## Oregon Board of Pharmacy

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## NOTICE TO LICENSEES - FEE INCREASES EFFECTIVE 7/16/2025

The Oregon Board of Pharmacy requested fee increases for the 2025-2027 budget which received legislative approval during the 2025 Legislative Session.

As part of the Board's biennial budgeting process, required by statute, the Board determined it was facing a budgetary shortfall, largely because the Board had not increased fees in any substantive measure since 2011, with the last fee increase implemented in 2019. In response, the Board sought from the legislature the ability to increase fees by 40% for all licensees through the legislative fee increase process, HB 5028 2025. HB 5028 was approved by the legislature. HB 5028 was signed by the Governor and became effective on 7/1/2025, allowing the Board to increase fees by 40% for all licensees as of 7/1/2025.

Due to the effective date of the 2025-27 Legislatively Adopted Budget approval, the Board initiated [permanent rulemaking](#) to increase fees by 40% at the August board meeting. However, in order to ensure operations as normal, the Board was required to adopt a temporary rule to allow the agency to immediately increase the licensing fees as forecasted and delineated out in the adoption process of HB 5028. Failure to adopt the fee increases in a temporary rule would impair the Boards's ability to operate and protect the public.
