- You need to do the training! - You must update the taxonomy on your NPI. We have just gotten the final word on how to do that. Follow the instruction in the <u>NPI-taxonomy document</u> for details on adding the following taxonomy: 1835P0018X Pharmacist Clinician (PhC)/ Clinical Pharmacy Specialist
- **Check with your employer** for specifics about how your practice site might implement workflows, bill for the service, etc. There are many details about this service that will be specific to your company or location.
