Alison Bort, Ph.D. - Alison is a licensed psychologist in Oregon and received her training in psychology and law with a specialty in forensics in the Bay Area. Alison modeled her dissertation on the principles of therapeutic jurisprudence and resilience and has focused her career on improving outcomes for court-involved individuals. In 2012, Alison did what most Californians do, she moved with her family to Oregon. She has served as the Program Manager for Cascadia Behavioral Healthcare's PSRB program ever since. Alison has enjoyed co-developing a client-centered and risk savvy program with a focus on assisting program participants in strengthening their relationships, building their community, and finding creative solutions to the demands of everyday living. In her spare time she enjoys spending time with her family, taking hikes in the Gorge, and keeping up with her toddler.



Robert "Bob" Gebhardt, Jr. - Bob is the Deputy Superintendent of Oregon State Hospital. As the Deputy Superintendent, Bob is a member of the executive cabinet, and he provides administrative oversight for the hospital's four program directors. He is also the head of the Quality Management Department, which provides essential support services to direct-care staff and facilitates the organization's efforts to become a psychiatric hospital that "inspires hope, promotes safety and supports recovery for all."

Faith Morales, BA, DPSST - Faith is the forensic case manager with a specialization in Intellectual and/or Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) sex offender supervision. Faith works exclusively with I/DD offenders whether they are DOC cases, P&P, civilly committed, or PSRB. Faith is the civil commitment investigator for Lane County DD. Faith has been a CIT/Crisis Intervention Training instructor for Lane County law enforcement agencies for the past 7 years. Faith serves as the court liaison for individuals with I/DD in all courts and works closely with the DA and prosecutors in an effort to provide necessary and appropriate supports for individuals with I/DD. Faith is an expert witness in the area of I/DD sex offender supervision. She has been with Lane County Developmental Disabilities since October 1998. She attended and graduated the University of Oregon with a BA in sociology. Faith came to DD with a mental health background working with homeless offenders experiencing severe and persistent mental illness.



Sarah Roff, M.D. - Sarah Roff is the attending psychiatrist on the DBT unit at OSH. Her primary clinical interest lies in the area of personality disorders, particularly in the forensic context. Dr. Roff holds a PhD in Comparative Literature from Johns Hopkins and worked as an assistant professor of literature at Princeton before deciding to go to medical school. She obtained her MD from OHSU and completed her psychiatry residency at UW, where she trained in the year-long DBT Resident Training Program and did a study of gender and borderline personality disorder in Washington State prisons. She has been working at OSH for the past two years.



David J. Schuessler, LPC, SOTP - David received his Master's degree in Psychological Counseling from Southeast Missouri State University. He has worked providing sex offense specific treatment and assessment since 1999. He has practiced in Portland, Oregon for over ten years. He is the director of Innovative Counseling Enterprises. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor and Certified Sex Offender Treatment Provider.
