1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 4 **Educator License of**) FINAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION 5) AND PROBATION SHANE E. HEDRICK 6 7 8 9 10 On February 21, 2023, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 11 (Commission) received an Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) cross report. 12 The report alleged possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed educator, 13 Shane E Hedrick (Hedrick). 14 After review of the matters alleged, Hedrick and the Commission agree that their 15 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a suspension of his Oregon Educator License and a 16 17 period of probation and/or training. 18 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 19 sanction to be imposed. Hedrick stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set 20 21 forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Hedrick waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 22 By signing below, Hedrick acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to 23 the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest 24 the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally 25 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of 26 27 Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon 28 request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and 29 subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not 30 approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Hedrick nor the 31 Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and 32 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or 33 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of 34 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has 35

been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has

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consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully 1 advised with regard to his rights thereto or waives any and all rights to consult with an 2 3 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of 4 the Stipulated Final Order below. 5 6 STIPULATION OF FACTS 7 8 The Commission has licensed Hedrick since March 16, 1993. Hedrick holds a 9 Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Social Studies (PK-12) 10 and Physical Education (PK-12); valid from December 13, 2022, to February 11 15, 2028. During all relevant times, Hedrick was employed by the Oregon City 12 School District (OCSD). 13 14 2. On February 21, 2023, TSPC received a DHS cross report alleging that 15 Hedrick, a former educator at Oregon City High School had engaged in 16 professional misconduct. The report alleged that during the 2021-2022 school 17 year, Hedrick made inappropriate comments to female students, engaged in 18 unwanted physical contact with students, and provided his personal cell 19 phone number to them. Additionally, it was further alleged that Hedrick 20 grabbed a student by his sweatshirt and forcibly dragged him into an office, 21 made derogatory statements, and yelled in his face. The report also alleged that Hedrick had a confrontational interaction with a student athlete while he 22 23 was working in the capacity of football coach for the Oregon City High School 24 (OCHS). Finally, the report alleged that Hedrick yelled at a student in the 25 presence of other coaching staff and kicked a student in the ribs while he was doing push-ups which Hedrick had required him do as a form of punishment. 26 27 3. According to district documents and the TSPC investigation, the following 28 events related to the above boundary allegations were substantiated: 29 30 On December 15, 2021, during a district interview, Hedrick admitted to 31 frequently share his personal cell phone number with students as a way of 32

- 1 showing support for them.
- In January of 2023, Hedrick rubbed the shoulders of student KC for 15-30
 seconds, which made her feel uncomfortable. This event was witnessed by
 multiple student witnesses.

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4. According to district documents and the TSPC investigation, the following
 events related to the physical abuse allegations were substantiated:

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- In the Fall of 2022, Hedrick had an altercation with a student athlete on
 the Oregon City High School (OCHS) football team. The student was
 identified as student LO.
- The altercation reportedly occurred when Hedrick directed LO to his office
 after LO failed to listen to his direction and attempted to leave practice
 early.
- In Hedrick's office, Hedrick proceeded to stand over LO, who was seated
 in a chair, and yell at LO, coming within six to twelve inches of LO's face
 with spit coming from his mouth.
- It was reported that Hedrick used the "F-word" while yelling in LO's face.
- Hedrick admitted to yelling at LO with his face inches from LO's face but
 denied making the statement "touch me so I can rip your fucking head
 off".
- Witnesses to the incident report Hedrick got within six to twelve inches of
 LO's face.
- Witnesses to the incident did not recall verbatim what Hedrick said to LO
 but was along the lines of "I dare you to touch me."
- In December of 2022, Hedrick had an altercation with student JM, who
 was being disruptive in the OCHS locker room.
- The altercation occurred when Hedrick used both hands to grab for JM's
 backpack strap by JM's shirt collar and lifted JM off the ground to where
 only JM's toes were touching the floor and physically moved JM nine to
 ten feet to Hedrick's office.

Hedrick proceeded to "shove" JM into a chair located in his office and yell 1 at JM within inches of JM's face. 2 Hedrick reported that he again grabbed JM by the backpack strap and 3 escorted him back to the chair when JM attempted to leave. 4 While Hedrick was escorting JM, he admitted to telling JM to "stop being 5 6 a jack wagon." 7 Hedrick admitted to TSPC investigators that he had raised his voice at JM and physically moved JM to his office but denied shoving JM into the 8 9 chair. 10 11 5. Hedrick resigned from the OCSD on February 7, 2023. 12 13 14 IT IS SO STIPULATED Date 5/1/2025 15 16 Shane E. Hedrick 17 18 Cristina Edgar, Profession Practices Director 19 20 Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 21 22 CONCLUSION OF LAW 23 The conduct described above in section three (3) constitutes gross neglect of duty 24 in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-25 020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the 26 supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth and dignity of all 27 28 persons and respect for each individual), and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it

incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with

students in conduct and conversations at all times).

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1	The conduct described in section four (4) above constitutes gross neglect of
2	duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it
3	incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-
4	020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e)
5	(Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), and 584-020-
6	0040(4)(d)(Unreasonable physical force against students, fellow employees, or
7	visitors to the school, except as permitted under ORS 339.250).
8	ORDER
9	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
10	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a thirty (30) day suspension of Hedrick's
11	Oregon Educator License as well as four (4) years period of probation. The period of
12	probation will become effective on the date of adoption of this stipulated order. The period
13	of probation is subject to the following conditions:
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15	1. Hedrick will complete a certified Anger Management training within the first six
16	(6) months of probation.
17	2. Hedrick shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance
18	of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division
19	020.
