9	On September 24, 2021, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission	
10	(Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Derrick J. Batliner,	
11	(Batliner) in which the Commission charged him with Gross Neglect of Duty and /or $$	
12	Gross Unfitness. The Notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail	
13	Receipt 7021 0350 000 8183 7865 to the address on file with the Commission. The	
14	Notice designated the Commission file as the record for purposes of proving a prima	
15	facie case. The Certified Mail receipt was returned to the Commission signed. The	
16	regular first class mail was not returned to the Commission, and assumed delivered. T	'he
17	Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated September 24, 2021, and signed by Anthony	
18	Rosilez, Executive Director, stated:

29	On October 7, 2021 TSPC received a request for a formal hearing from Batliner	's
30	attorney, John Bishop (Bishop). A hearing on this matter was scheduled for January 1	.8-
31	19, 2023. In early January, 2023, TSPC and the Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ)	
32	received confirmation from Bishop that he was no longer representing Batliner. On	
33	January 13, 2023 Batliner sent an email to TSPC, the DOJ, and the ALJ assigned to he	ear
34	the case indicating that he did not want to proceed with a hearing and that he would n	ot
35	appear for the hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds Batliner to be in default and	
36	enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final order, based on the	
37	files and records of the Commission concerning this matter.

FINDING OF FACT

- The Commission has licensed Batliner since June 9, 2006. Batliner currently
 holds a Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Elementary:
 Advanced Mathematics (PK-12) and Legacy Middle Level (PK-12), valid from
 March 21, 2021 through March 20, 2026. During all relevant times, Batliner was
 - employed by the Portland Public School District (PPS).
- 2. On May 7, 2021, the Commission received a School District Misconduct Report from PPS. The report alleged that Derrick Batliner, a mathematics teacher at Jefferson High School (JHS), engaged in a sexual/romantic relationship with an 18-year-old female student, SK.
- 3. A review of PPS investigative documents indicate that on March 18, 2020,
 Batliner initiated personal contact with SK by emailing her school email account
 from his school email account. In that email, Batliner told SK:
 - "I don't know what is going to happen going forward with respect to school, but I am going to miss seeing you every day until it starts up again. You are without a doubt, probably, maybe, kind of, my favorite student sorta ever."
 - PPS interviewed SK, and she provided testimony and evidence that Batliner had begun giving her special attention, rubbing her back, and grooming her since she was 15 years old. She reported that Batliner would often "caress her on the back" and spend time alone in his classroom with her discussing personal matters. SK reported that Batliner "groomed" her until she was 18 years old. She reported that Batliner would frequently make inappropriate comments/compliments about her body and her physical appearance. She reported that shortly after she turned 18 Batliner asked her to meet up for lunch, and she and Batliner began communicating on a regular basis over text message and Snapchat. SK reported that Batliner frequently engaged in highly sexualized conversation with her and would send each other nude photos. SK reported that Batliner would also engage

in phone sex and FaceTime videos with one another and would masturbate on camera (stroking his penis in front of her). SK reported that she met up with Batliner several times after she turned 18, however stated that he had told her that he was "too nervous" to kiss her or touch her. PPS substantiated the allegations based on documentary evidence and direct testimony of SK. In lieu of termination, Batliner resigned his position with the district on June 21, 2021 via a Separation Agreement. No criminal charges were filed in this matter due to SK being 18 years old.

4. TSPC investigative staff attempted to interview Batliner regarding this matter, but he declined to participate. Through his attorney, Batliner provided the following statement to TSPC:

"I am in receipt of the TSPC's letter requesting an interview with me. I have discussed the interview with my attorney, and I am declining to interview with regard to the investigation of the alleged conduct in connection with my Oregon teaching license. I understand that declining to interview carries potential consequences. Still, given my particular circumstances, I do not wish to be interviewed. I am writing this letter to document this decision for my TSPC investigation file and having been advised on this decision by my attorney in this matter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(b) (Refrain from exploiting professional relationships with any student for personal gain, or in support of persons or issues), OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(A) (Not demonstrating or expressing professionally inappropriate interest in a student's personal life), and OAR 584-

1	020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in
2	conduct and conversations at all times); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(w) (Failure of
3	an educator to cooperate with an investigation conducted by the Teacher
4	Standards and Practices Commission under ORS 339.370 to ORS 339.400 and ORS
5	342.176, except subject to the exercise of any legal right or privilege).

7	
8	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
9	ORS 342.175.
10	FINAL ORDER
11	The Commission hereby revokes Batliner's Oregon teaching license. Batliner will
12	be eligible to apply for reinstatement after a period of one (1) year.
