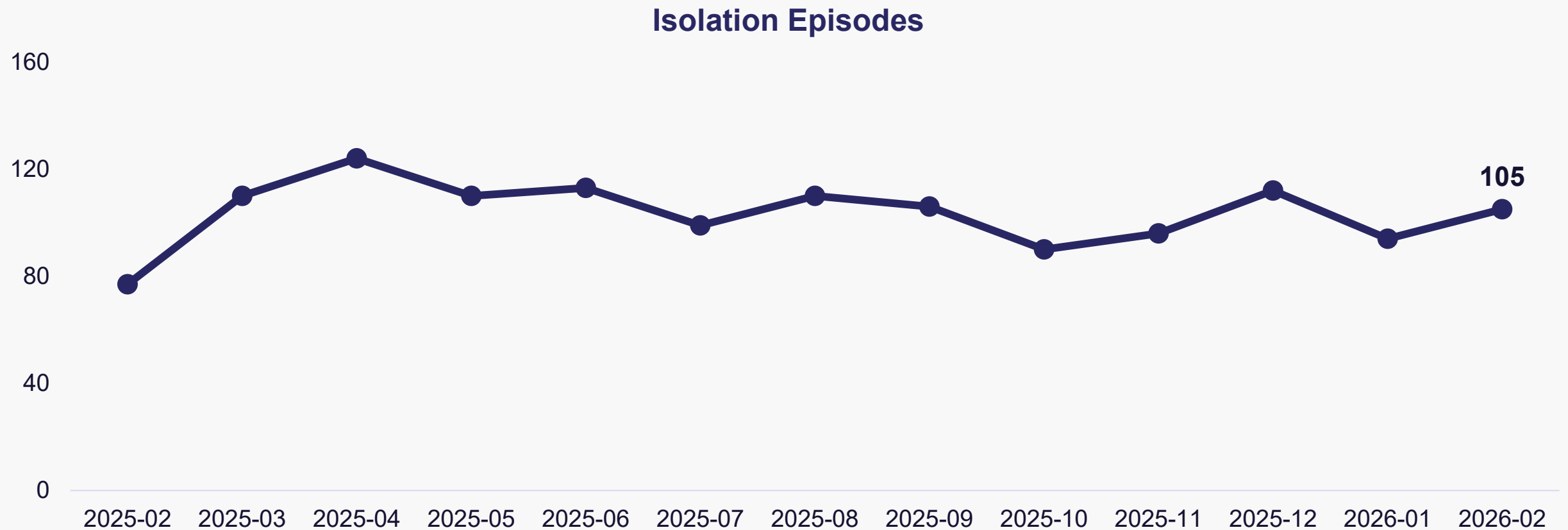

There were an average of 3.7 isolation episodes per day last month

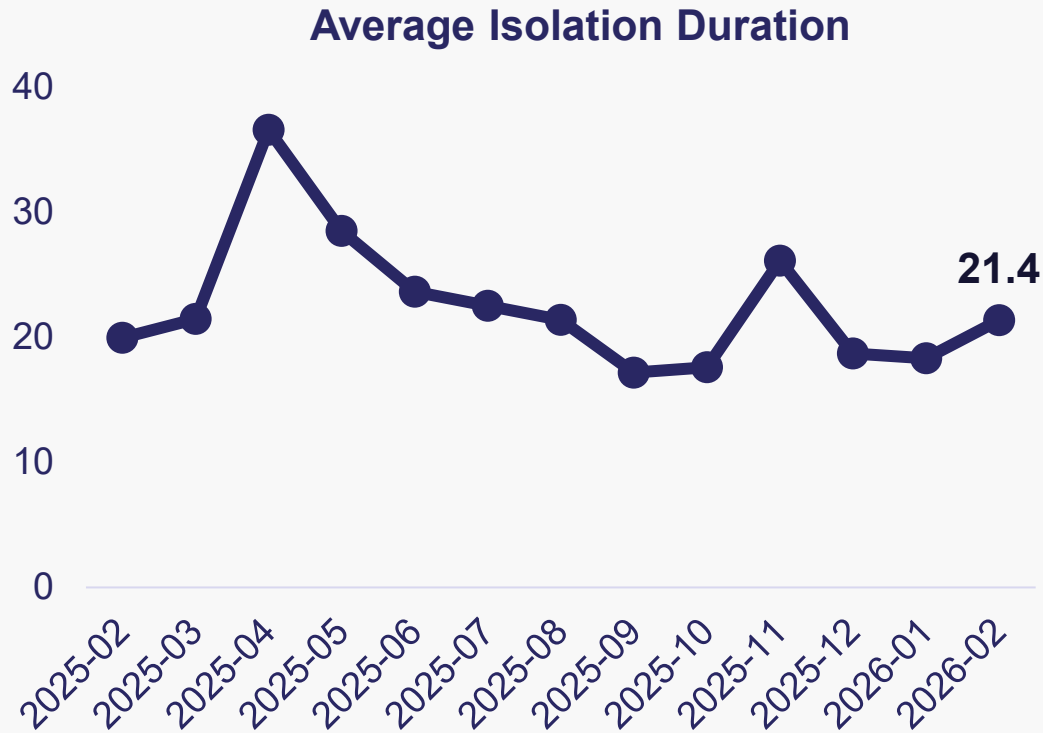




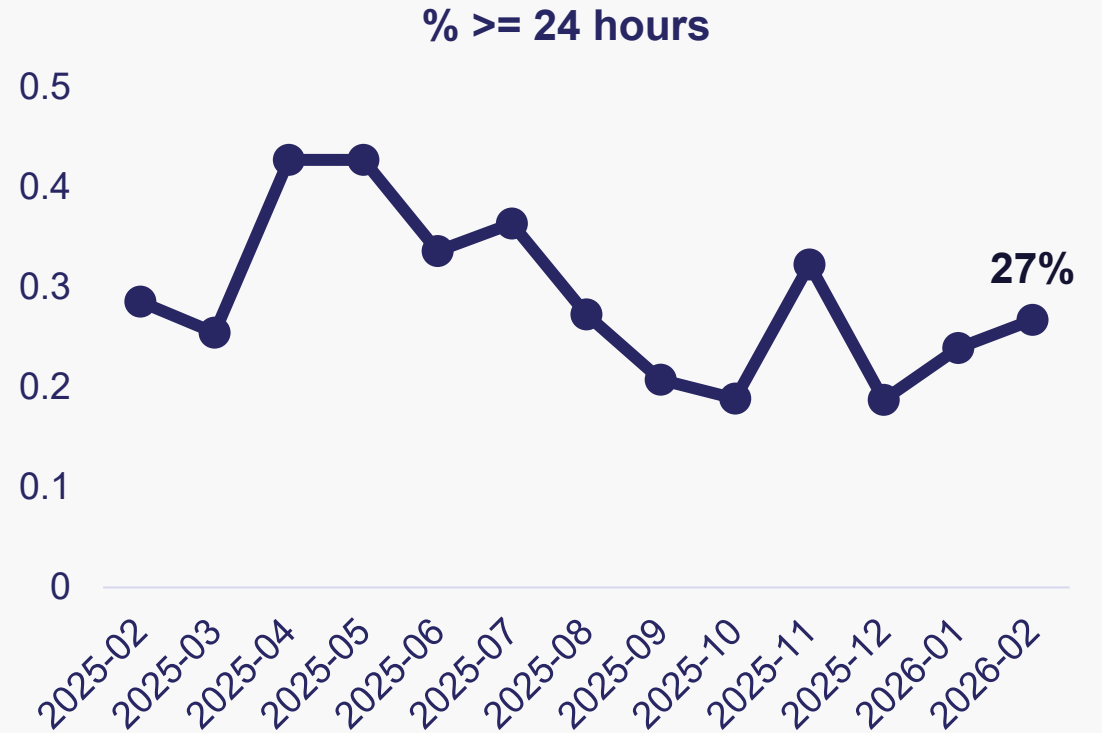
Isolation Duration

27% of Episodes Lasted 24 Hours or More



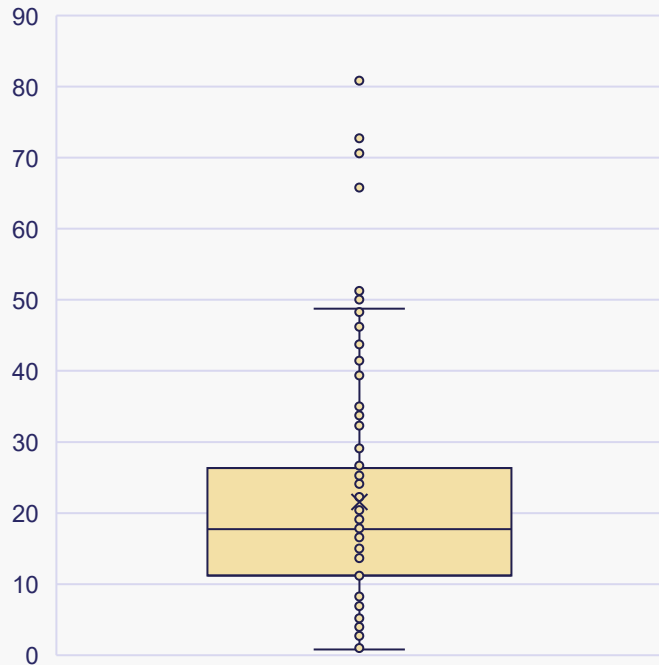


Prior Month Isolation Detail

Two youth were isolated for more than 72 hours

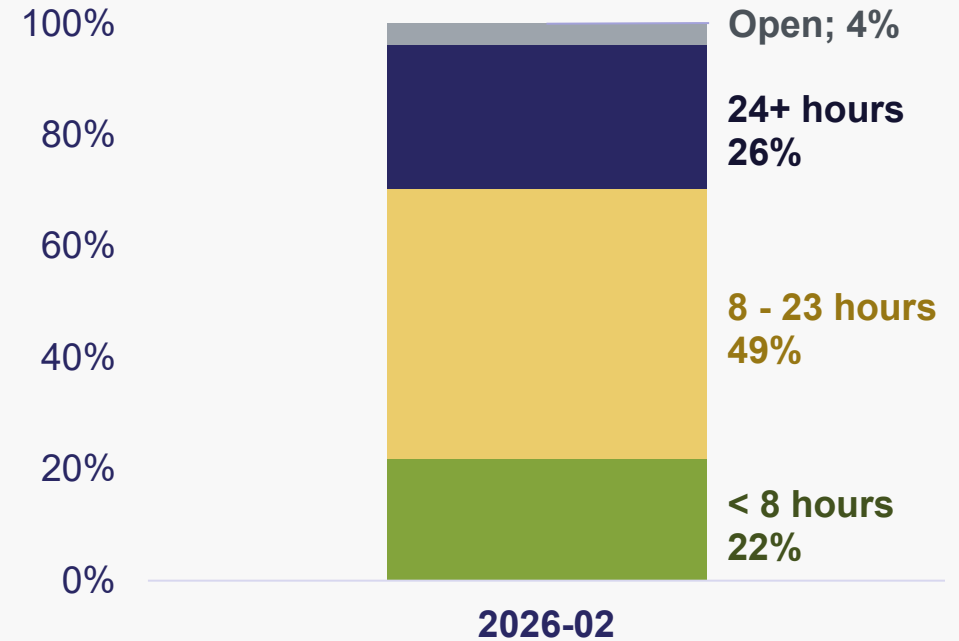

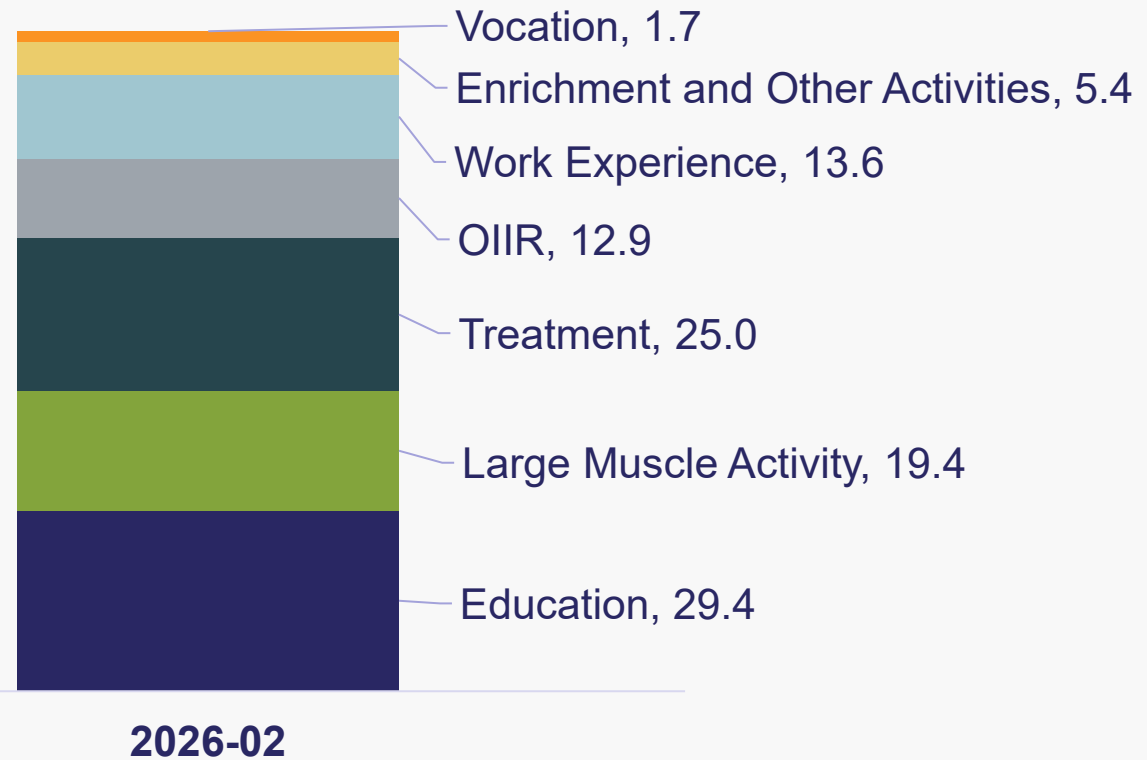

Youth at MYCF averaged 107 Hours of PYE last month

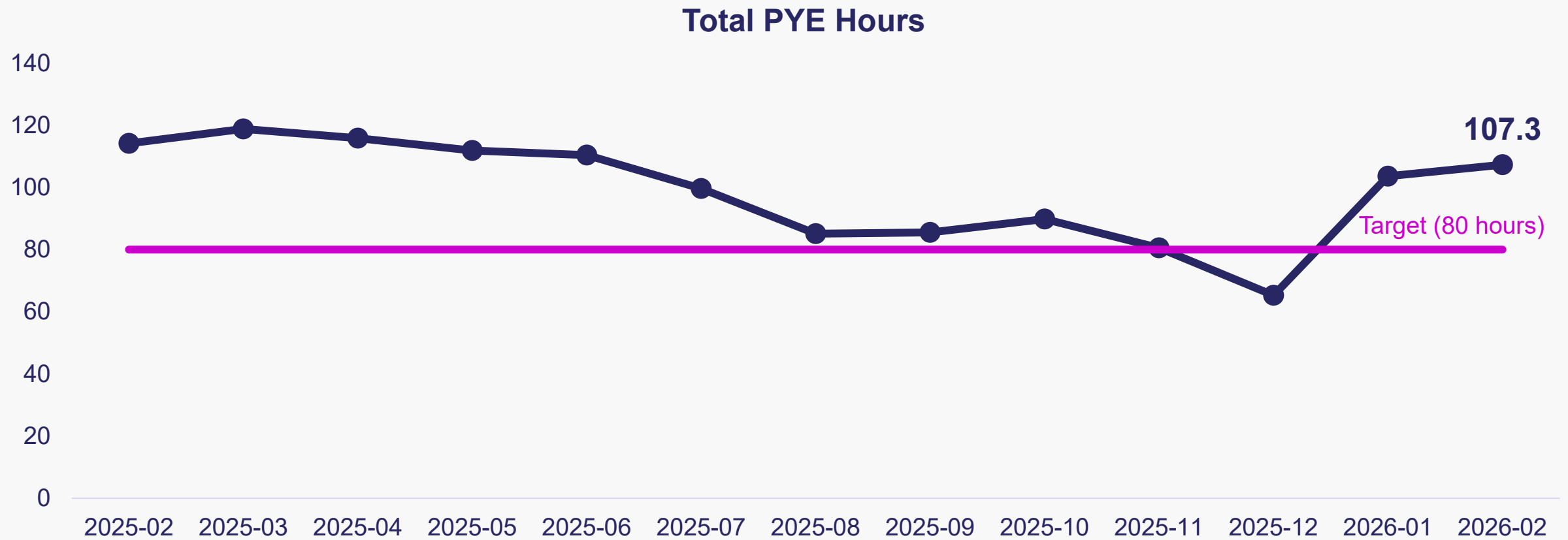

Total PYE Hours per Youth

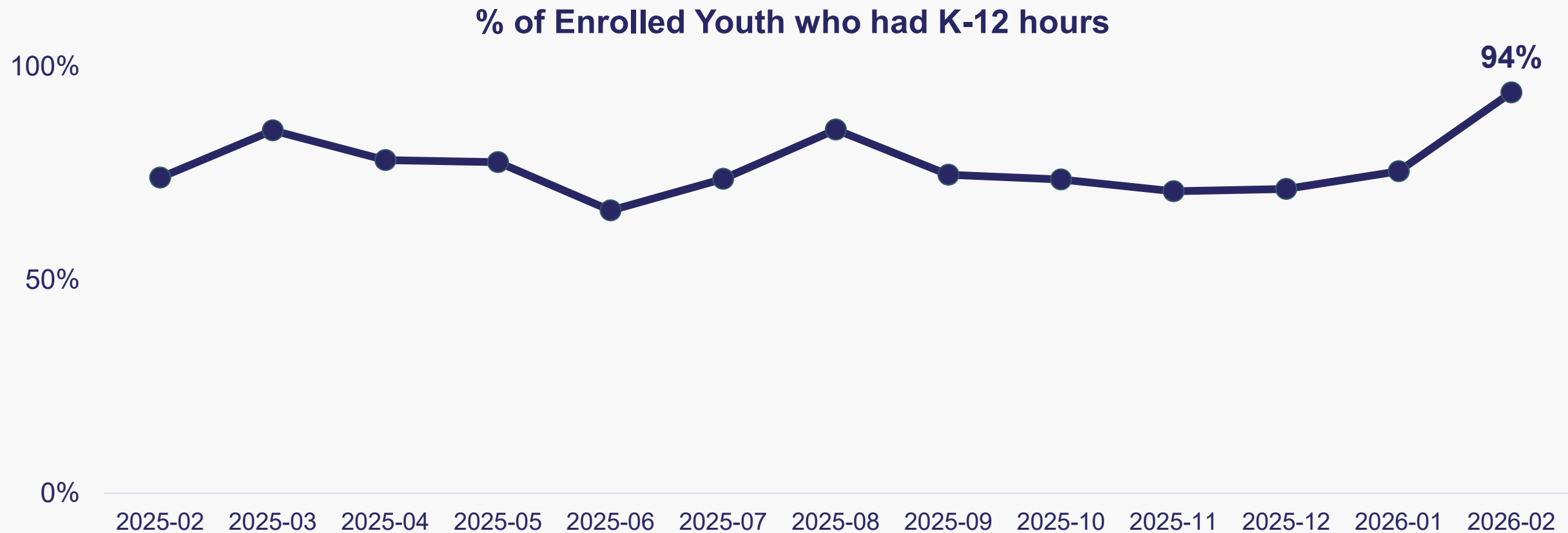
Total PYE hours increased last month





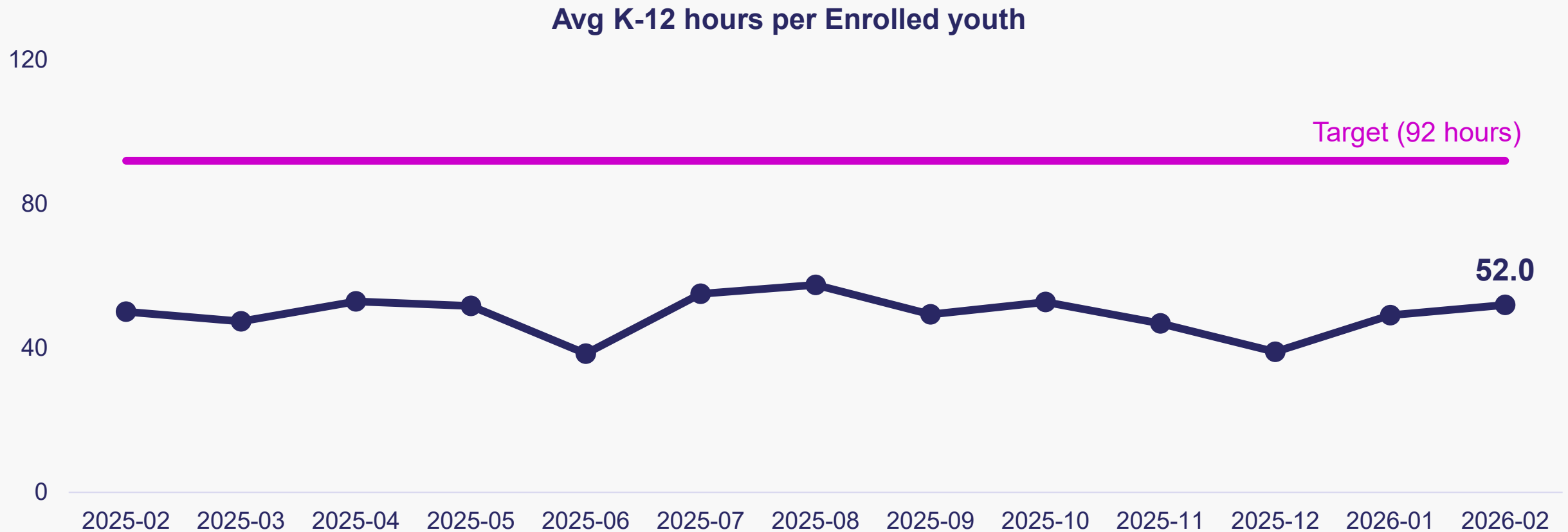
Education – K-12 Participation

94% of youth enrolled in K-12 had documented attendance hours last month





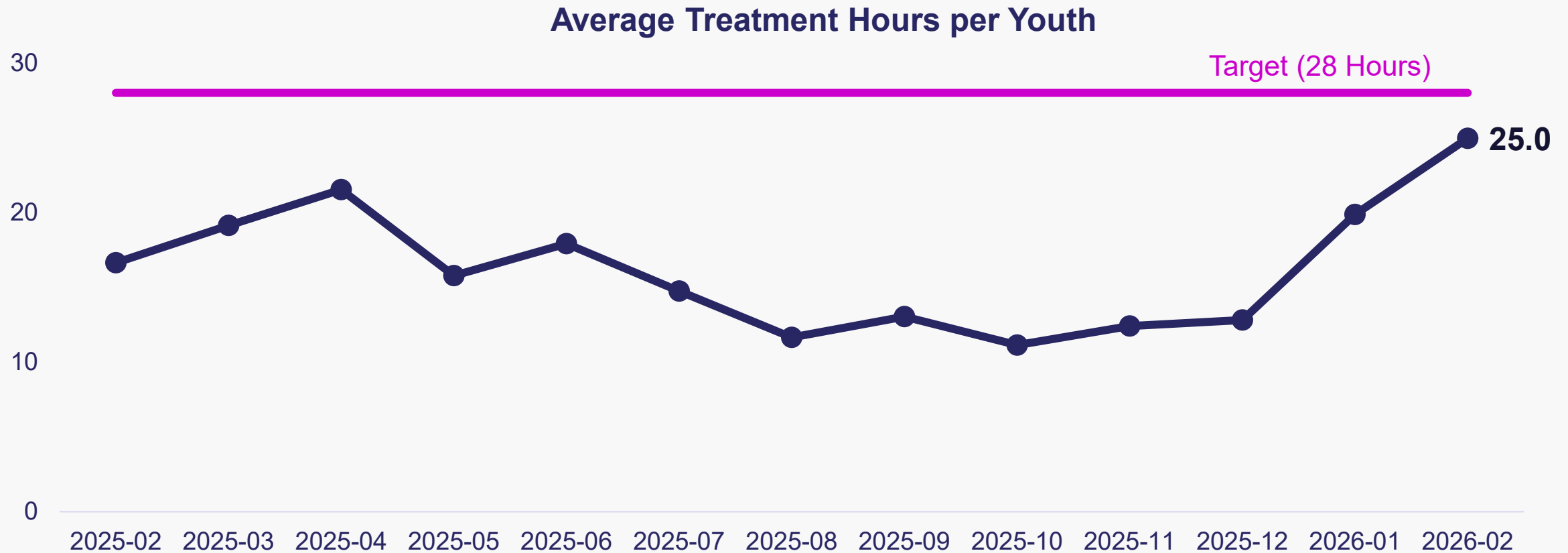
Enrolled youth averaged 52 hours of K-12 attendance last month





Treatment Hours

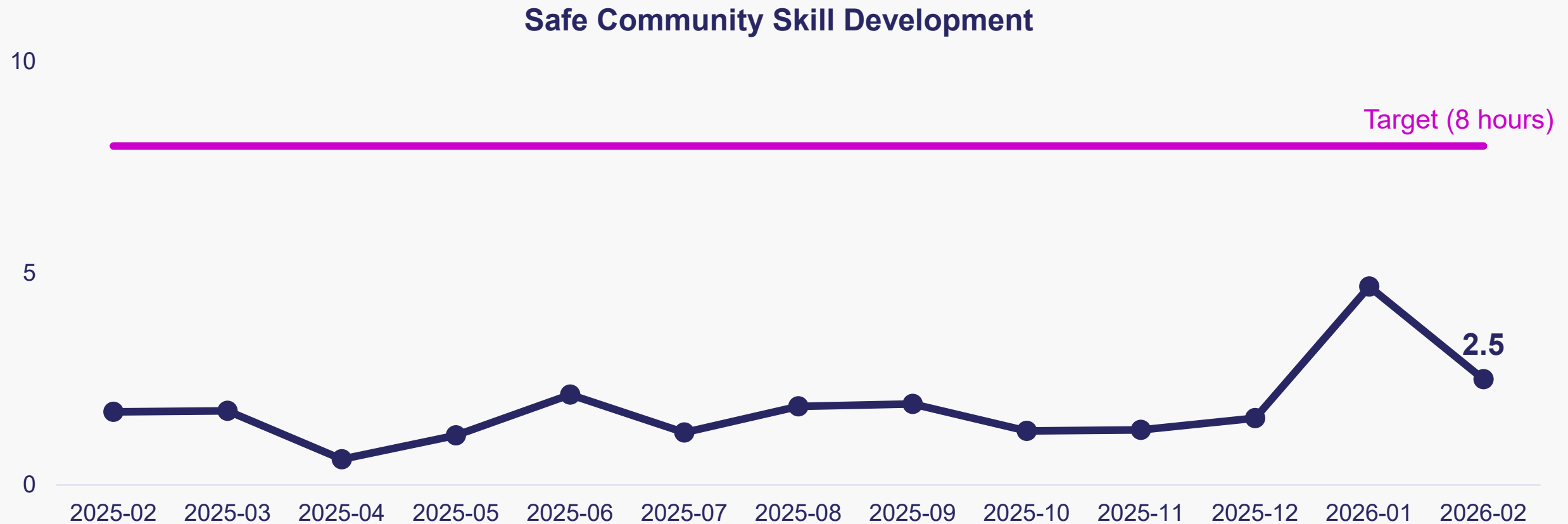
Treatment increased to 25 hours per youth last month





Safe Community Skill Development

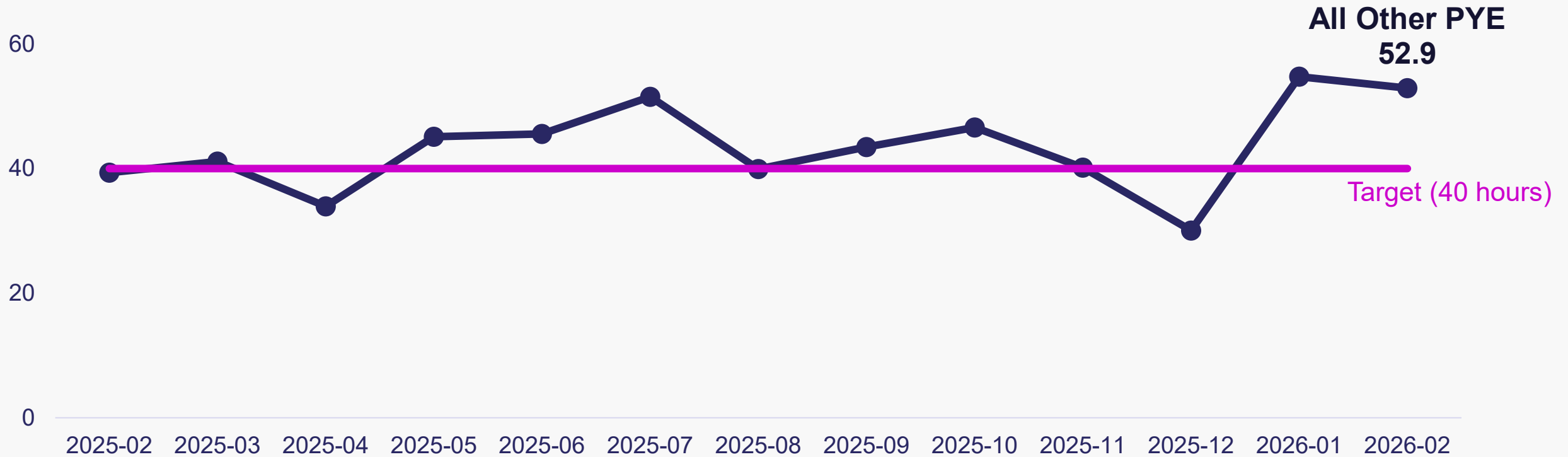
Safe Community Skill Development decreased to 2.5 hours per youth

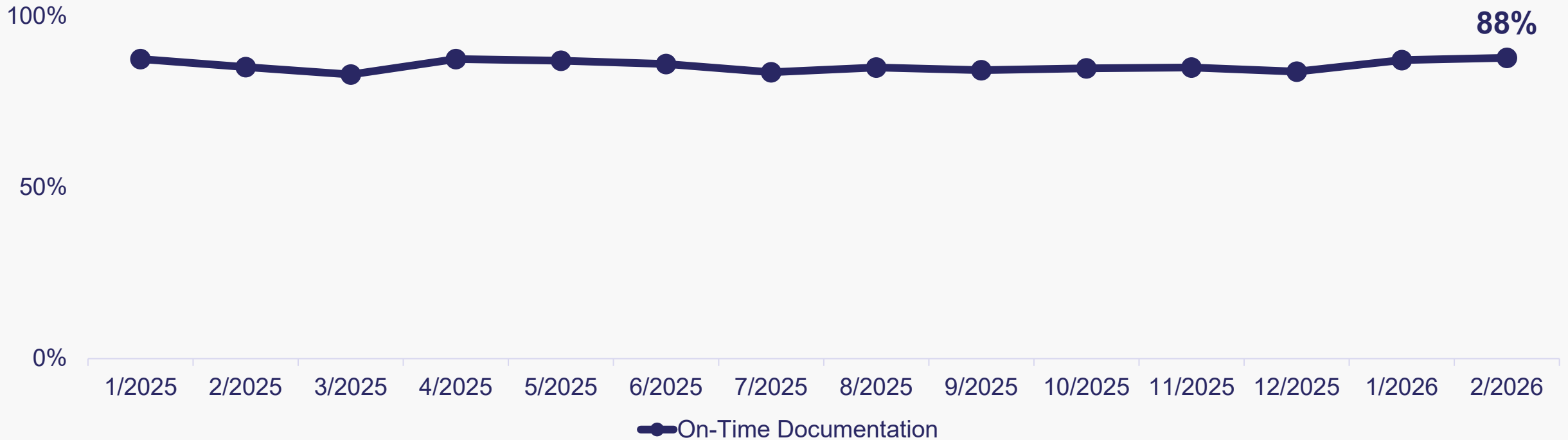

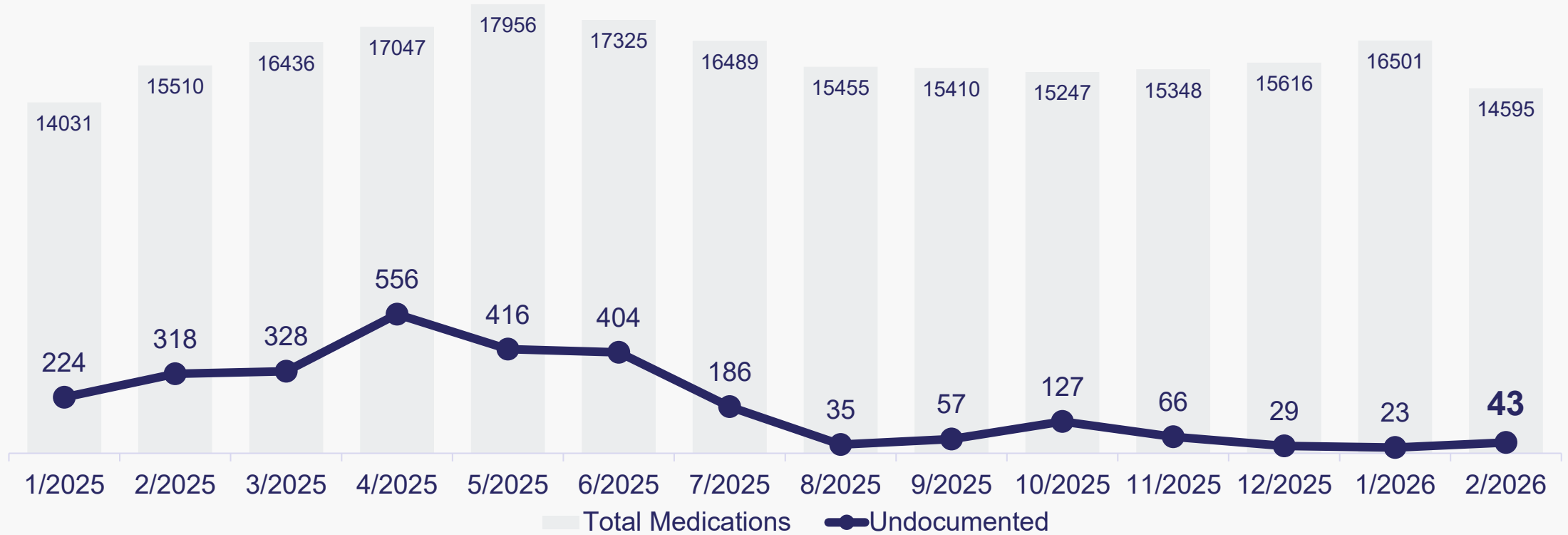
On-Time Documentation as % of Ordered Medication Doses

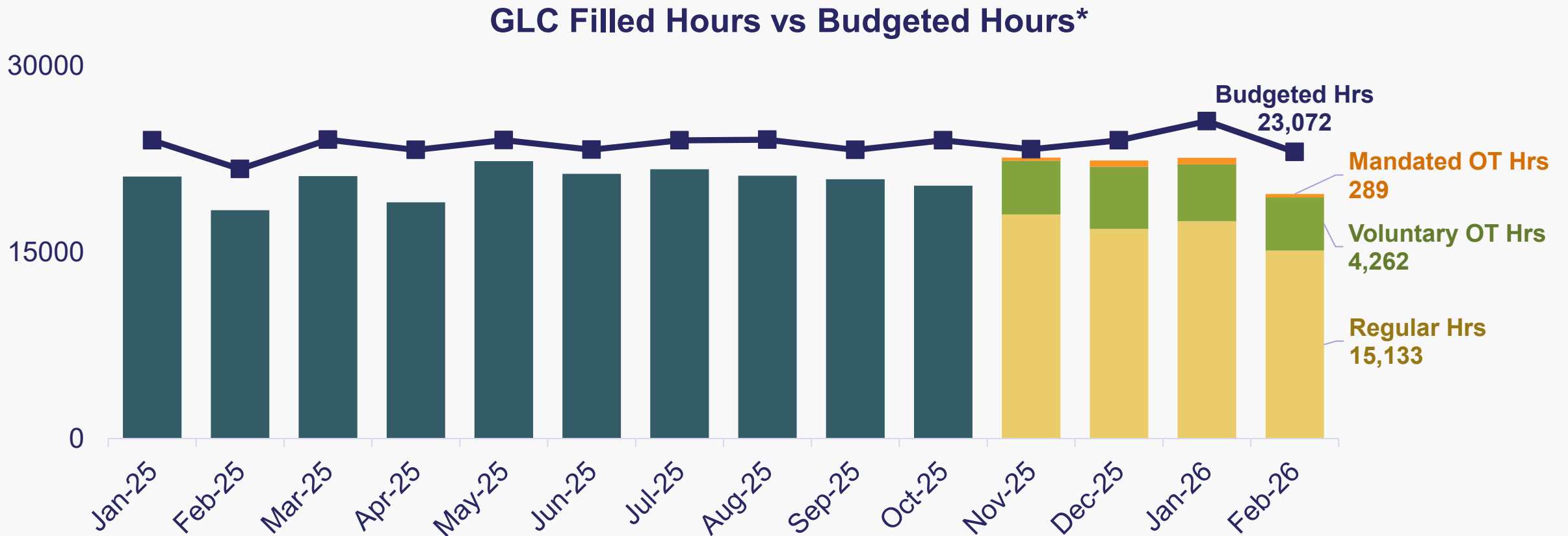

GLC Filled Hours compared to Budgeted Hours



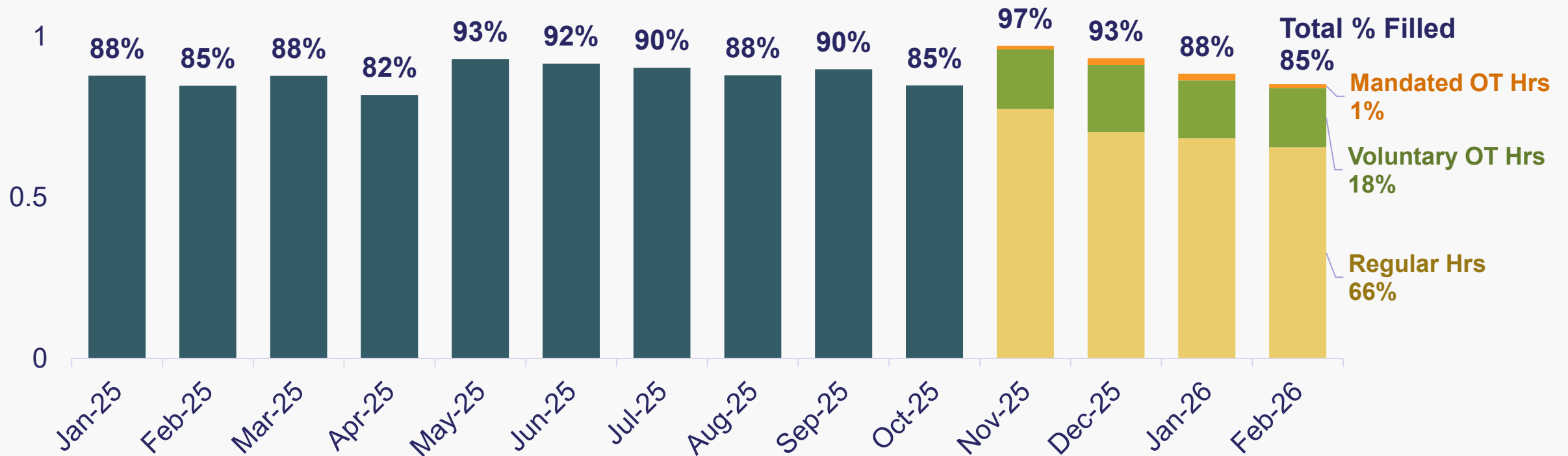

% of Budgeted GLC Hours that were Filled*

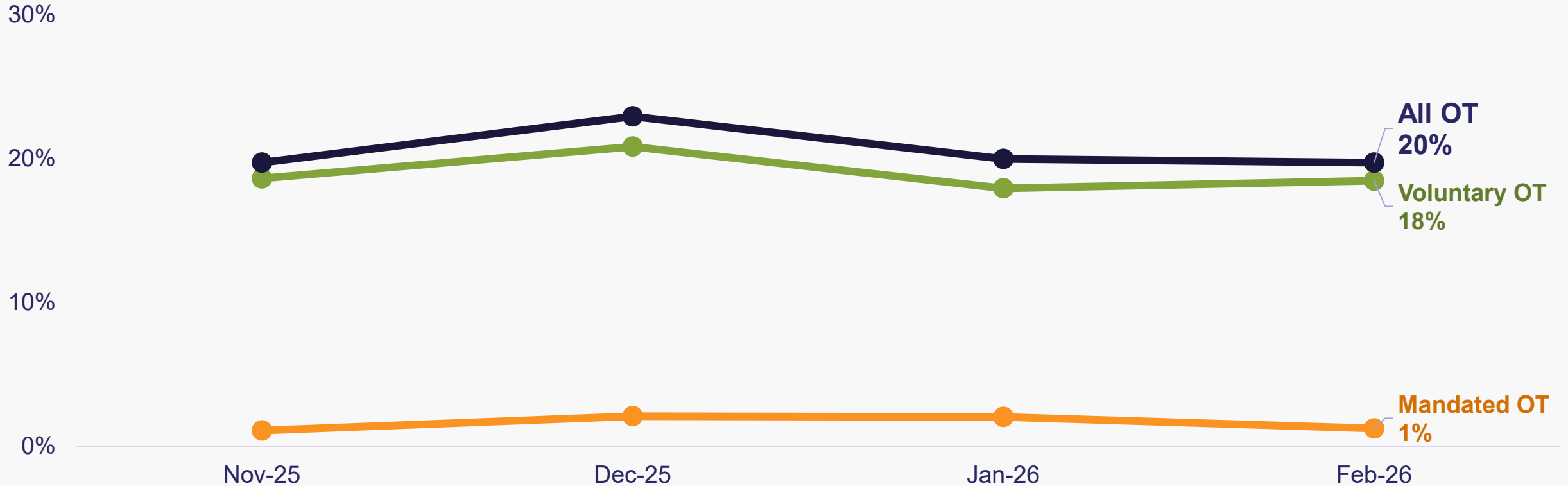

Overtime Hours as a Percentage of Budgeted GLC Hours



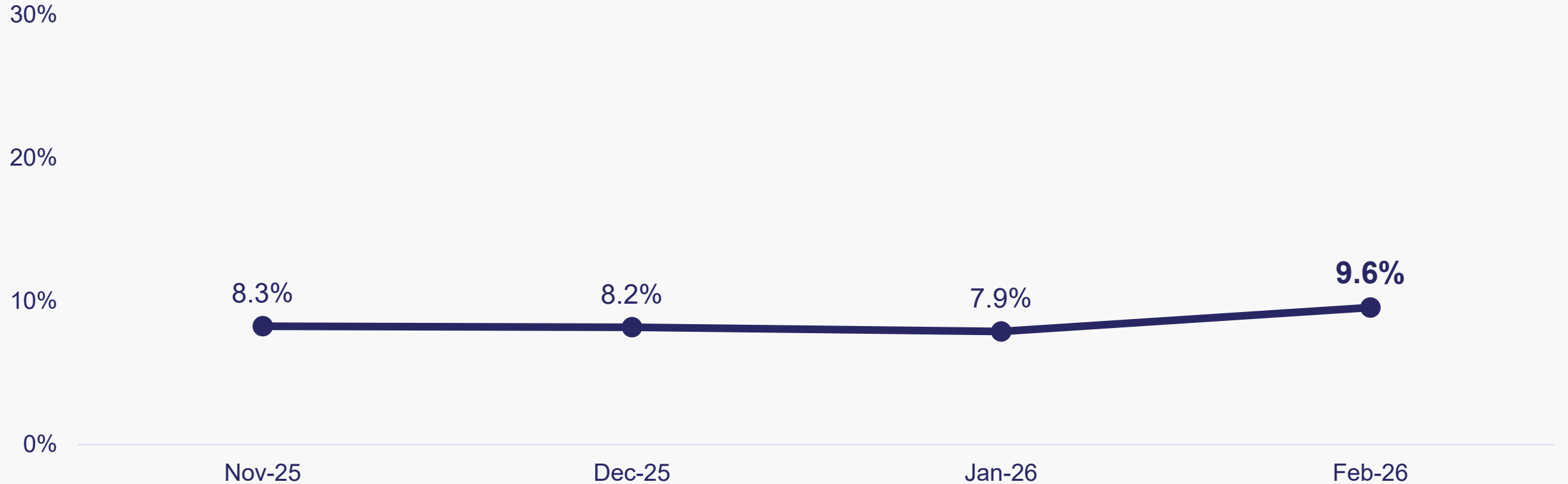

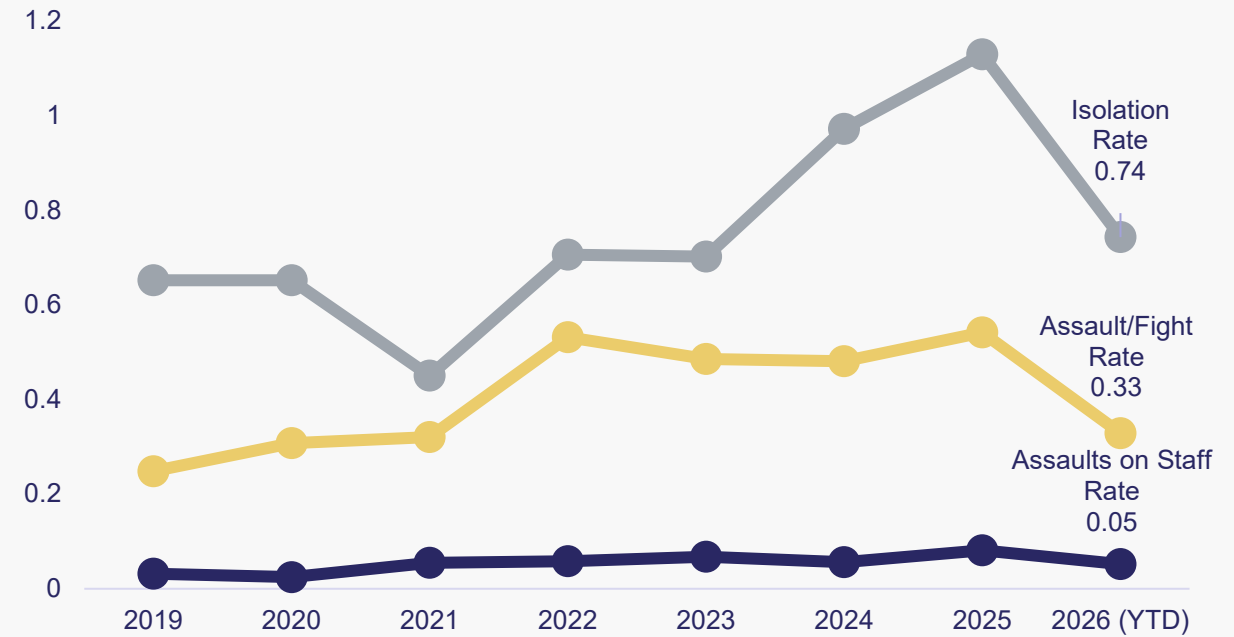
