To restrict a retiree who elected a survivorship increase option (2A, L2A, 3A, or L3A) from popping up to Option 1, complete the PERS Tier One/Tier Two Beneficiary Restrictions Due to Divorce or Dissolution of Registered Domestic Partnership form and include it as a referenced court order exhibit.

A retiree who elected a non-survivorship option (Refund Annuity, 15 Year Certain, or has remaining Lump-sum installments) and was married on their effective retirement date, will continue to have the same beneficiary as previously elected. **The retiree may change their retirement beneficiary, but only with the consent of their former spouse/RDP.** The former spouse/RDP consent requirement can be waived on the PERS Tier One/Tier Two Beneficiary Restrictions Due to Divorce or Dissolution of Registered Domestic Partnership form and included as a referenced court order exhibit.

- ☐ The retired member is awarded their **IAP account** and future retirement benefits, with no benefits payable to their former spouse/RDP.

Section D: IAP beneficiary information for non-retired and retired members

Note: If the member's spouse/RDP was the member's designated IAP beneficiary, upon the court ordered dissolution of their marriage/partnership, the former spouse/RDP shall be considered as predeceasing the member for the purpose of determining beneficiaries unless the member expressly designates the former spouse/RDP as beneficiary after the effective date of dissolution or the former spouse/RDP is required to be designated as a beneficiary as a provision of the dissolution.
