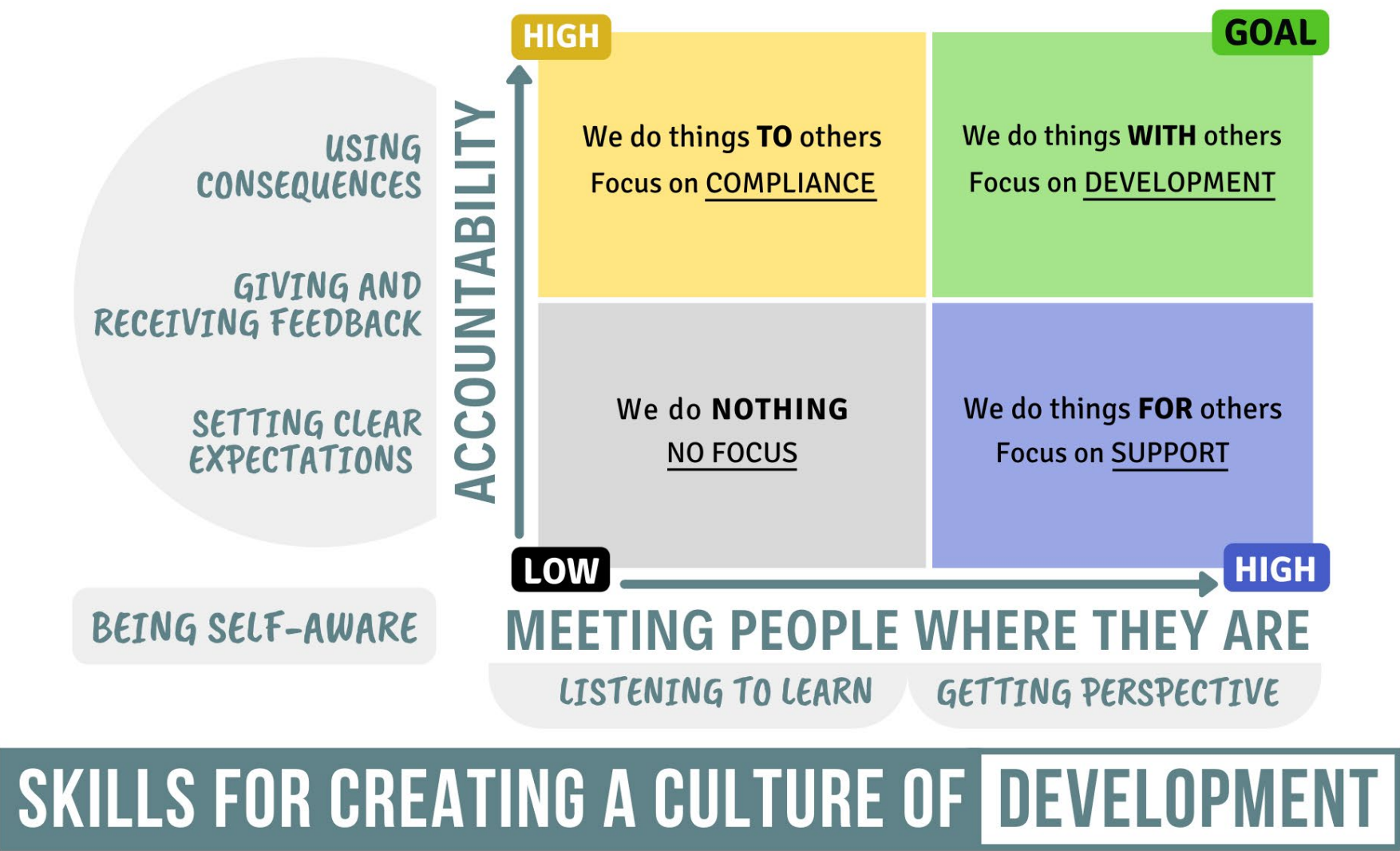

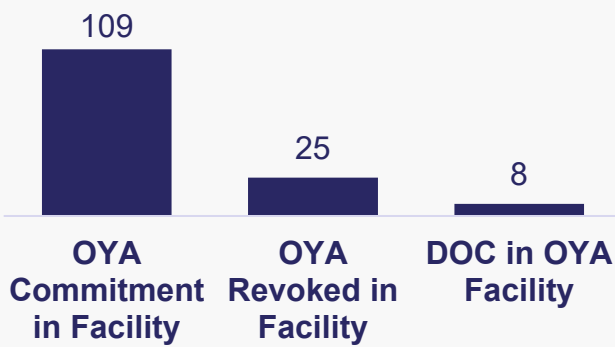


Total Youth: 142 *(as of 5/31/2026)*

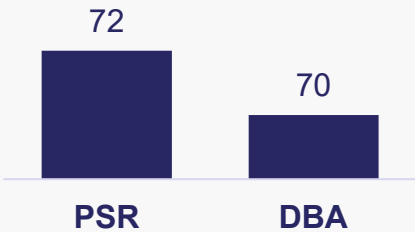
Assigned Unit Type



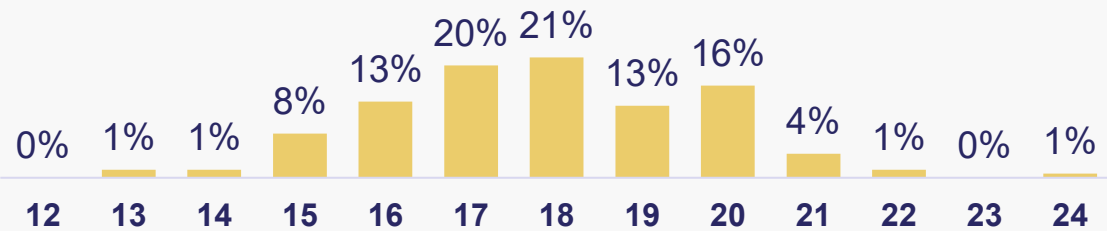
Commit Type



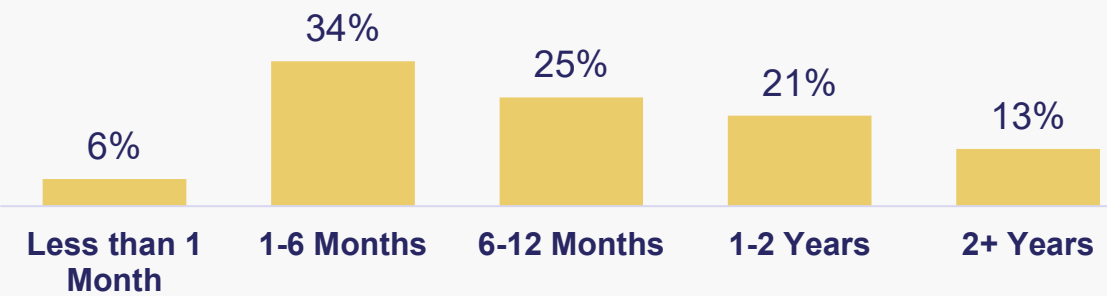
Offense Type



Current Age



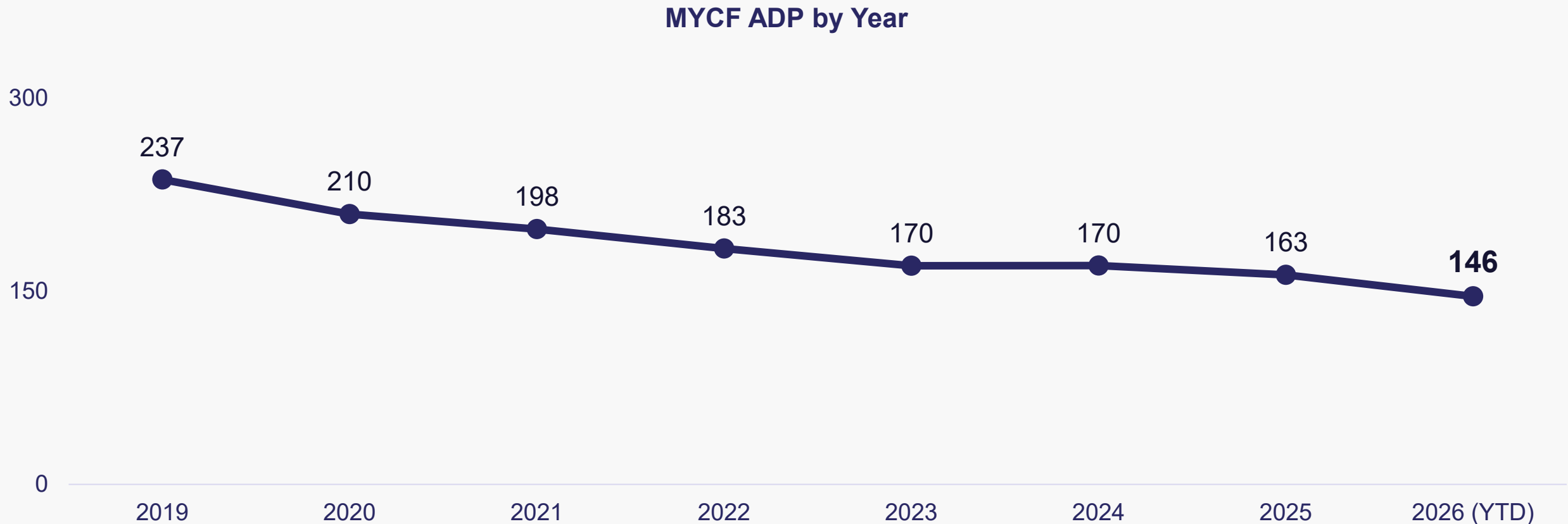
Days at MYCF to Date

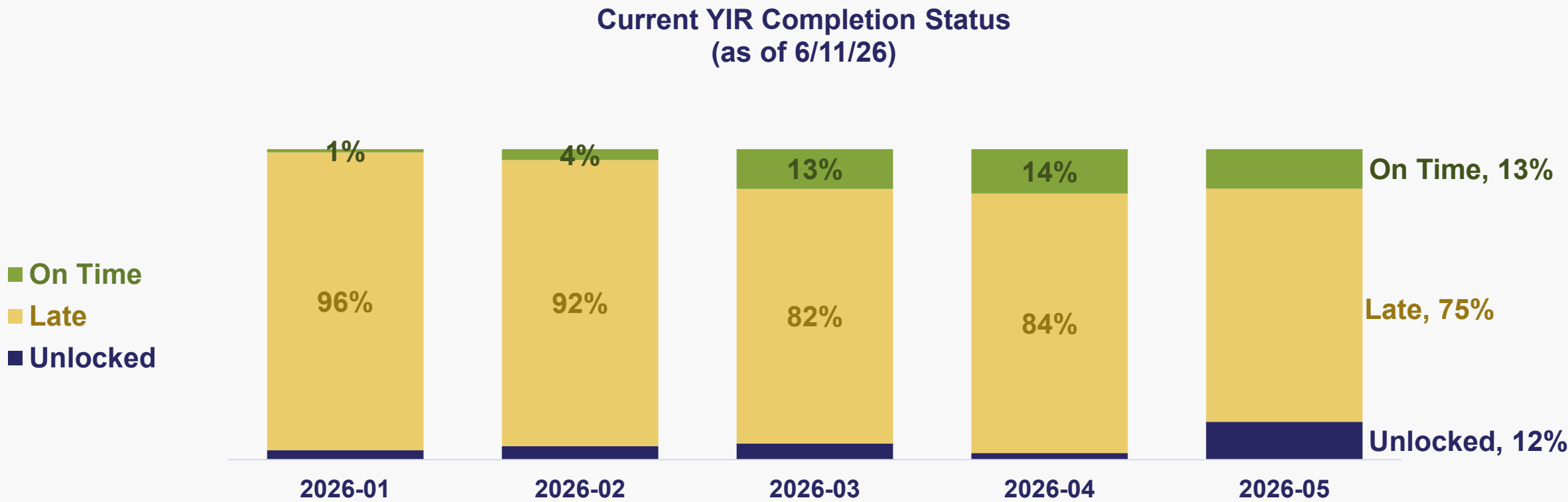

Timely YIR Completion

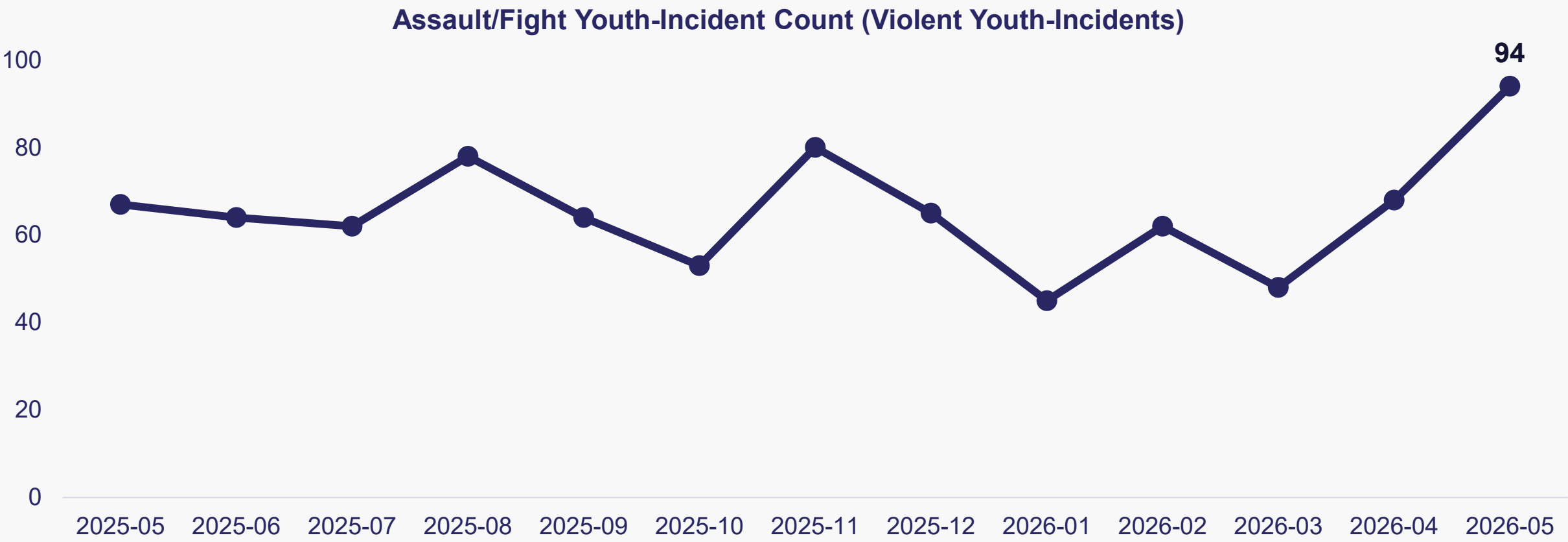
13% of last month's YIRs were locked within 72 hours





Youth Assaults/Fights

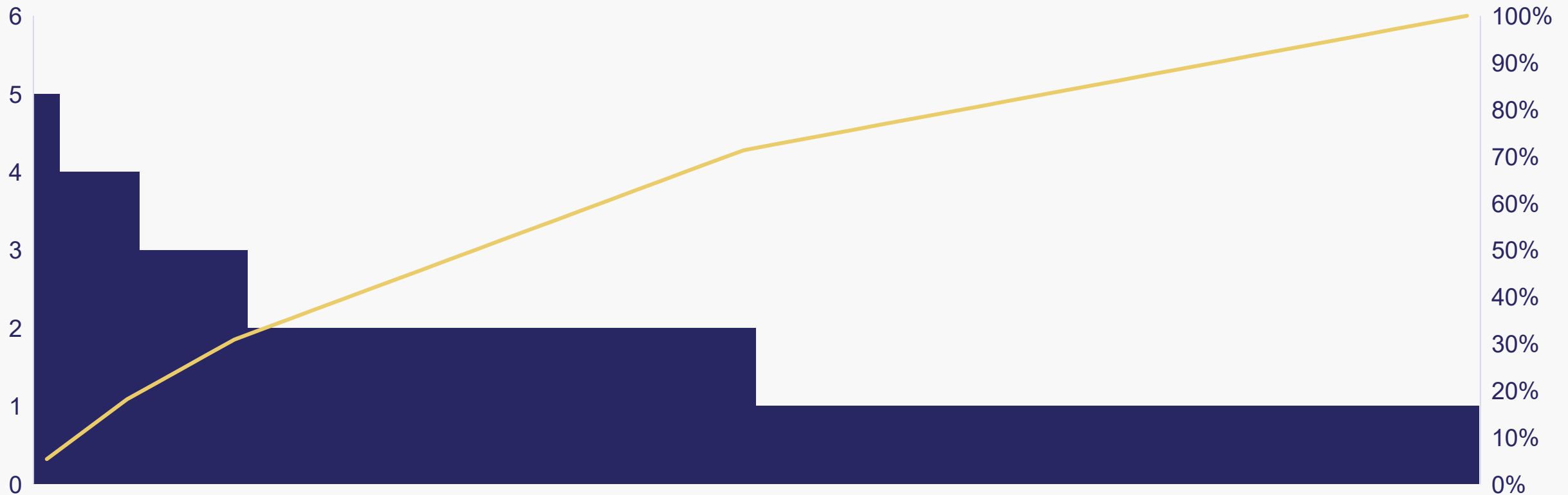
There were 94 Assaults/Fights last month

6 youth were responsible for 25% of assaults/fights

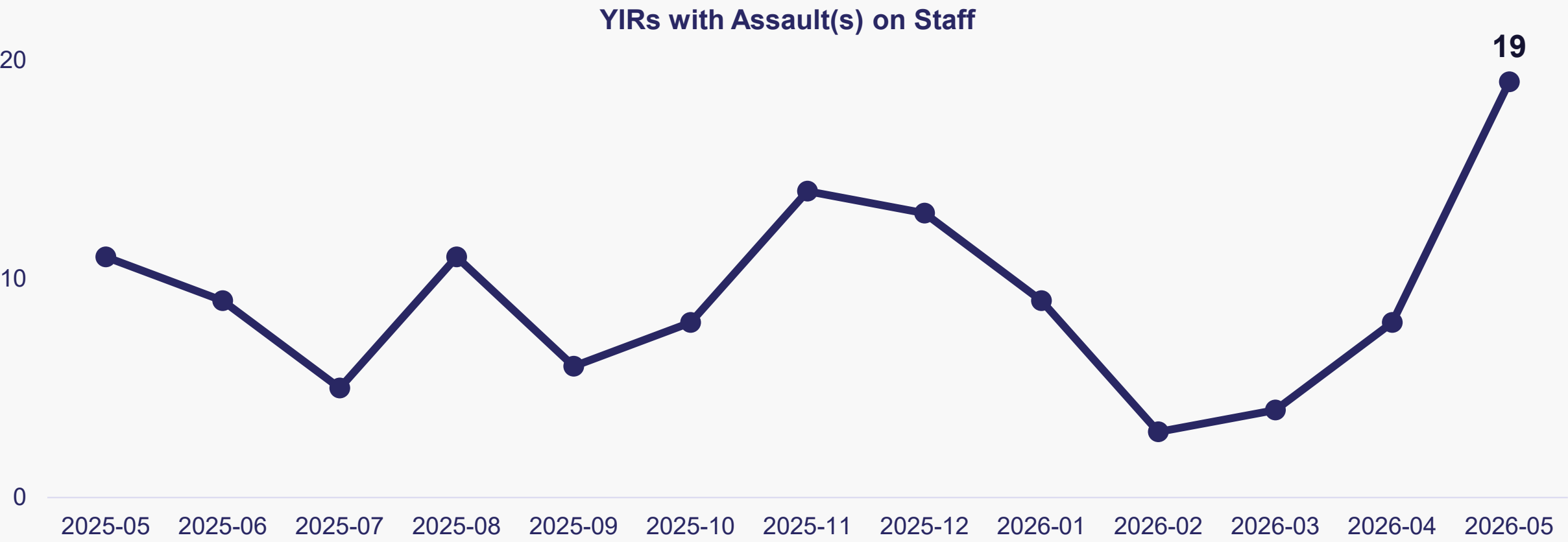


Each column represents an individual youth; column height indicates the number of assaults/fights for that youth



Incidents with Assaults on Staff

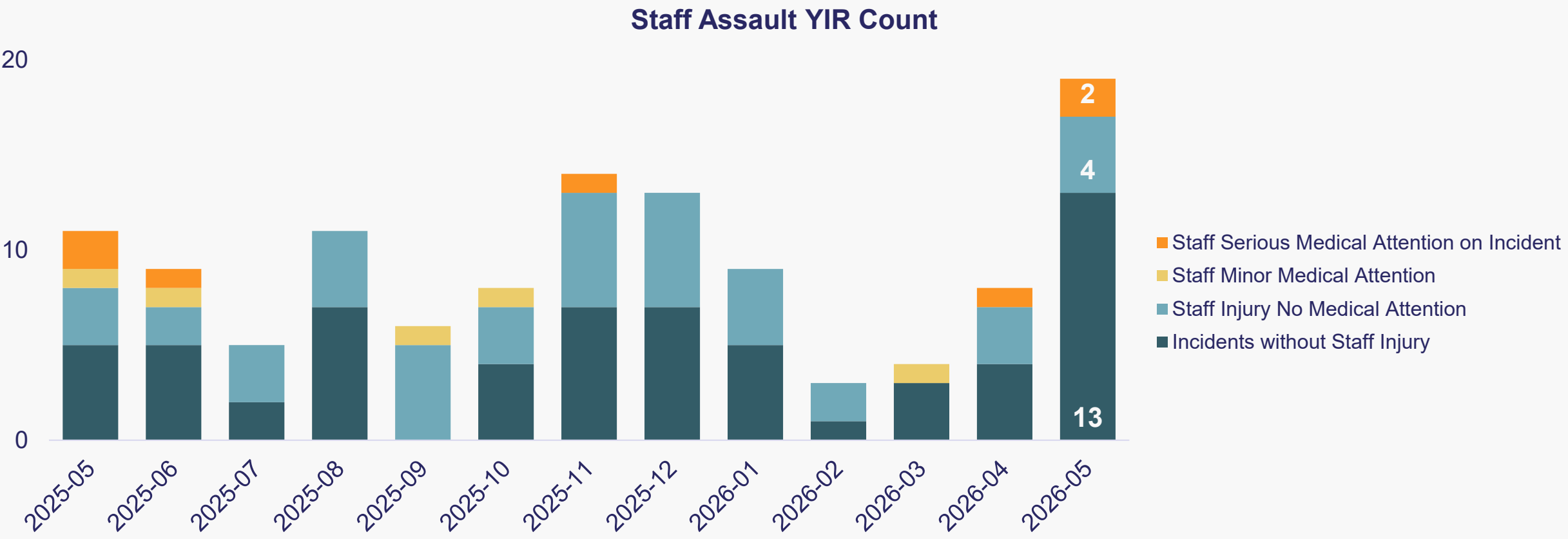
Last month, 19 YIRs involved an assault on staff

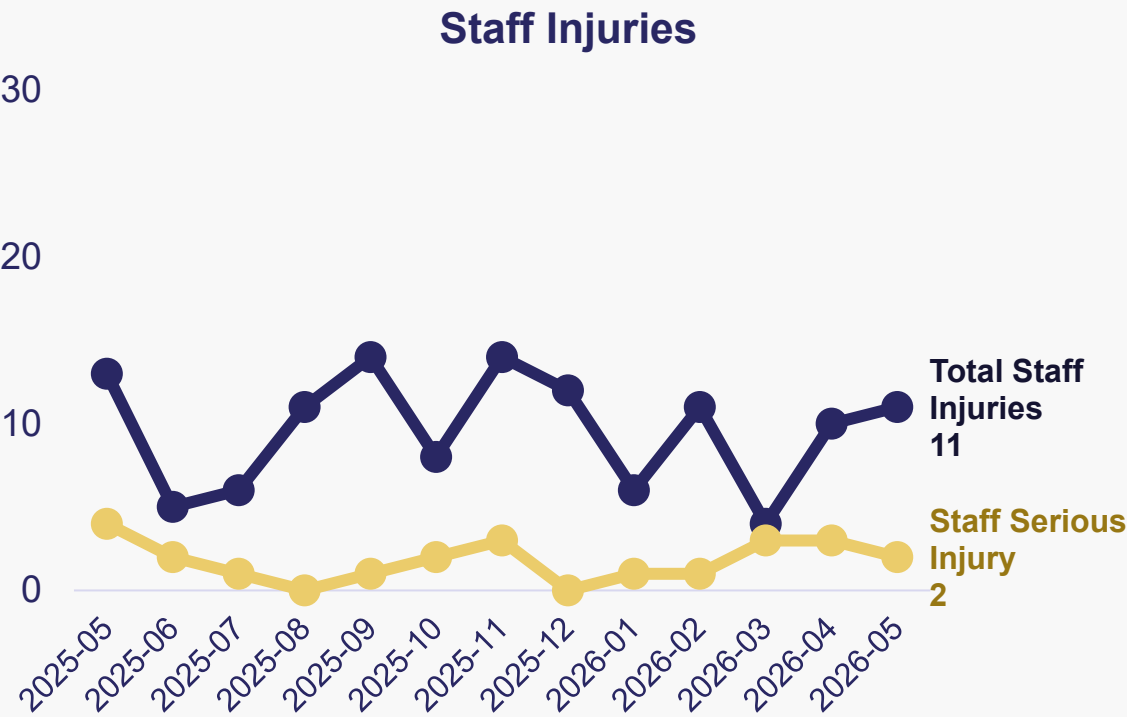
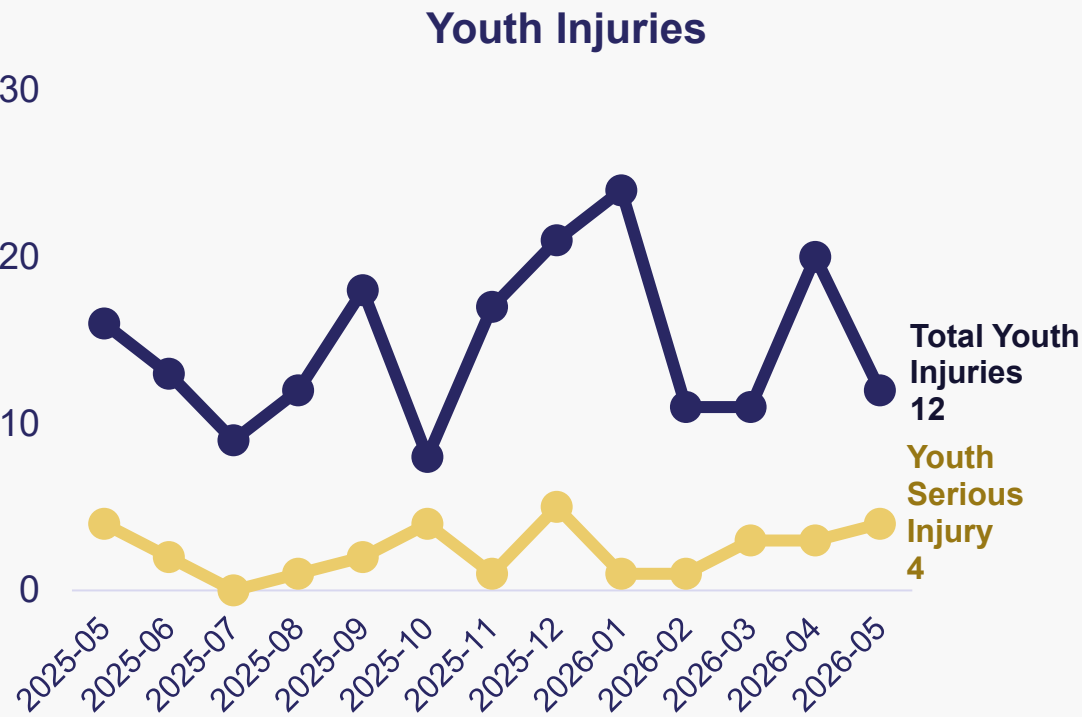
Two of last month’s assaults resulted in staff requiring outside medical attention

Last month, 6 serious injuries (4 youth, 2 staff) were recorded in YIRs

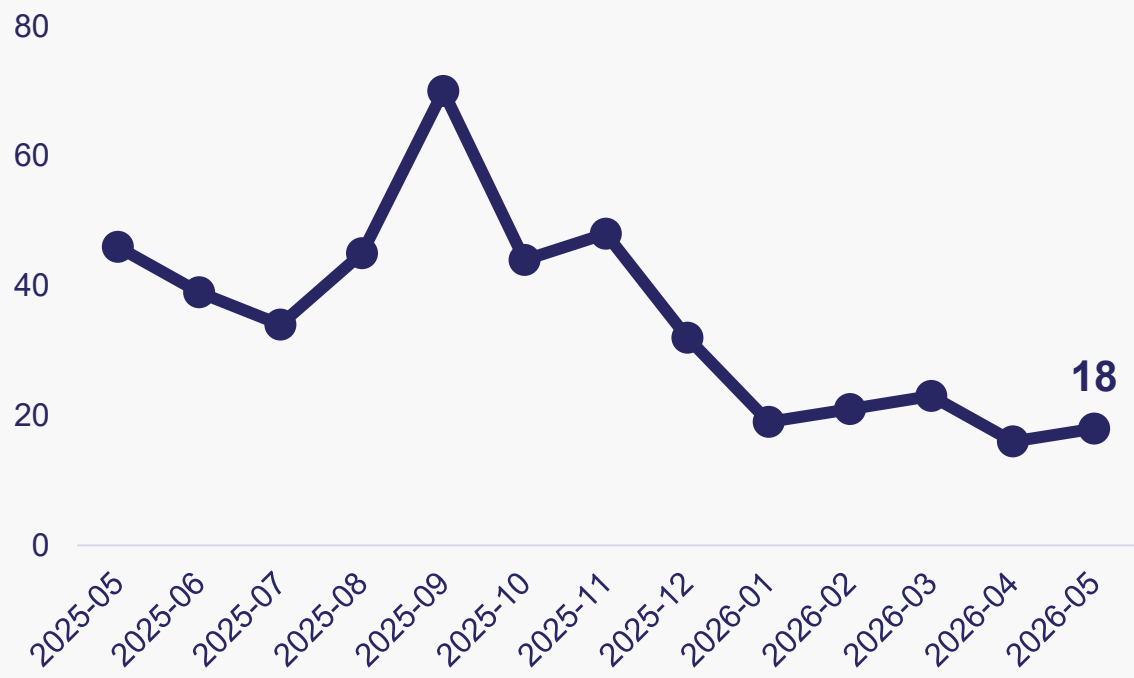




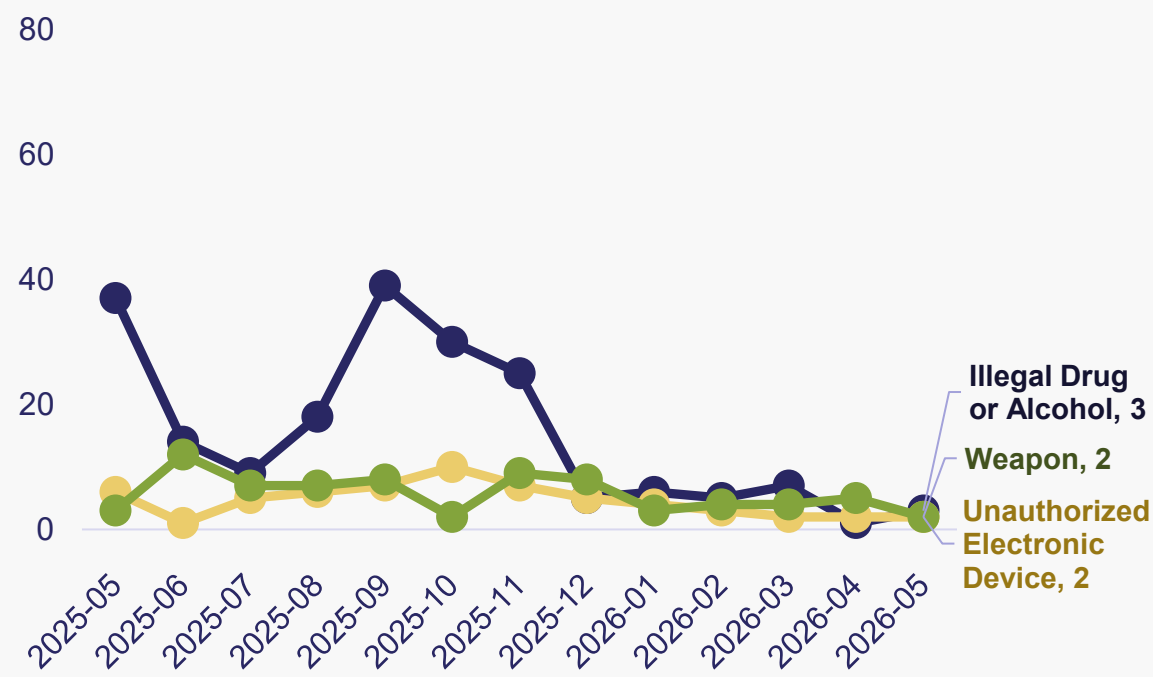
Contraband from YIRs

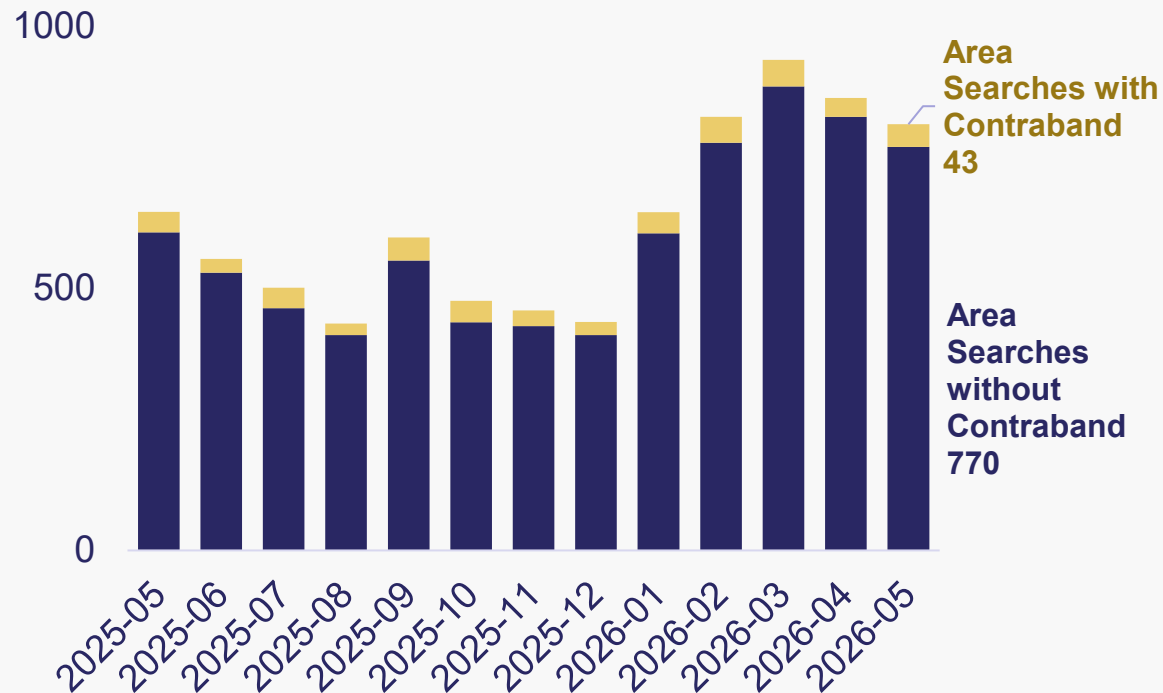




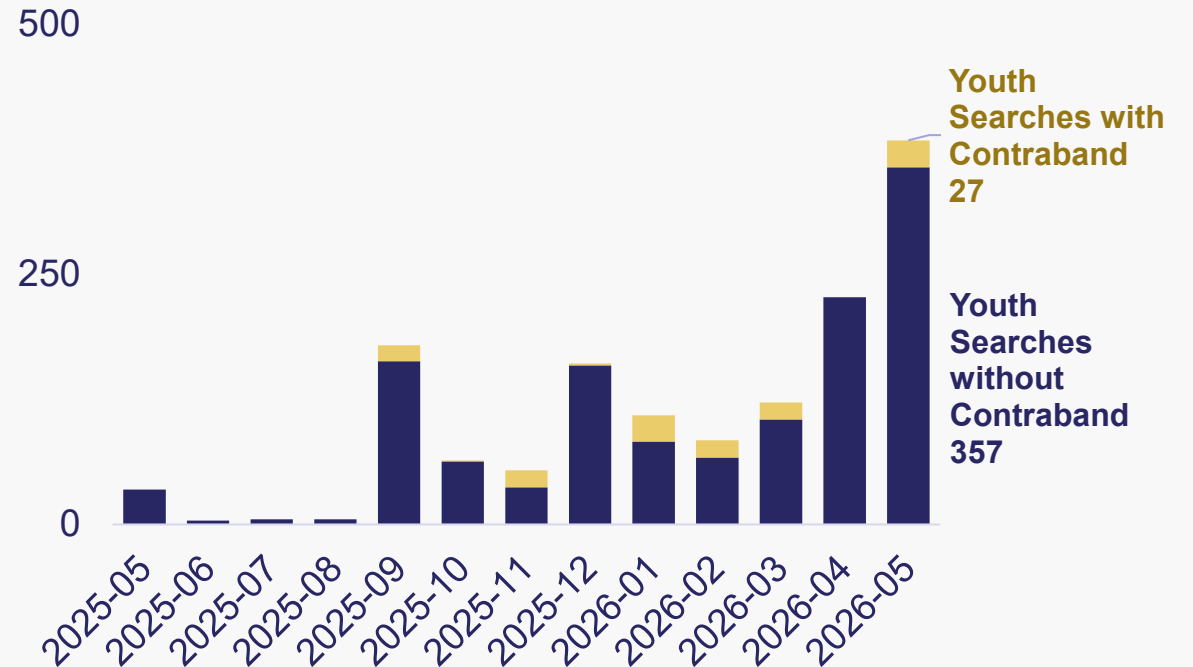
Contraband from Searches

5% of Area Searches discovered Contraband



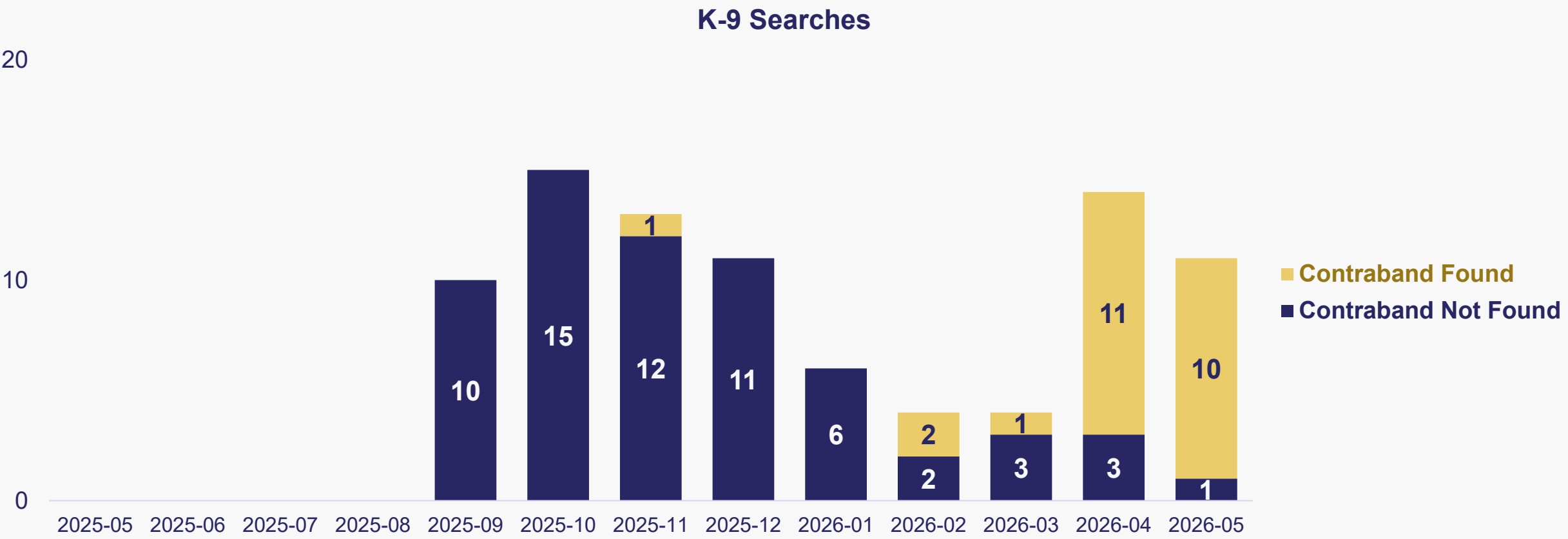

K9 Searches

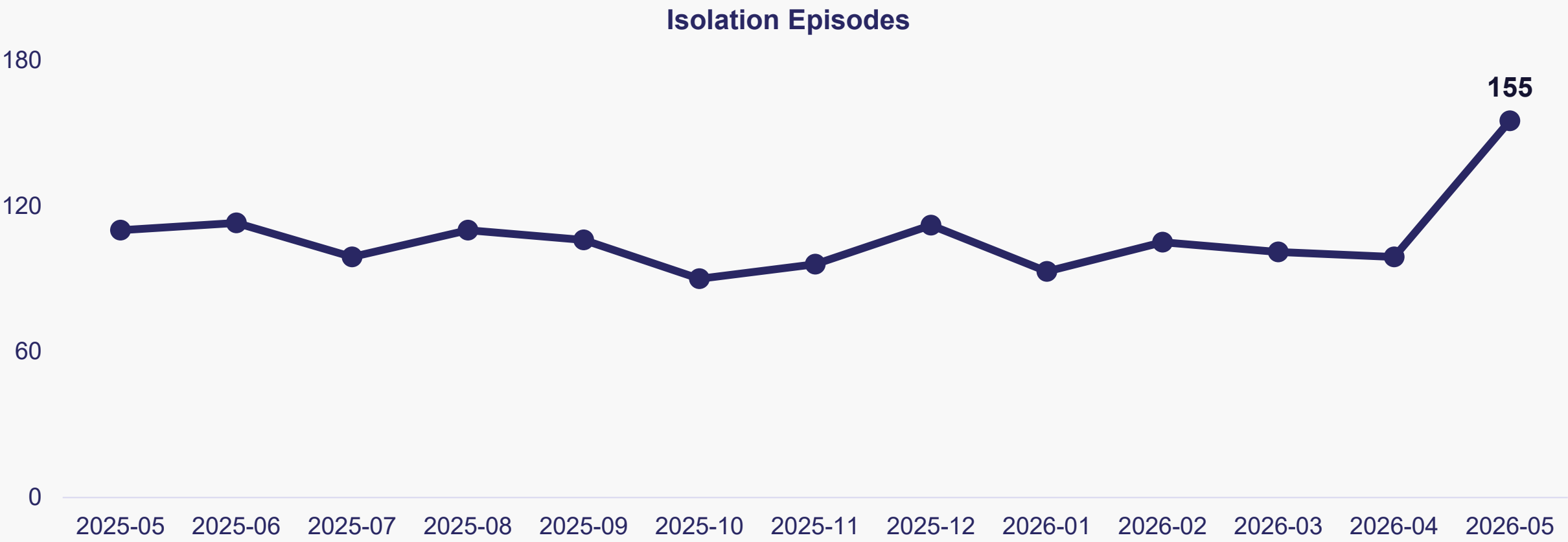
Ten K9 searches found contraband last month

There were an average of 5 isolation episodes per day last month

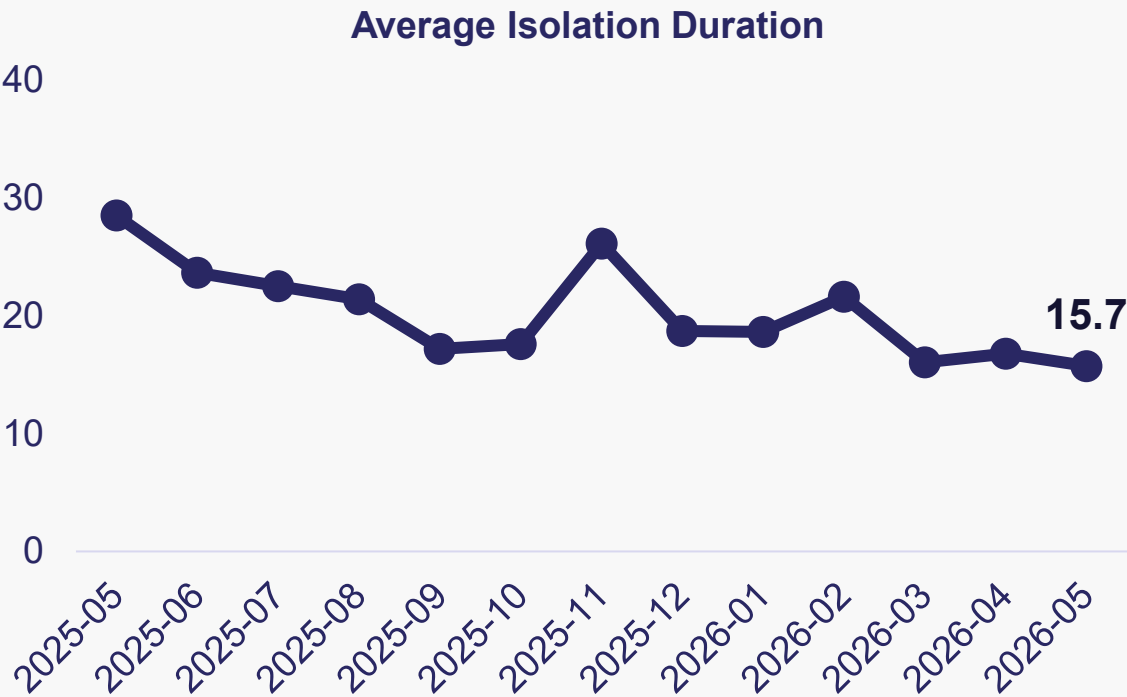




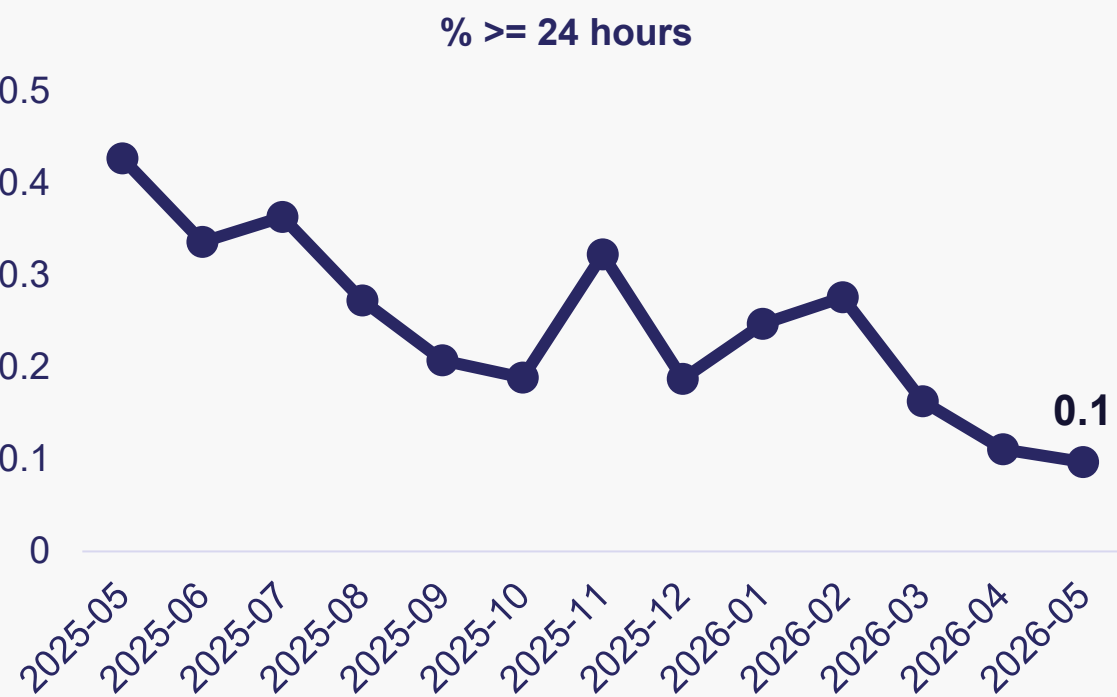
Isolation Duration

Average Time in Isolation was 15.7 hours



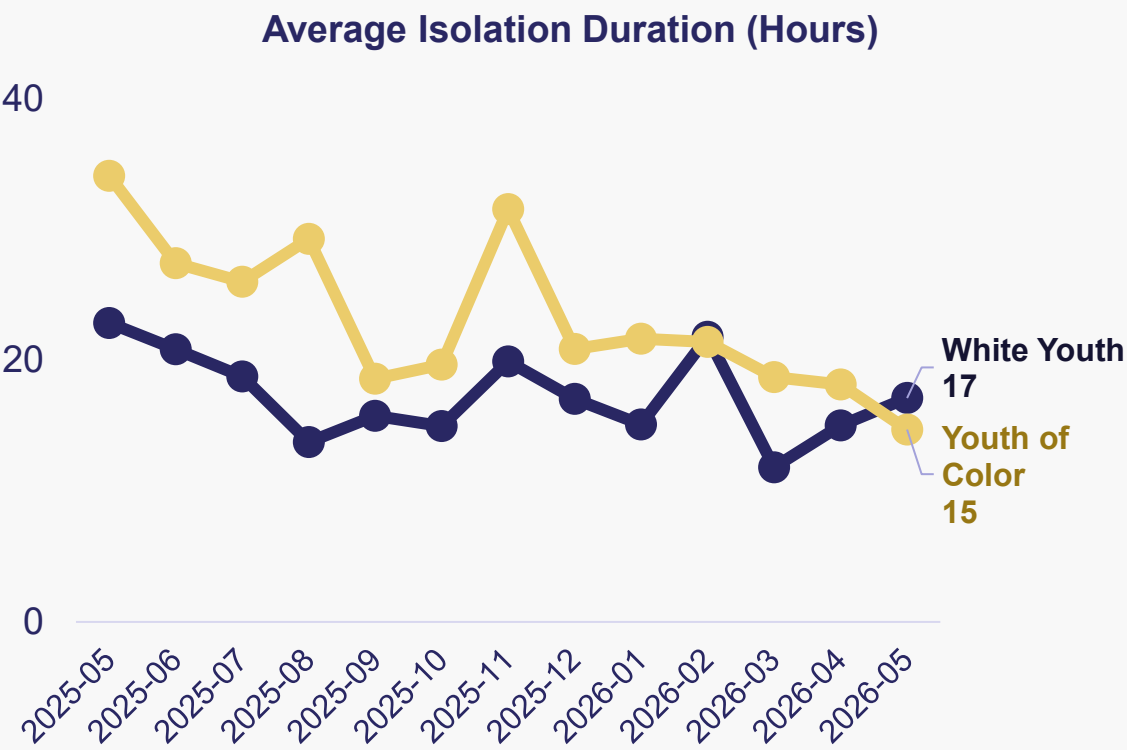
10% of Episodes Lasted 24 Hours or More



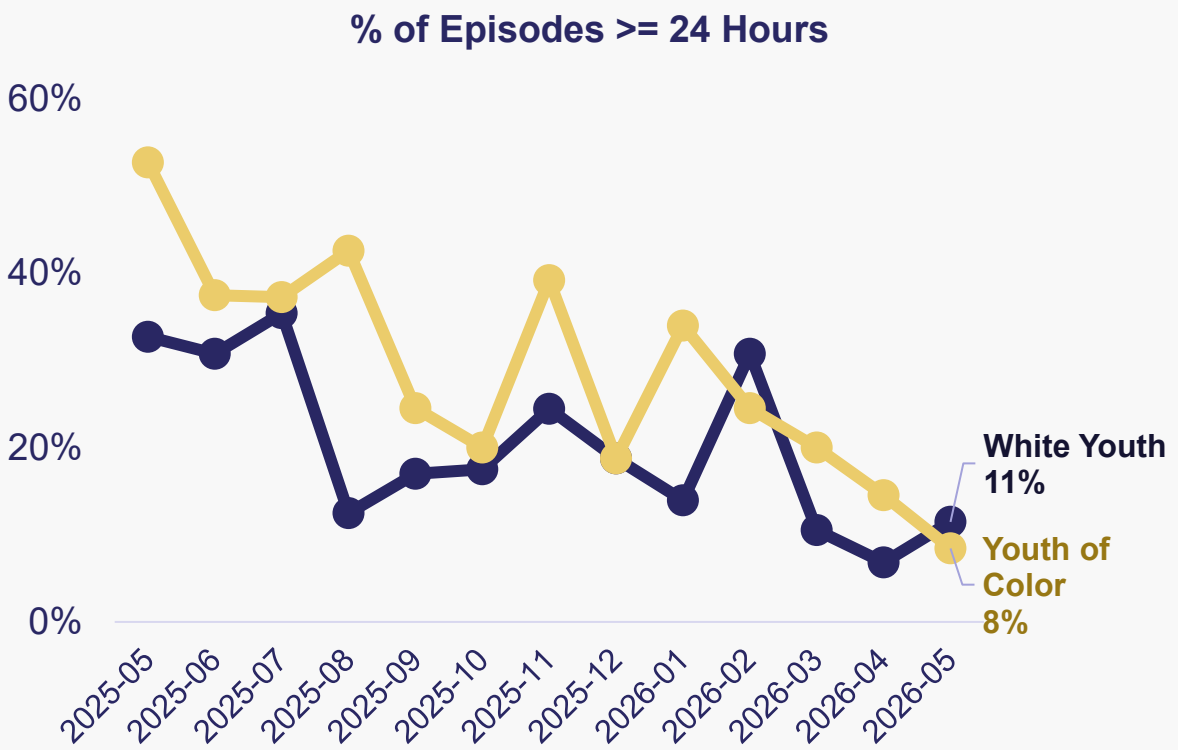


Supplemental – Isolation Duration by Race/Ethnicity

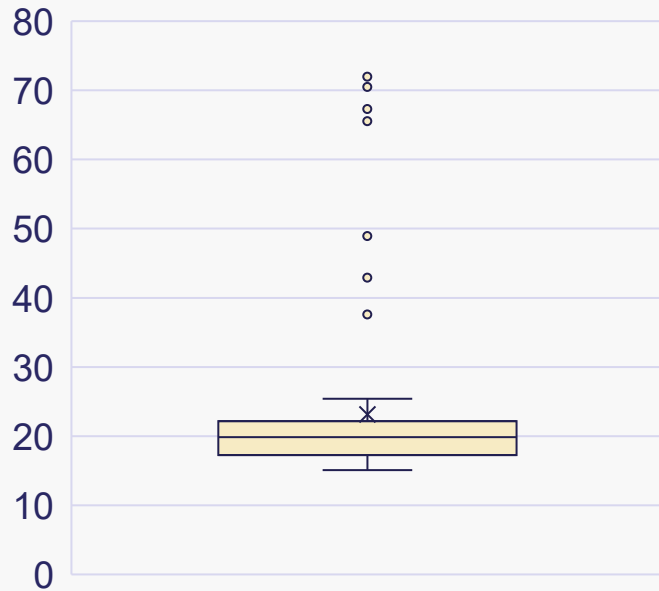

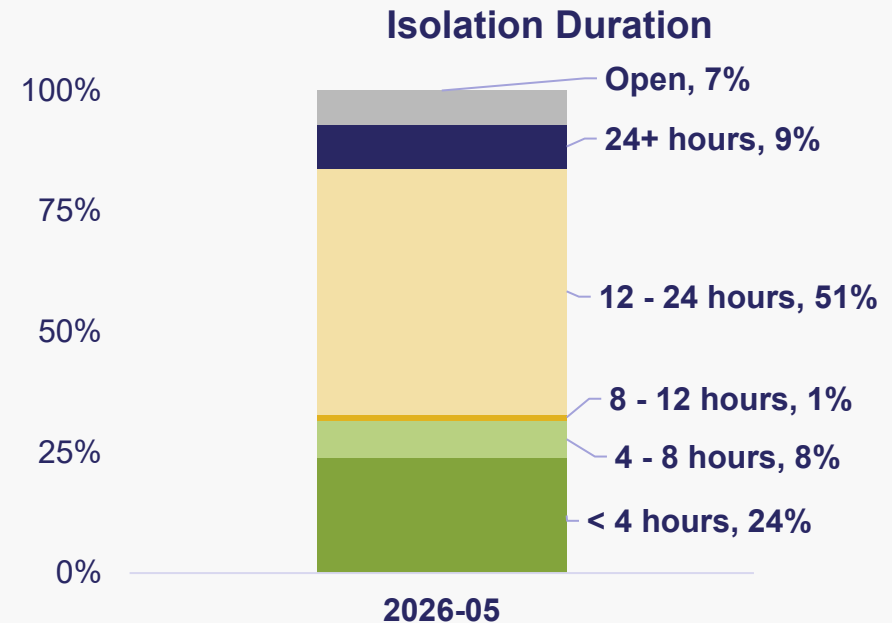

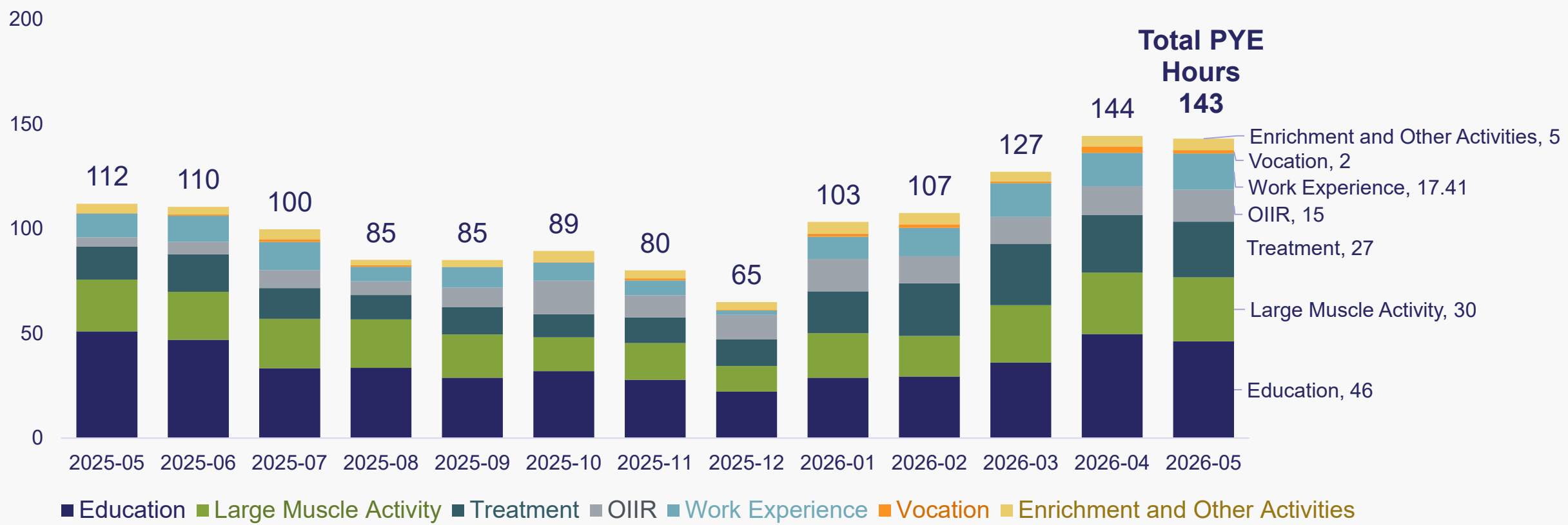

Youth averaged 143 hours of PYE last month

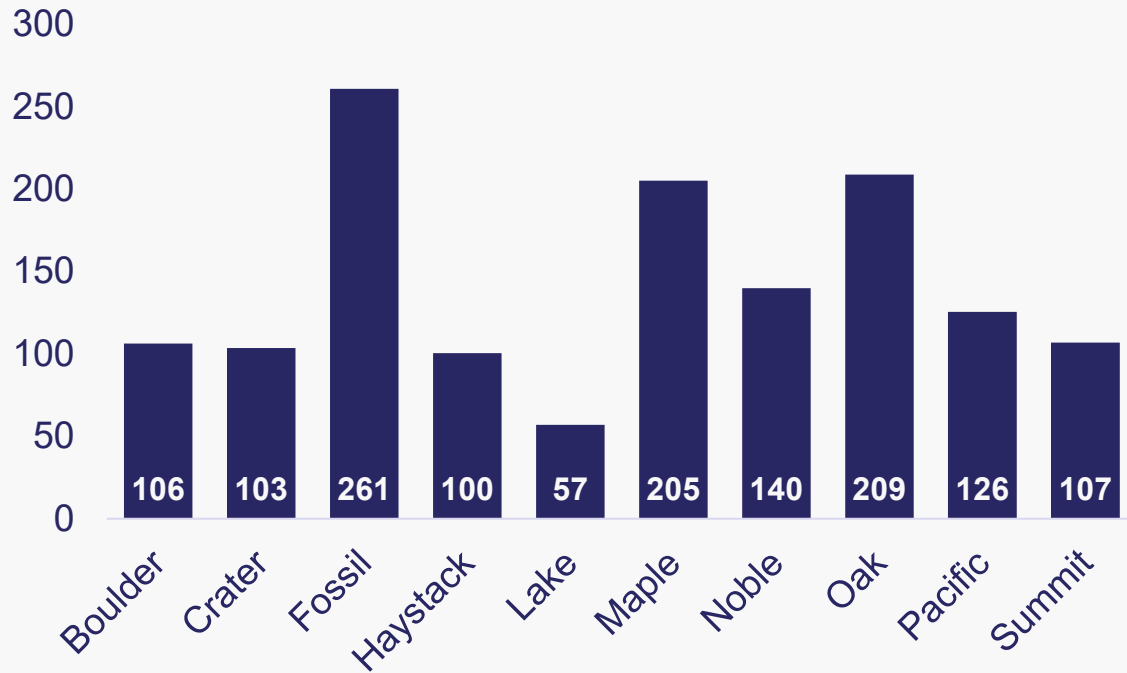




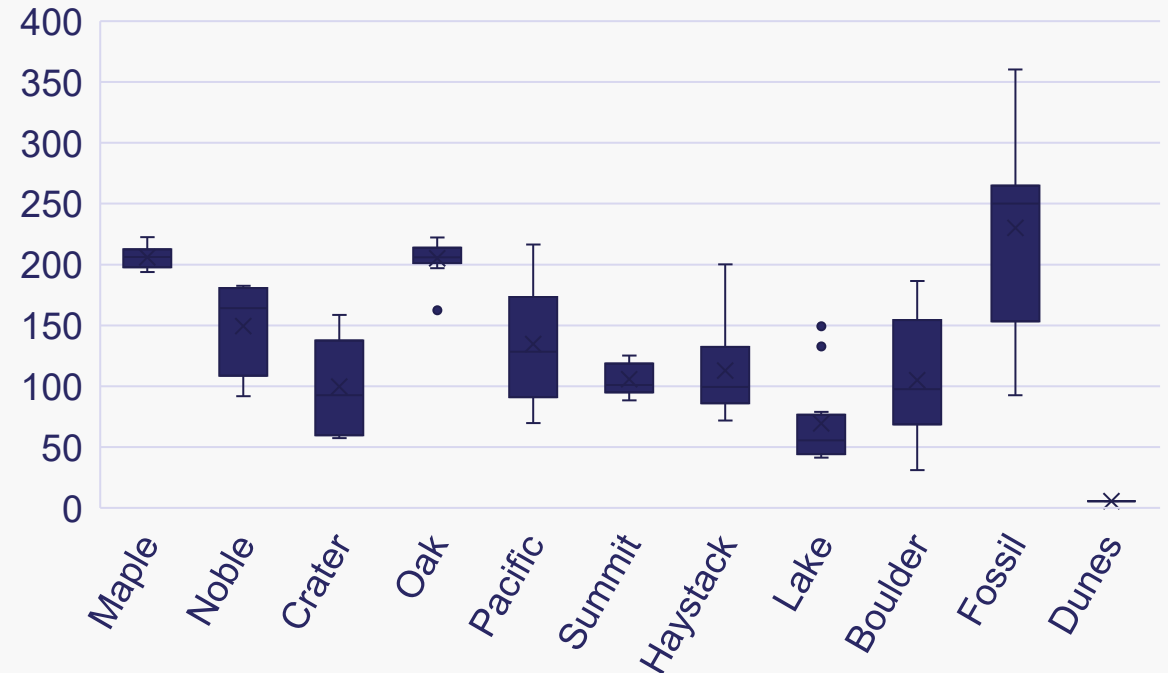
PYE by Unit

Average PYE Hours



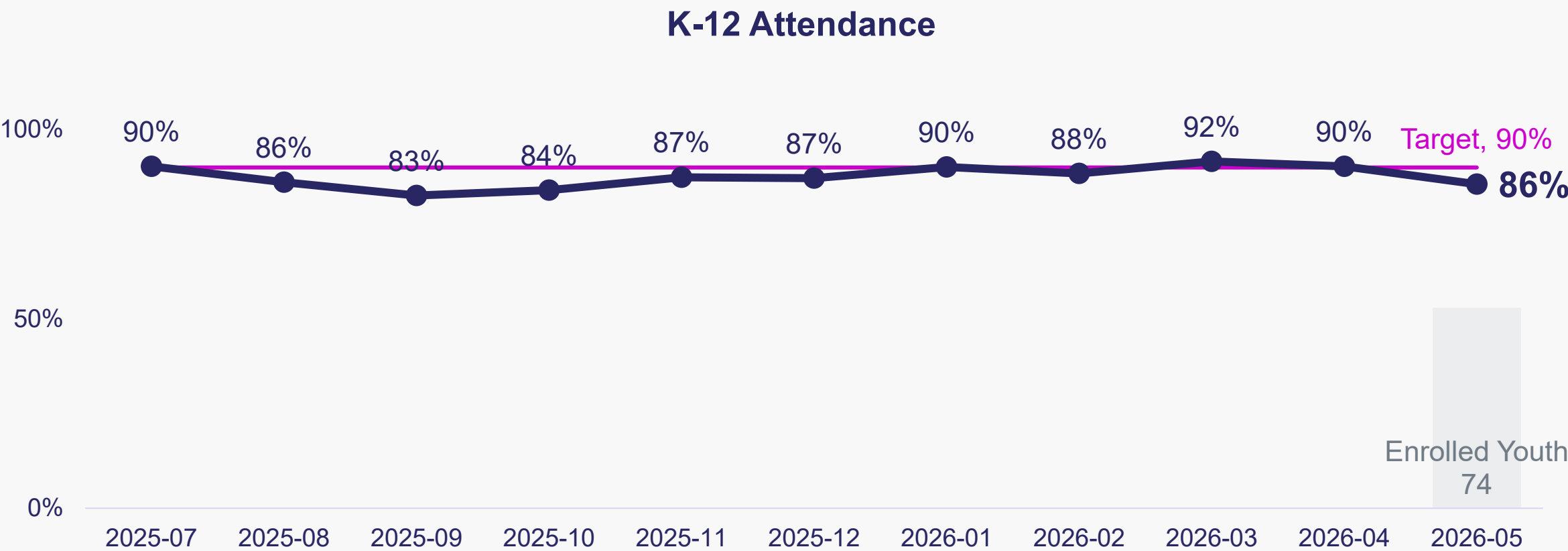
PYE Hours by Unit



Excludes youth who were not on campus for the entire month; unit is the youth's most recent assigned unit



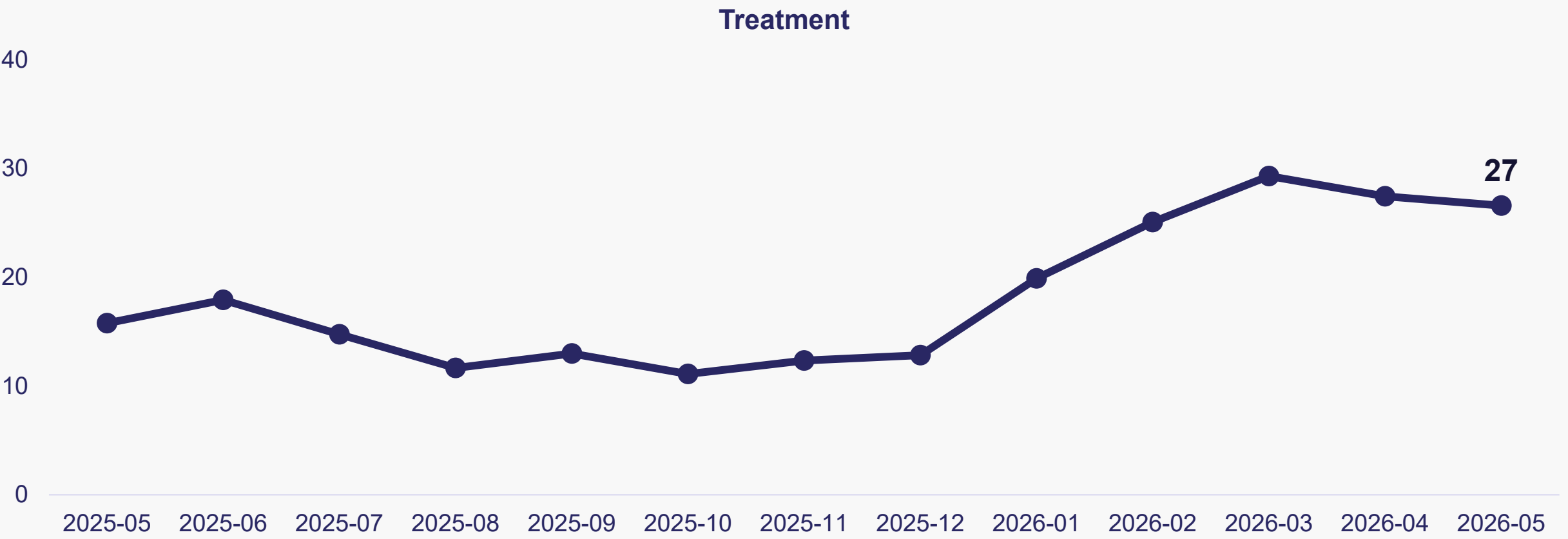
Youth attended 86% of scheduled school days last month





Treatment Hours

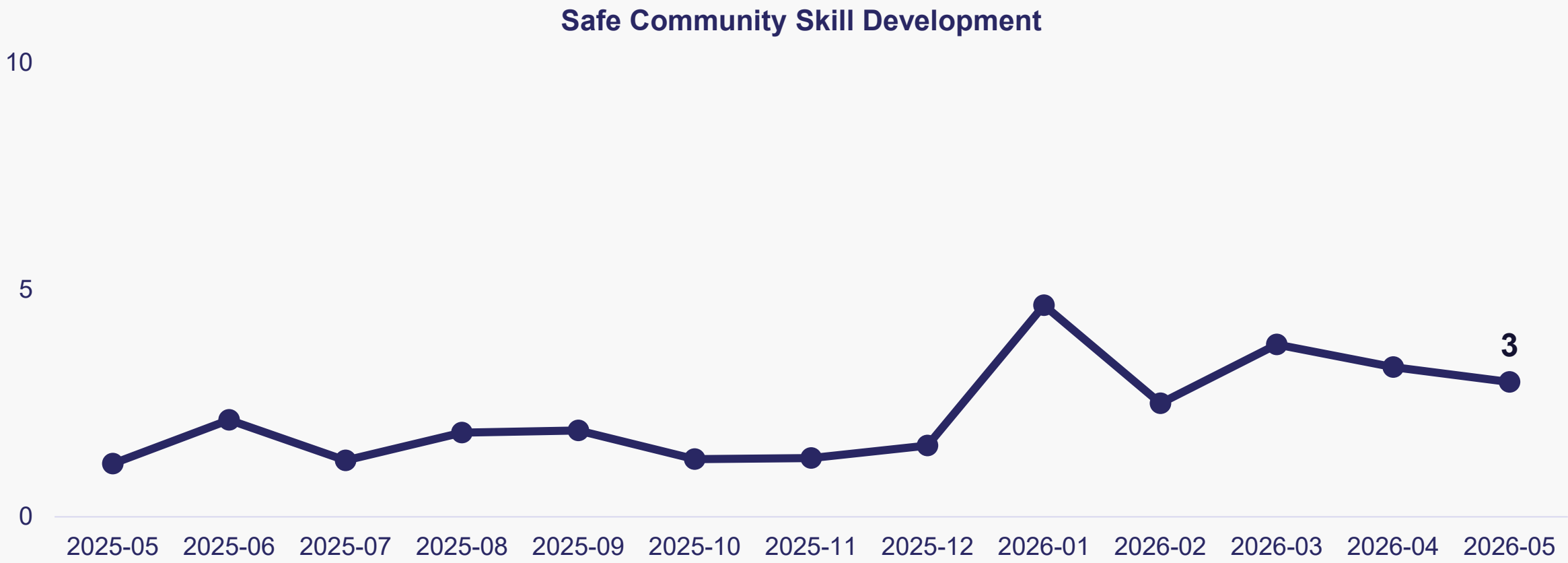
Treatment averaged 27 hours per youth last month





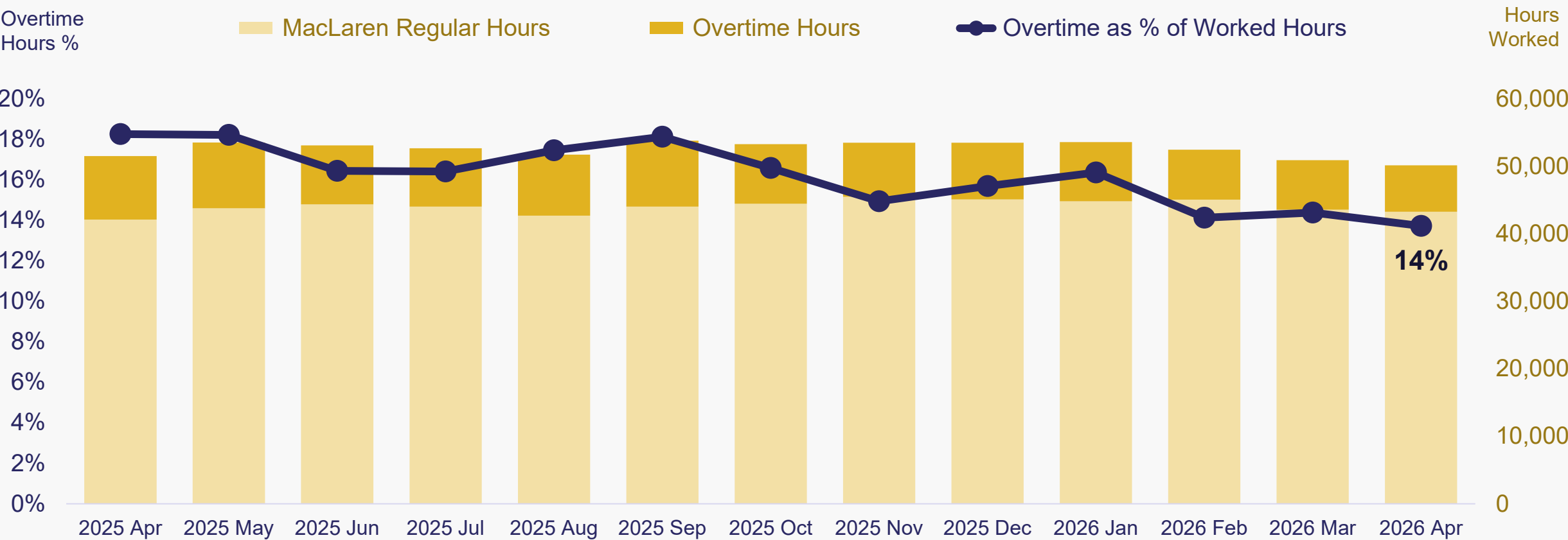
Safe Community Skill Development

Safe Community Skill Development averaged 3.0 hours per youth



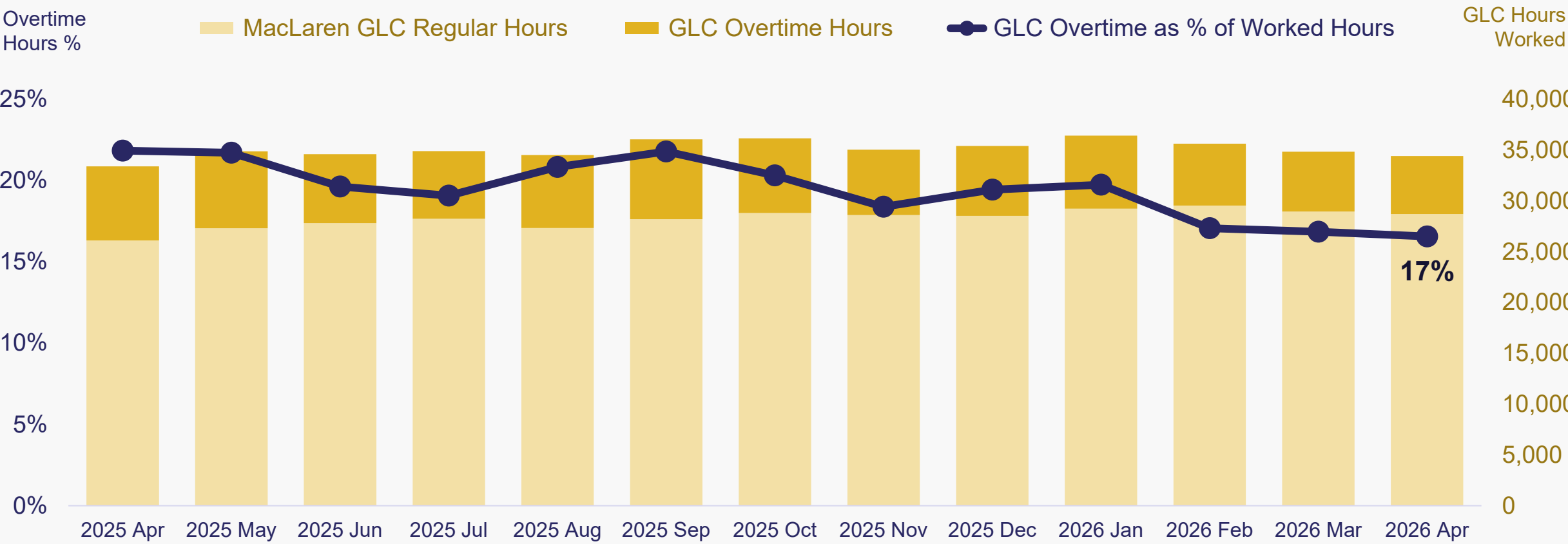


In April 2026, 14% of All MYCF Hours Worked were Overtime





In April 2026, 17% of MYCF GLC Hours Worked were Overtime

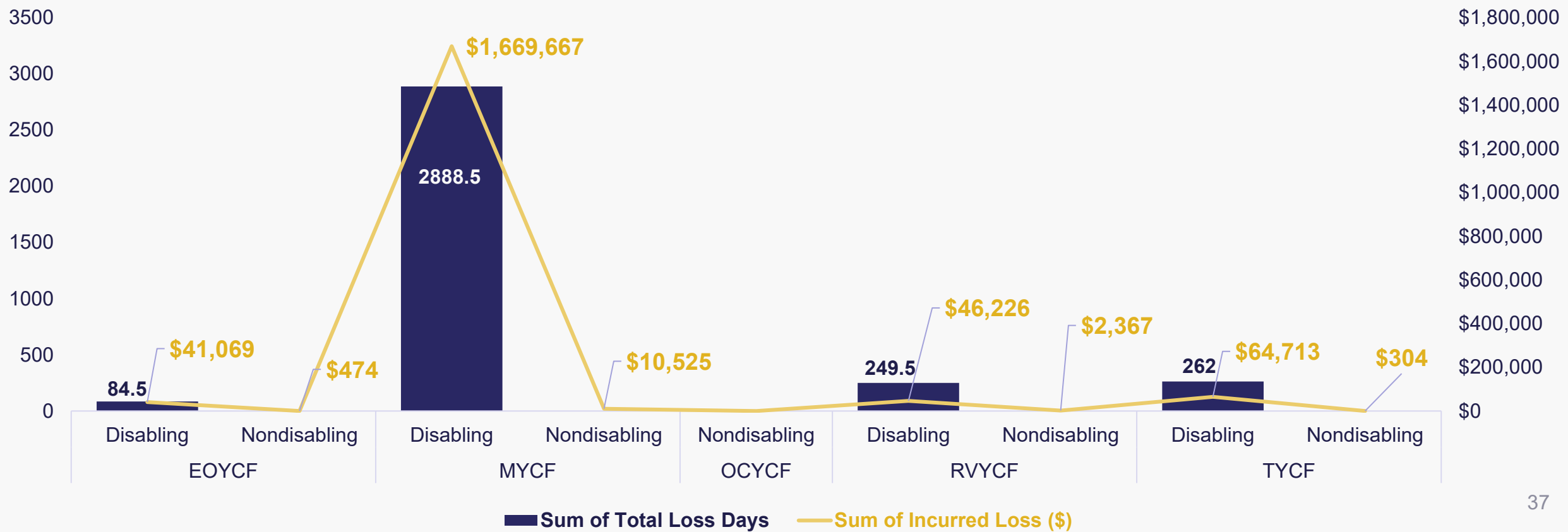

Access to Hygiene Products

Youth in the custody of the Oregon Youth Authority are entitled to immediate and unrestricted access to culturally-specific hygiene products.

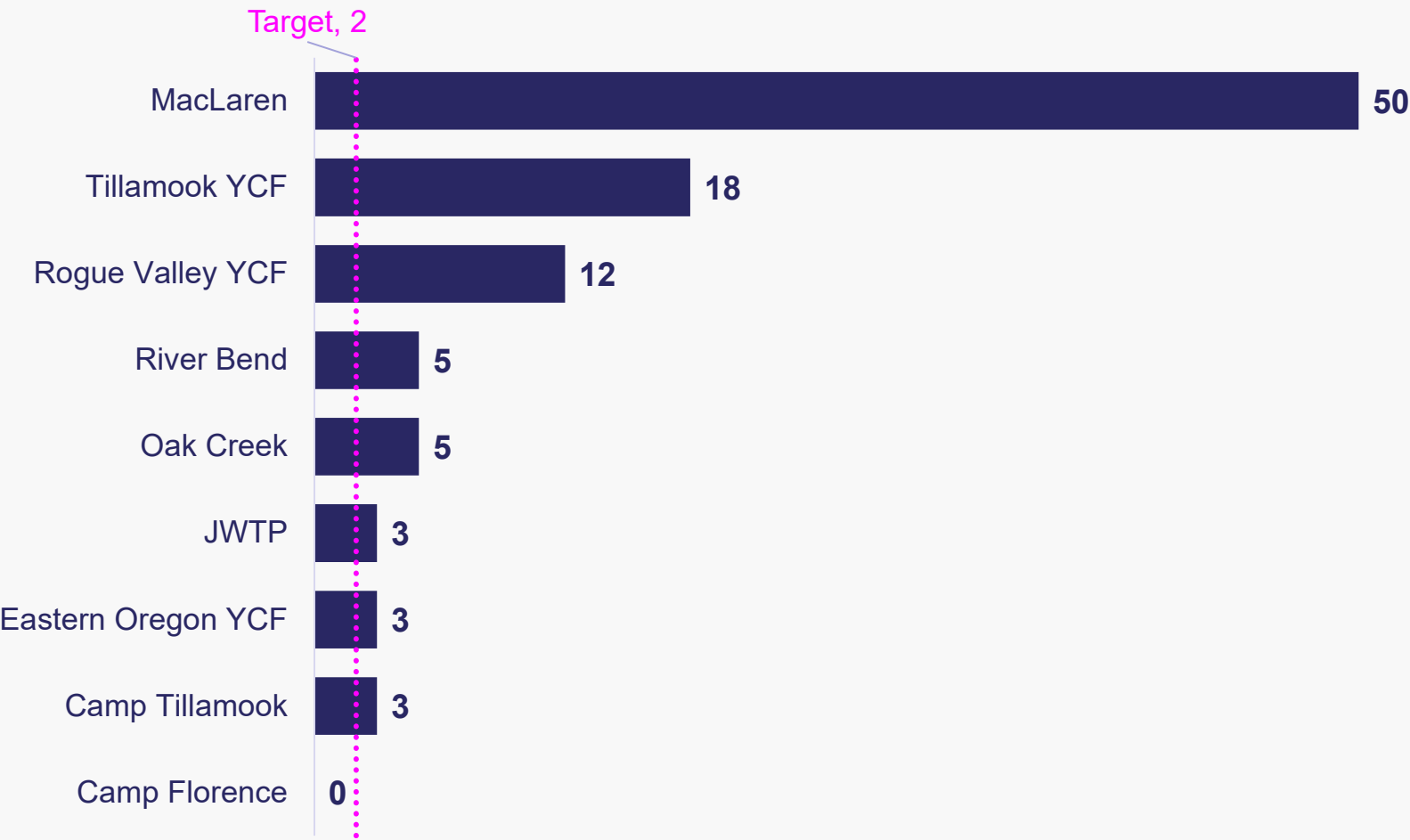
1. What is your facility's process for ensuring youth have immediate access to culturally-specific hygiene products?

PREA Walkthroughs by Facility

- II-A-3.0 Interactive Supervision of Youth
 - Walkthrough twice per month
 - Each weekday, each shift
- Tracked in Unit Logs
- Completed by LUM, OD, or CO

In May 2026, 88% of facilities met or exceeded requirement for PREA walkthroughs.

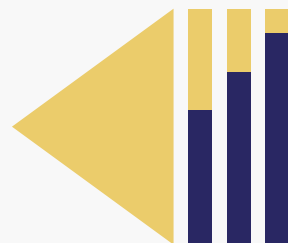
