7	On June 6, 2018, the Teacher Stand	lards and	l Practices Commission	
8	(Commission) received a report from the Clackamas Education Service District (District)			
9	indicating Mark R. Binder (Binder) may ha	ve comn	nitted an act of gross neglect of duty	
10	and/or gross unfitness, specifically, that Binder was under the influence of alcohol at his			
11	assigned place of duty.			
12	After review of the matters alleged, Binder and the Commission agree that their			
13	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to			
14	certain facts, the imposition of a public reprimand, and a two (2) year period of			
15	probation.			
16	This Order sets forth the facts upon	which th	ne parties have agreed and the	
17	sanction to be imposed. Binder stipulates t	that there	e are sufficient facts contained in the	
18	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set			
19	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Binder waives the right to a hearing to			
20	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.			
21	By signing below, Binder acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to			
22	the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights a hearing to contest the findings			
23	of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such			
24	rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise	e challen	ge this Stipulation of Facts and Final	
25	Order of Public Reprimand and Probation	(Stipulat	ion and Final Order); (ii) this	
26	Stipulation and Final Order is a public docu	ıment ar	nd disclosed to the public upon	
27	request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipul	ation and	d Final Order is contingent upon and

the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

1. The Commission has licensed Binder since July 29, 1986. Binder holds a Professional Teaching License, with an endorsement in Special Education: Generalist (PK-12), valid from February 11, 2016, through February 10, 2021. During all relevant times, Binder was employed by the Clackamas Education Service District (CESD) and had been working there since 1989. In Binder's most recent position with CESD, he was serving in a TOSA position working to assist Life Enrichment Education Program (LEEP) teachers across the program and sometimes providing internal substitute teaching coverage for absent LEEP teachers. Prior to that, Binder served as a special education teacher for approximately 29 years at CESD.

2. On June 6, 2018, the Commission received a report from the CESD indicating Binder may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty. Specifically, that on June 6, 2018, Binder reported for duty under the influence of alcohol.

3. Investigation determined that on June 6, 2018, Binder was providing coverage at Ogden Middle School. A classroom Educational Assistants (EA) reported Binder appeared overly emotional for the circumstances and that he smelled of alcohol. The EA asked Binder if he had been drinking. Binder acknowledged having one glass of wine the previous evening. Binder requested a second opinion from another EA, and the other EA agreed that Binder smelled of alcohol. Binder immediately contacted his supervisor and agreed to take a blood alcohol test. Binder was given a breathalyzer test at 10:22 AM, and another test fifteen (15) minutes later. Binder's first test was positive for alcohol at a level of 0.074 BAC, and his second test was positive for alcohol at a level of 0.065 BAC. Binder was immediately placed on administrative leave.

4. Binder acknowledged drinking wine with dinner the previous night, but he did not recall drinking an amount that would have caused those BAC levels the

following morning. Binder agreed that he must have had more to drink than he recalls.

4	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and		
5	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a public reprimand upon Mark R.		
6	Binder's Oregon educator license.		
7	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of two (2) years of probation		
8	upon Binder's licensure to commence from the date this order is signed by the		
9	Commission and subject to the following condition:		
10	1. Binder shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance		
11	of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division
