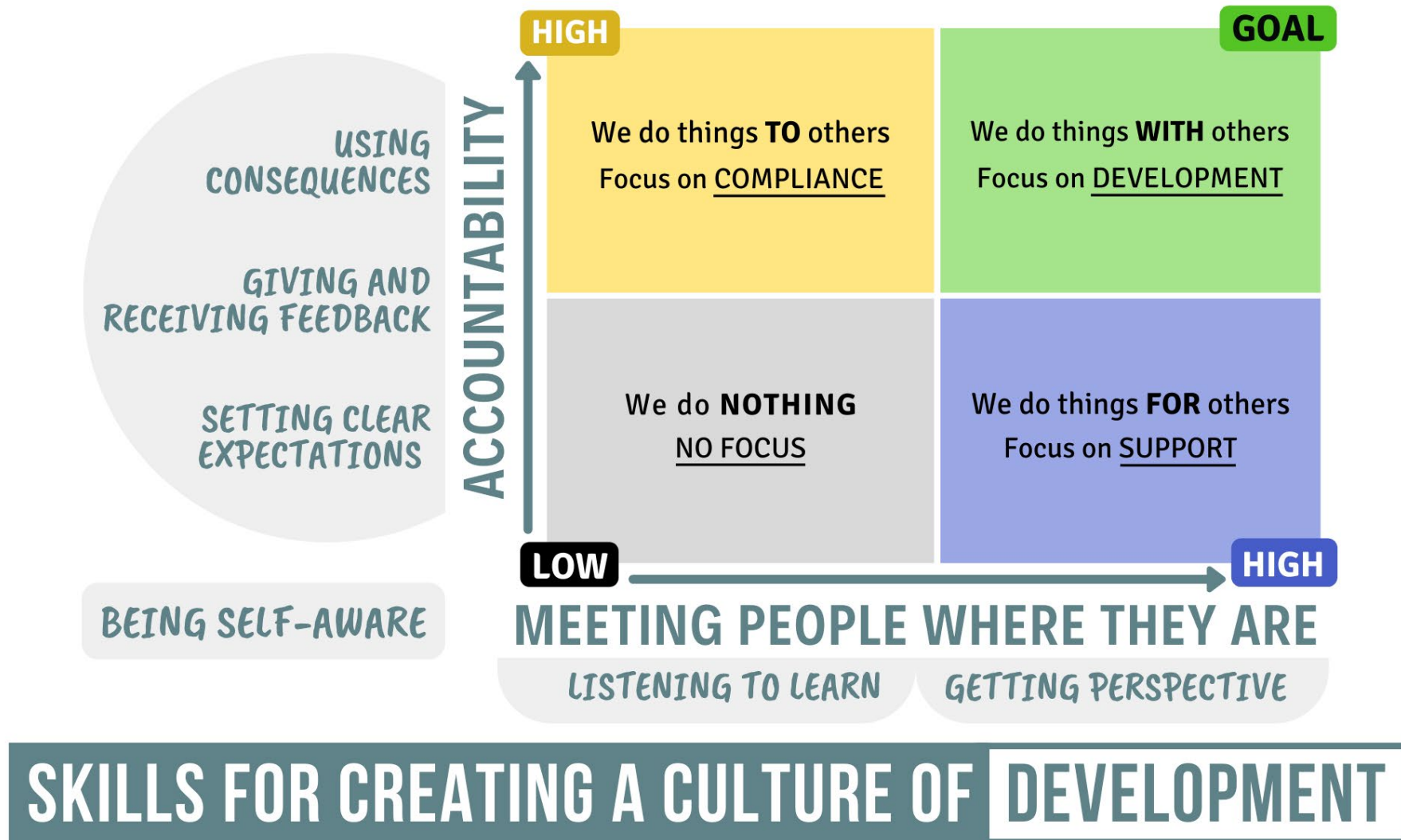

Definitions

Term	Definition
Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA)	The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) is federal law that supports prevention of sexual assault and rape within corrections systems and sets minimum standards for responding to allegations of sexual assault and sexual harassment.
PREA Coordinator	A full-time PREA coordinator oversees OYA’s work to comply with PREA across all nine OYA facilities. Each facility also has an on-site PREA compliance manager and Sexual Assault Resource and Response Coordinator.
Vulnerability to Victimization and Sexually Aggressive Behavior (VSAB) placement tool	The Vulnerability to Victimization and Sexually Aggressive Behavior (VSAB) placement tool is designed to determine a youth's vulnerability to sexual abuse or sexual harassment or to determine if there are indications that the youth is prone to sexually abusing other youth.
PREA Review Case Type	A tracking mechanism to track investigations that meet the definitions of sexual abuse or sexual harassment, retaliation monitoring, safety plans, and gather data requires for annual reporting.
PREA Documentation for VSAB Referral (DVR)	A form that tracks QMHP follow-ups when a youth discloses previously unknown victimization or perpetration during a VSAB.
PREA Compliance Report	An annual report that is published to OYA’s website. The report provides data on investigations and actions the agency and facilities have taken regarding compliance with the PREA standards.



What We Do

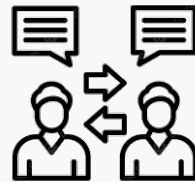
OYA has a zero-tolerance standard toward all forms of youth sexual abuse and sexual harassment.

The primary goal for PREA federally is to “eradicate sexual violence in all types of correctional facilities”.



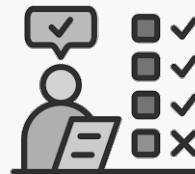

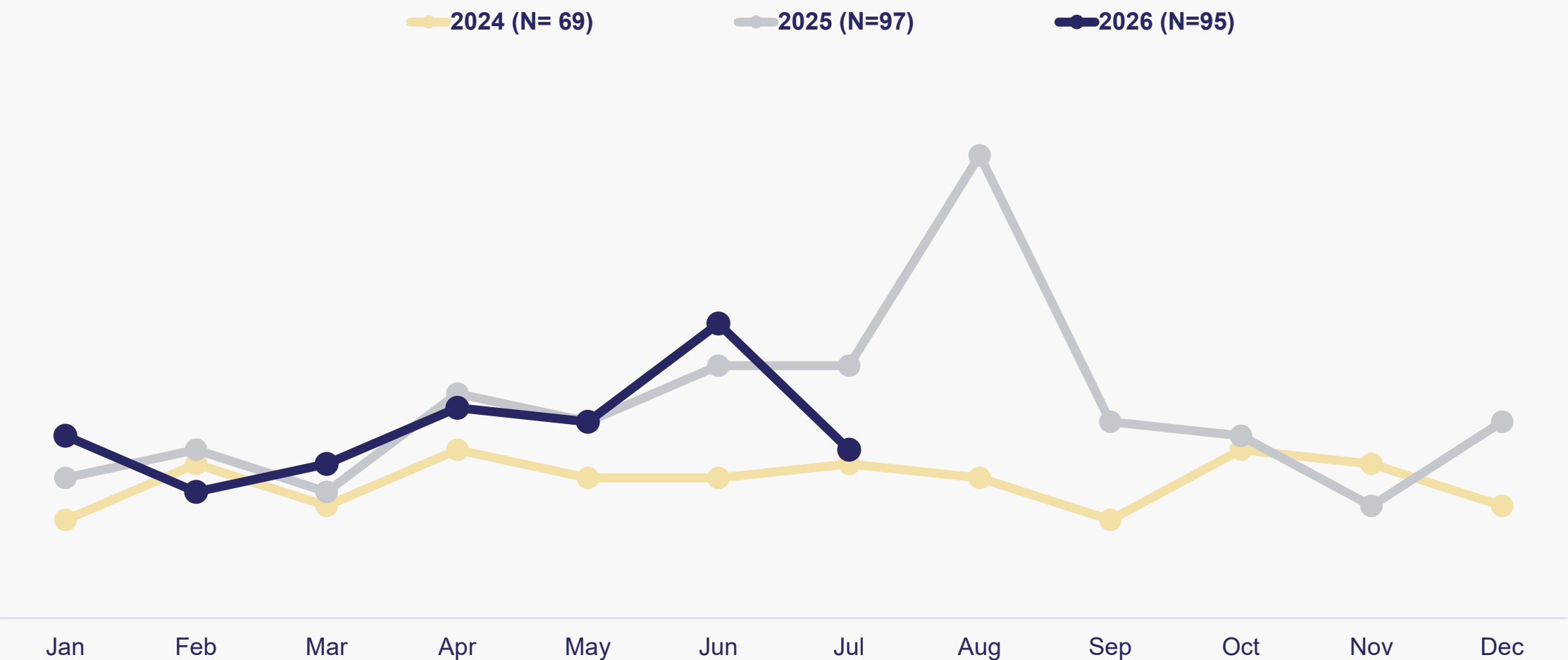

The number of investigations opened between Jan and June in 2026, look similar to the number of investigations opened between Jan and May of 2025 and in 2024.

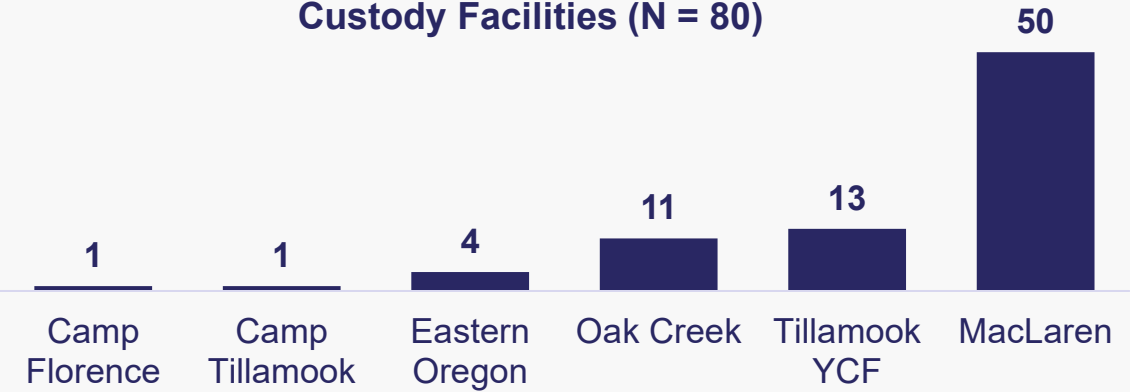




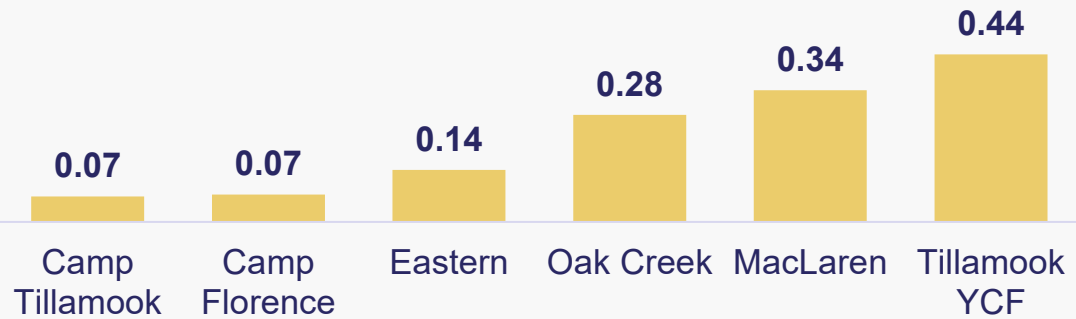
PREA Allegations Received

from 1/1/2026 to 7/31/2026

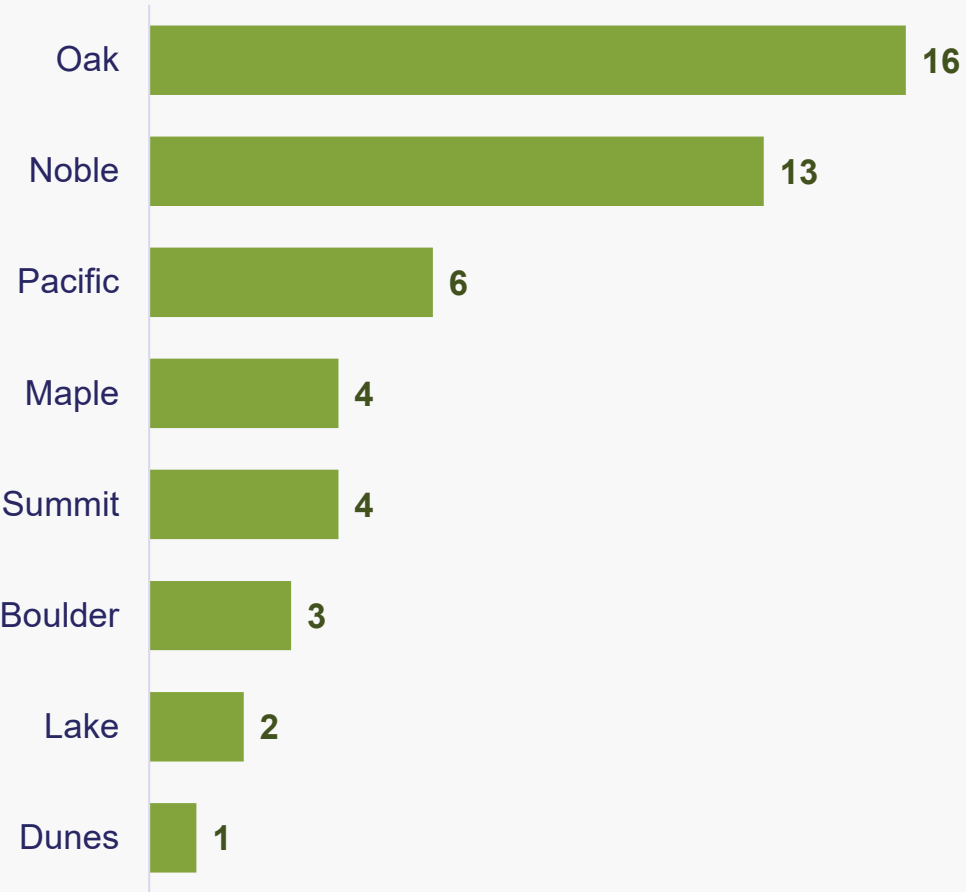
of PREA Allegations at Close Custody Facilities (N = 80)

Vulnerability to Victimization and Sexually Aggressive Behavior (VSAB) Placement Tool

Preliminary Exploration

Risk for Sexually Aggressive Behavior Domain

All questions in this domain have yes or no responses, where no = 0 points.

Does JJIS, the youth, or other sources indicate a prior history of sexually inappropriate behavior (regardless of adjudication/conviction status)?

Yes = 2 points

Does JJIS, the youth or other sources indicate a prior history of violence (non-sexual, regardless of adjudication/conviction status)?

Yes = 1 point

Does JJIS, the youth or other sources document or otherwise suggest prior sexual aggression or sexual victimization of others while in custody?

Yes = 6 points

Does any information suggest prior (non-sexual) aggression or (non-sexual) victimization of others while in custody?

Yes = 2 points

Normal Risk	0-1
Elevated Risk	2-3
High Risk	4-5
Extreme Risk	6+

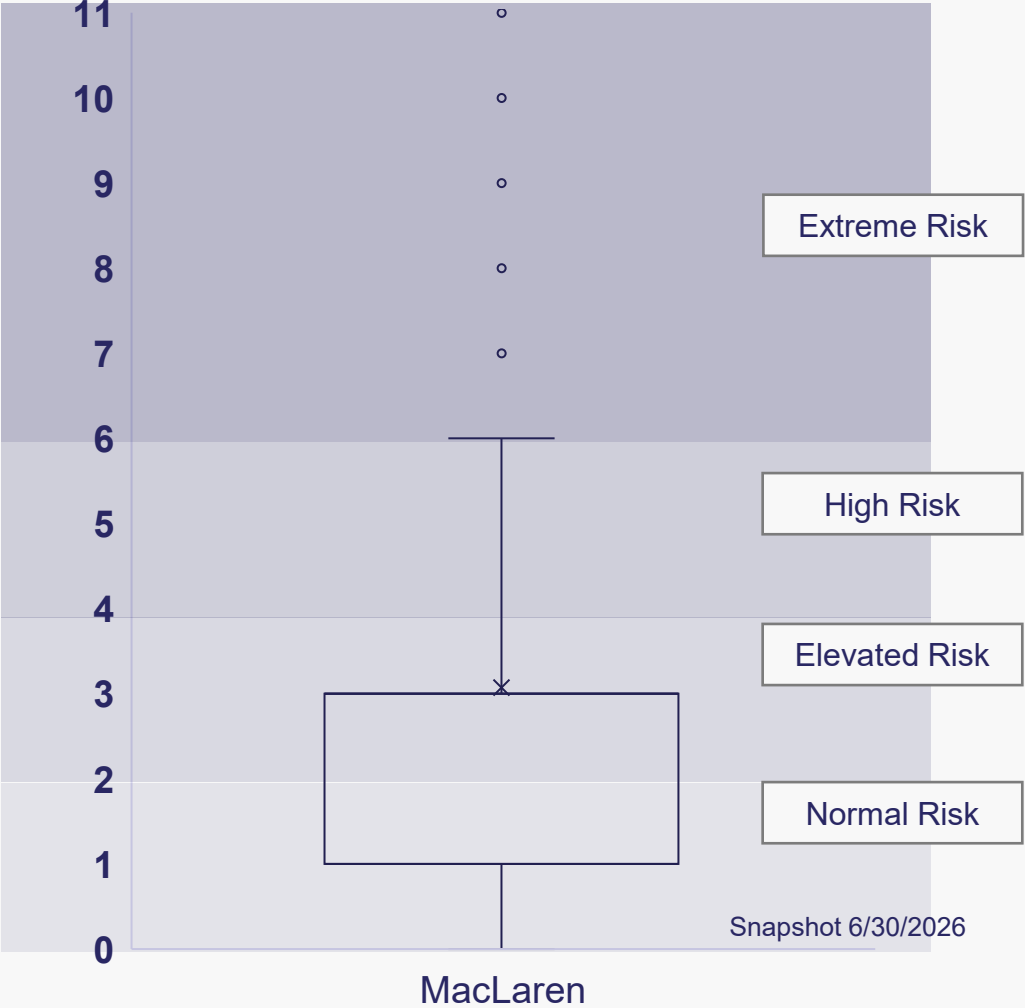

Preliminary results for first look into VSAB scores for youth at MacLaren on 6/30/2026

Risk for Sexually Aggressive Behavior
Domain Score Distribution - **MacLaren**



Risk Category on 6/30/2026	# of youth involved with one or more PREA reviews*	% of youth with one or more PREA reviews
Normal (N=45)	4	4/45=8%
Elevated (N=62)	5	5/62=8%
High (N=15)	2	2/15=13%
Extreme (N=14)	2	2/14=14%

*one youth named as subject does not have a VSAB available

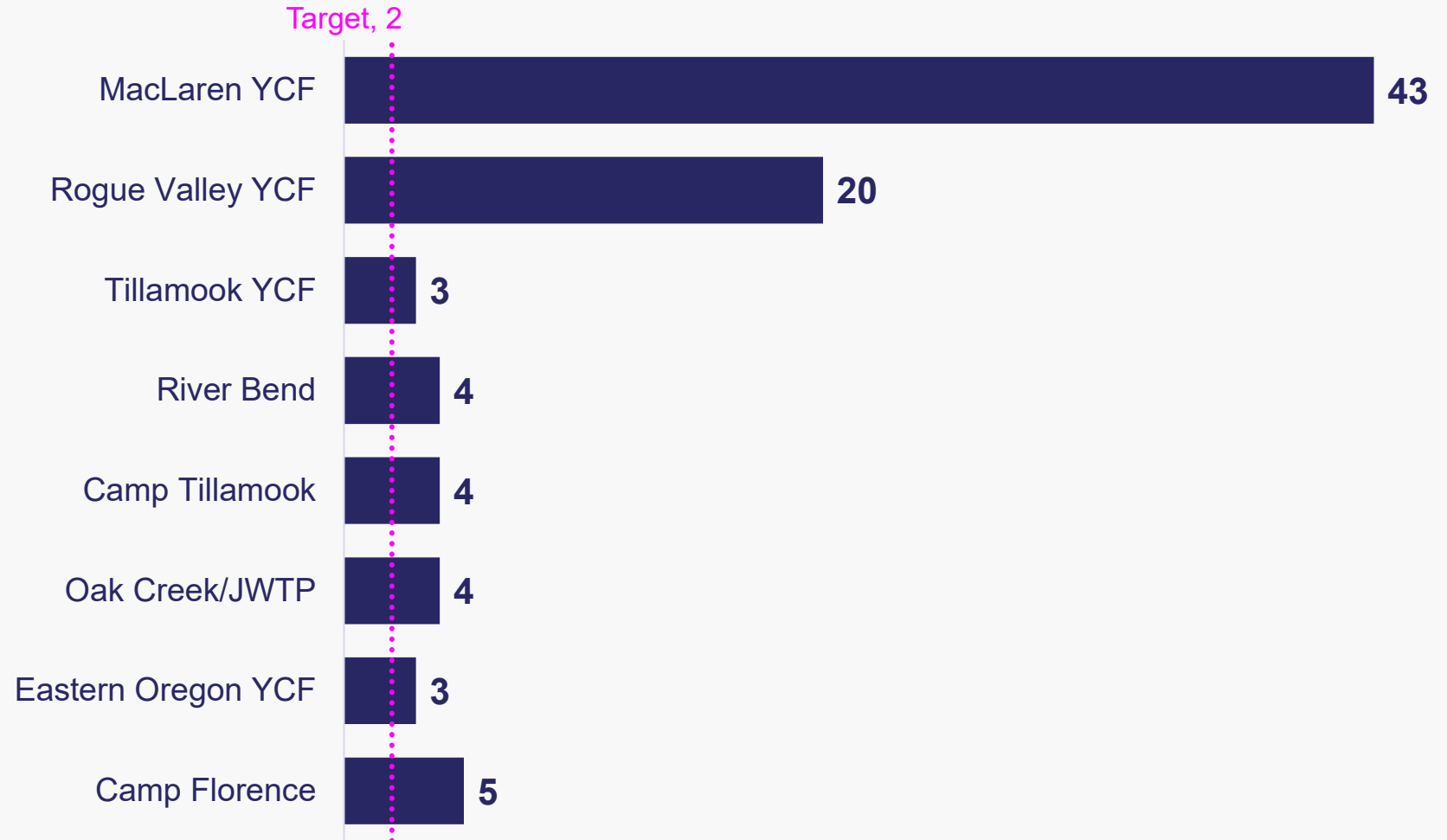
- **Sample:** 139 youth; 136 VSABs; 16 PREA reviews; 14 unique youth as subject (JUNE)
- **Results:** Stepwise increase within categories showing some preliminary evidence that tool is working to differentiate risk
- **Limitations:** Small N, snapshot, one facility
- **Next steps:** longer review period; investigate discovered patterns; include youths total history; explore additional outcomes (YIRs); explore by unit



PREA Walkthroughs by Facility

- II-A-3.0 Interactive Supervision of Youth
 - Walkthrough twice per month
 - Each weekday, each shift
- Tracked in Unit Logs
- Completed by LUM, OD, or CO

In July 2026, 100% of facilities met or exceeded requirement for PREA walkthroughs.

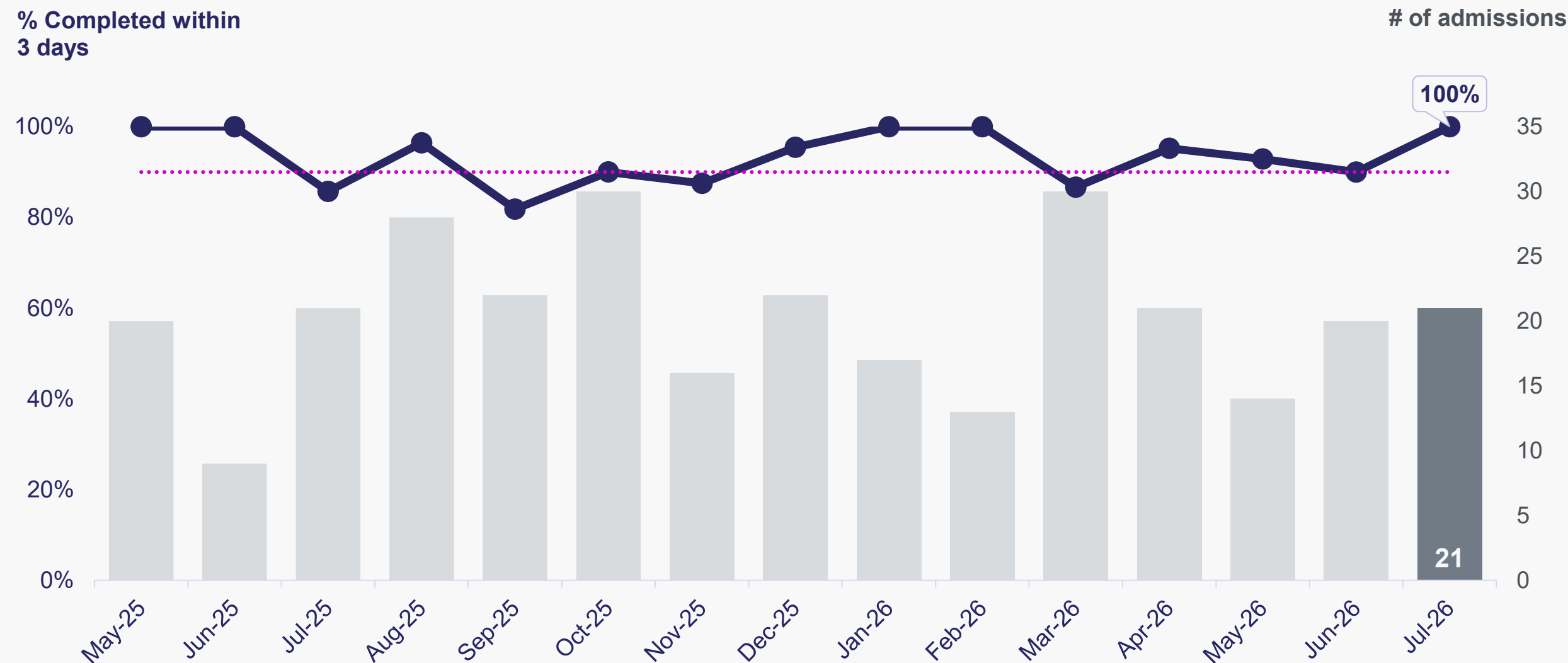

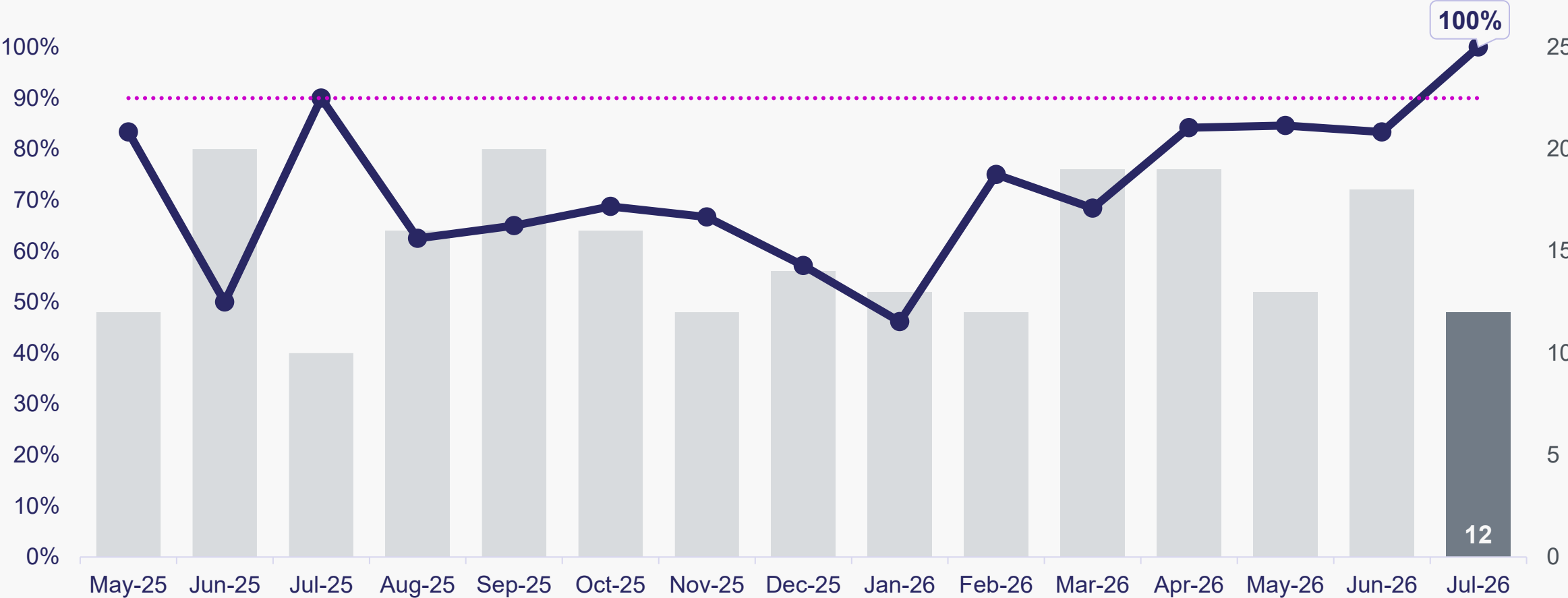

*Eastern Oregon was evacuated due to a weather/fire related emergency, therefore Eastern youth movement was not included in analysis.

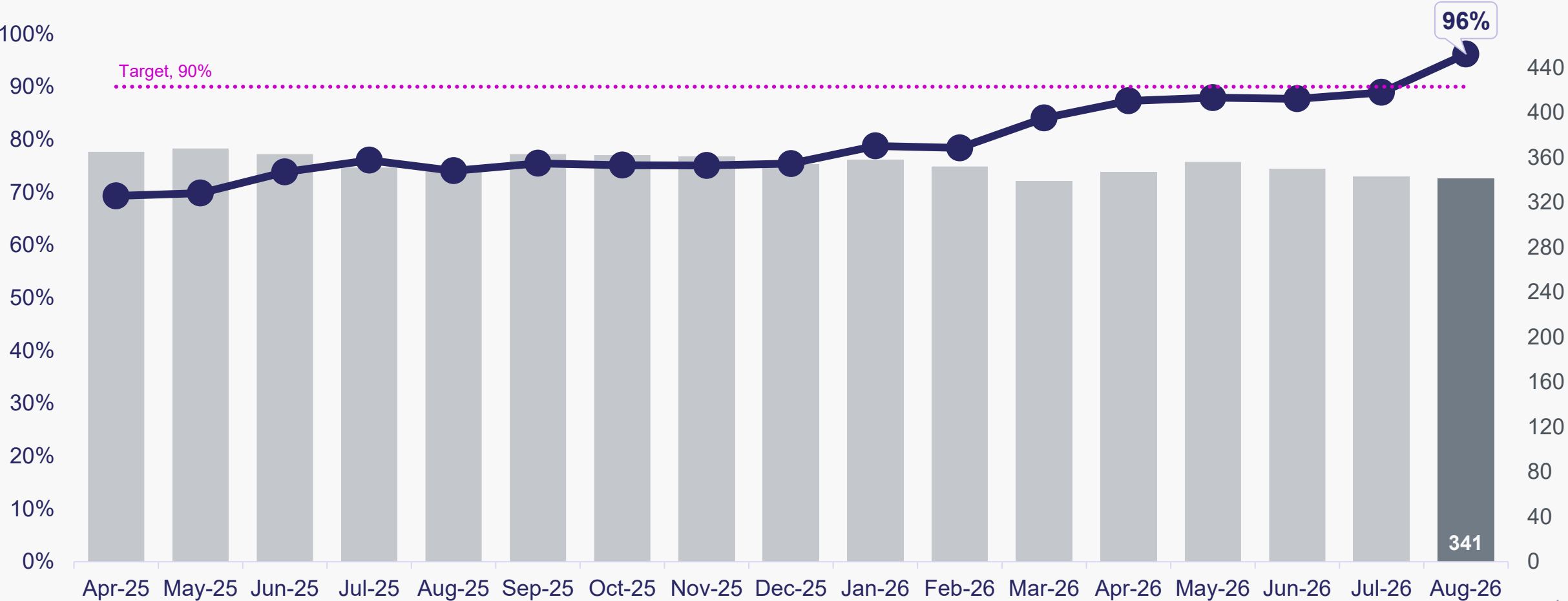
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96% of youth in OYA close custody had an **up-to date** VSAB on snapshot date (VSAB completed in last 365 days)

Improvement Efforts

- Training, tracking reports, Workday modules

Future Measures

- Retaliation monitoring – victim, witnesses, reporter should be tracked for retaliation for at least 90 days after a PREA review is opened
- Attorney and DHS notifications
- Timeliness of PREA reviews

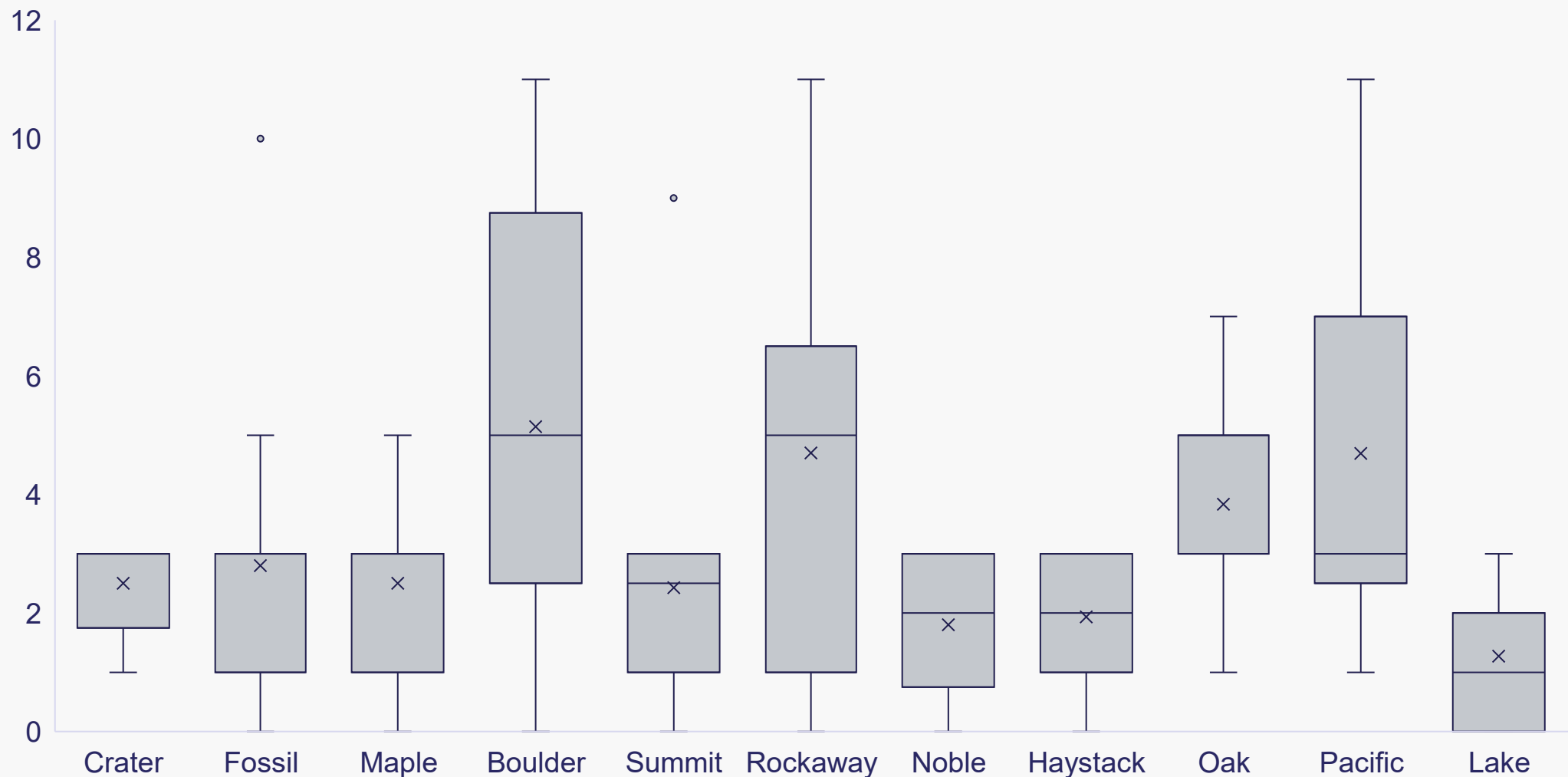

Domain Score Distributions by Unit**

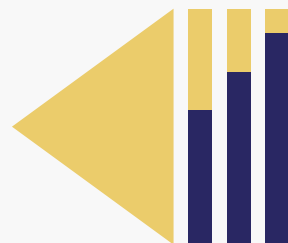
