Public Involvement in Rule Drafting

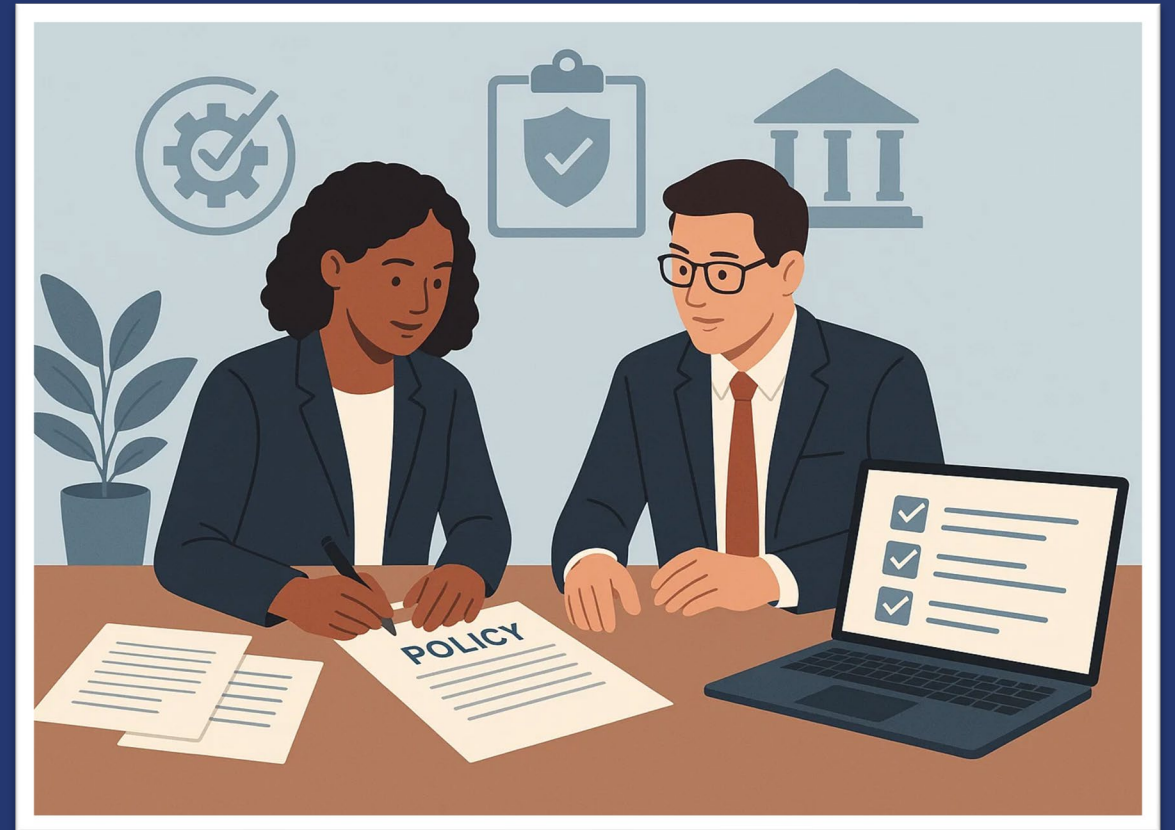
ORS 183.333

- ◆ Opportunities for public input:
 - ◆ Community Engagement
 - ◆ Rule Advisory Committees
 - ◆ Public Comment
- ◆ RAC members are appointed to assist agencies in drafting rules.



Purpose of the RAC

- ◆ RAC members represent the interests of persons and communities likely to be affected by the rule.
- ◆ Draft rule language,
- ◆ Fiscal impact, extent of impact on small businesses
- ◆ Effect on racial equity
- ◆ Oregon Public Meetings Law
ORS 192.610 to 192.705



Review of Issues

Issues Identified



Proximity

How to best coordinate/communicate victim residence information so that it is considered in the evaluation for CR and remains confidential



Modifications by Victim Request

Process by which a victim (through DOJ) may request a modification to CR (i.e., travel restriction or no contact provision that was unforeseen at time of hearing)



Reinstating Contact

Clarify Board's authority to reinstate contact
Adopt a process if victims wish to have contact with someone at OSH with a no-contact provision



Protecting Information

Protecting victim information in files and exhibits
FileCloud access
Parameters for victims' access



Notices

What information is required to be provided to victims under the current statute about an upcoming hearing

Access to communications devices and mail resulted in no-contact provision as a best practice.

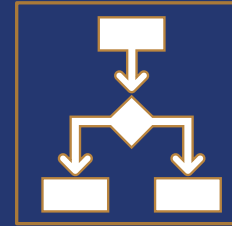
Some victims wish to reinstate contact but face limitations of the provision.

Available at both OSH or CR


