1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 4 In the Matter of the DEFAULT ORDER OF 5 Educator License of) SUSPENSION OF RIGHT TO 6) NOHEMI ESTRADA-SURO APPLY FOR AN EDUCATOR 7 LICENSE AND PROBATION 8 9 On November 10, 2022, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 10 (Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Nohemi Estrada-Suro 11 (Estrada-Suro) in which the Commission charged her with Gross Neglect of Duty. On 12 November 10, 2022, the Notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail 13 Receipt 7021 0350 0000 8183 7537 to the address on file with the Commission. The 14 Notice designated the Commission file as the record for purposes of proving a prima facie 15 case. The Certified Mail return receipt was signed and returned to the Commission on 16 November 29, 2022. The regular, First-Class Mail was not returned and assumed to have 17 been delivered. The Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated November 10, 2022, and 18 signed by Anthony Rosilez, Executive Director, stated: 19 20 "IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY 21 PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED 22 UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR 23 REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING. WITHDRAW YOUR REQUEST FOR A HEARING, FAIL TO APPEAR AT A 24 25 HEARING, OR NOTIFY THE COMMISSION THAT YOU WILL NOT APPEAR AT 26 A HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT 27 WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR 28 LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE." 29 Estrada-Sura did not request a hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds Estrada-Suro 30 to be in default and enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final 31 32 order, based on the files and records of the Commission concerning this matter. 33 34 FINDINGS OF FACT 1. Nohemi Estrada-Suro has been licensed by the Commission since August 8, 1992. 35 36 Estrada-Suro held a Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in English 37 for Speakers of Other Languages (PK-12) and World Language-Spanish (PK-12) valid from November 15, 2016, through August 9, 2021. During all relevant times, 38

1		Estrada-Suro was employed as a probationary teacher by the Tillamook School
2		District (TSD). On June 14, 2021, Estrada-Suro attempted to submit an application
3		to renew her Professional Teaching License with the Commission. Estrada-Suro's
4		payment was declined, and the application was not processed and closed.
5		
6	2.	On November 18, 2021, the Commission received a report from the TSD indicating
7		Estrada-Suro may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty
8		and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, the report alleged while at Tillamook High
9		School, Estrada-Suro used inappropriate language when communicating with
10		students; failed to demonstrate adequate professional performance; and willfully
11		defied an administrator.
12		
13	3.	Investigation determined that on unspecified dates in September and October
14		2021, Estrada-Suro was involved in the following interactions with students:
15		
16		 Estrada-Suro denied a female student to go to the restroom when the
17		student was menstruating which resulted in the student's clothing
18		being stained.
19		 Estrada-Suro told a student, in front of other students, that his
20		school picture was ugly, and he should get a new picture.
21		 Estrada-Suro commented to the class that one of their classmates did
22		a poor job on a class presentation.
23		 Estrada-Suro prevented a student from entering her classroom after
24		the class period had begun.
25		 Estrada-Suro told a student, who mispronounced a word in class,
26		that the student needed to go to "retard beach".
27		• Estrada-Suro told another student, who was seeking an assignment,
28		that the student could got to "retard beach" with the other student.
29		Several students observed Estrada-Suro tug on a student's hair to

direct their attention to an assignment.

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4. Investigation determined in early October 2021, Estrada-Suro failed to assist a student in obtaining and grading assignments when the student, previously on COVID quarantine, returned to school. The school principal had to escort the student to Estrada-Suro to obtain assignments and correct the gradebook. The principal reported the student had attempted to correct the matter approximately six times before the principal was notified. On October 8, 2021, Estrada-Suro left work an hour early without approval from her supervisor. On October 20, 2021, during parent/teacher conferences, Estrada-Suro requested to leave early. Estrada-Suro's request was denied by the principal, and Estrada-Suro disregarded the denial and left an hour early. On November 4, 2021, Estrada-Suro was directed to return to work the following day for a new assignment with the district. On November 5, 2021, Estrada-Suro failed to report for work.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Nohemi Estrada-Suro's conduct as described in section three (3) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (*Skill in the supervision of students*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(a) (*Establish and maintain classroom management that is conducive to learning*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (*Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*), and OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (*Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents and other patrons*); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (*Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times*).

Nohemi Estrada-Suro's conduct as described in section four (4) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(c) (Using and maintaining student records as required by federal and state law and district policies and procedures), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(a) (Establish and maintain class management that is conducive to learning), and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations).

1	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS		
2	342.175.

4	FINAL ORDER		
5	The Commission hereby suspends Nohemi Estrada-Suro's right to apply for an		
6	Oregon educator license for a period of six (6) months, to begin upon the date this order		
7	is signed and in effect.		
8	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a three (3) year period of probation upon		
9	Estrada-Suro upon reinstatement of her Oregon educator license and subject to the		
10	following terms and conditions:		
11	1. Estrada-Suro shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical		
12	Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter		
13	584, Division 020.		
14	2. Prior to application, Estrada-Suro shall complete a Commission approved		
15	course on communication skills and submit proof to the Commission of		
16	successful completion of the training.		
17	Violation of any term or condition of probation shall constitute an independent		
18	basis for the Commission to revoke Estrada-Suro's Oregon educator license or otherwise		
19	impose discipline, after first providing Estrada-Suro with notice of opportunity for		
20	hearing.
