Requirements for placement in an OYA practicum or internship

To be considered for a practicum or internship with OYA, candidates must:

- Be currently enrolled in a college- or university-sanctioned program
- Be eligible to earn college credit for their OYA activities
- Be at least 21 years old
- Complete an online application:bit.ly/oyavolunteer
- Complete and return all forms required by the volunteer program
- Pass a criminal records check
- Pass a check of the Oregon Child Abuse Registry
- Pass a national fingerprint check
- Receive excellent references
- Attend volunteer orientation and training
- Agree to follow OYA rules, policies, procedures, and staff directives



Opportunities Offered

OYA offers a limited number of bachelor's level practicum and master's level internship opportunities. Students can complete college and graduate school academic requirements by working alongside our staff as volunteer practicums or interns.

We offer a wide range of opportunities in the field of youth reformation. Interns and practicum students get the chance to gain practical experience in the areas of intercultural relations, mental health, addictions, academic support, and life enrichment groups.

Mirroring the real world, students must secure their own placement within OYA by contacting and meeting with prospective supervisors.

OYA staff are happy to steer students to the appropriate supervisor in their discipline who might be a good match.

Additionally, connections are often made by academic faculty and advisors who are familiar with OYA and its staff.
