# **Agenda**

### 1. Opening Remarks – Jana McLellan

- Jana McLellan acknowledged systemic failures within the PSO and emphasized OYA's commitment to transparency and trust-building.
- Emphasized need for both internal reforms and external accountability.

# 2. Peer Review Summary - Ken Jeske

Ken Jeske provided an overview of <u>his report</u>, conducted during a temporary assignment from DOC to OYA:

- PSO failed to maintain accurate data, timely investigations, and standard practices.
- Reporting metrics misrepresented the true status of complaints.
- Leadership and systems failed to flag or address dysfunction early.
- Jeske called for:
  - Clearer reporting structure
  - o Reinstated audit mechanisms
  - A steering committee of experts
  - Improved data systems
  - Weekly staff training (including trauma-informed interviews)
  - o Strengthened partnerships with DHS, OSP, and DA offices

# 3. Discussion on Task Force Scope and Role

- Judge Amy Holmes Hehn raised foundational concerns about the scope:
  - Should the group narrowly assess PSO improvements or examine broader systemic issues?
  - Called for a formal change management plan including goals, metrics, and accountability.
- Brendan Murphy and Christina McMahan echoed the need to understand root causes—not just PSO failure but the systemic factors contributing to high complaint volume.
- Rep. Rick Lewis requested clarification of the agency's expectations.
- McLellan responded: the group's primary focus is on the PSO, but broader input is welcome.

#### 4. Resource Needs

 Several members advocated for external technical assistance in change management.

- Christina McMahan was suggested as a potential connector for national TA resources.
- **K.O. Berger** encouraged the group to consider recommending specific consultants or resources rather than vague funding requests.

### 5. For Next Meeting

 Should the task force focus solely on PSO improvement as the "canary in the coal mine," or expand scope to address root causes systemwide?

# **Chat Feedback Highlights**

- Agreement with Judge Holmes Hehn that this is a systemwide issue, not just a PSO problem.
- Several members voiced alignment with broader-scope reform.
- Appreciation was expressed for Jeske's quick progress in restoring PSO function.
- Acknowledgment that youth and families must remain centered in this work.
- OYA reiterated it is open to live feedback and committed to biweekly tracker updates.
