Related Training Providers: Chemeketa CC & Pacific University



Woodburn SD has a long history of successful and productive partnerships with Chemeketa CC and Pacific University. In 2013, Woodburn SD, Chemeketa, and Pacific formed the Woodburn Education Consortium, along with local community partners, to support early GYO efforts. As a result of this early collaboration and alignment of goals, both Chemeketa and Pacific established educational centers in downtown Woodburn, offering WSD staff and community members licensure-focused education classes, including an Associates Degree for Oregon Transfer in Elementary Education, a Bachelor Degree in Teaching and English Language Learning, and a Masters in Education degree.

This long and successful partnership is unique in our region and contributes to systems level alignment and collaboration, bringing unique strengths to the first teacher apprenticeship program in the state.

At Pacific University, we believe that a Registered Apprenticeship program has the potential to transform Oregon teacher workforce development by making high quality teacher preparation accessible to all Oregon communities and citizens.
