8	On February 23, 2023, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission				
9	(Commission) received a report from the Central School District (District) alleging				
10	Benjamin Hynes-Stone (Hynes-Stone) may have committed an act of gross neglect of				
11	duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, the district reported that on January 30, 2023,				
12	Hynes-Stone brought an alcoholic beverage onto campus during a professional				
13	development day and consumed the beverage in his classroom.				
14	After review of the matters alleged, Hynes-Stone and the Commission agree that				
15	their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a				
16	stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a sixty (60) day Suspension and a two				
17	(2) year period of Probation with conditions of his Oregon Teaching License.				
18	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the				
19	sanction to be imposed. Hynes-Stone stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained				
20	in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of				
21	law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Hynes-Stone waives the right to a				
22	hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.				
23	By signing below, Hynes-Stone acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and				
24	agrees to the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing				
25	to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully				
26	and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this				
27	Stipulation of Facts and Final Order	of Suspensi	on and Probation (Stipulation and Final		
28	Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Fina	l Order is a	public document and disclosed to the		
29	public upon request by the Commiss	ion; (iii) thi	s Stipulation and Final Order is		
30	contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the				
31	Commission does not approve and a	dopt this St	ipulation and Final Order, then neither		
32	Hynes-Stone nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read				
33	this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily,				
34	without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to				
35	issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or				
36	representation has been made to ind	luce him to	sign this Stipulation and Final Order;		

and (vii) he has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

- The Commission has licensed Hynes-Stone since July 2, 2013. Hynes-Stone holds
 a Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in English Language Arts
 (PK-12) and Legacy Middle Level (PK-12), valid from December 20, 2019,
 through May 11, 2025. During all relevant times, Hynes-Stone was employed by
 the Central School District (CSD).
- 2. On February 23, 2023, the Commission received a misconduct report from the CSD alleging Hynes-Stone committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, the CSD reported that during the workday on January 27, 2023, Hynes-Stone consumed alcohol while participating in professional development at Western Oregon University (WOU). The CSD also reported that during a professional development day on January 30, 2023, Hynes-Stone purchased an alcoholic beverage while off campus, then returned to the Central High School campus in possession of the beverage and consumed the beverage in his classroom.
- 3. Investigation found that on January 27, 2023, Hynes-Stone was participating in a district-sponsored professional development course at WOU which included other CSD staff. During the lunch break, Hynes-Stone and a colleague left the WOU campus and Hynes-Stone consumed one or two alcoholic beverages with his meal and then returned to the WOU campus for the remainder of the course.
- 4. Investigation found that on January 30, 2023, a day of scheduled professional development for some CSD educators, Hynes-Stone and a student teacher left the Central High School campus during their lunch break to go to a nearby grocery store. At the grocery store, Hynes-Stone purchased a canned alcoholic beverage. Hynes-Stone and the student teacher returned to Central High School, Hynes-Stone placed the beverage into the back pocket of the pants he was wearing and proceeded to his classroom. Hynes-Stone consumed the alcoholic beverage in his classroom in violation of the CSD policy on a drug-free workplace.

1 5. Investigation found the CSD issued Hynes-Stone a letter of reprimand for the two 2 alcohol related incidents and offered him a "last chance" agreement which had 3 continuing conditions. 6. Hynes-Stone fulfilled the requirements of the agreement and remained teaching at 4 5 Central High School until September 2024, when he resigned and established new 6 employment. 7 8 IT IS SO STIPULATED: 9 10 11 12 Benjamin Hynes-Stone 13 14 15 Cristina Edgar, Director of Professional Practices 16 Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 17 18 19 CONCLUSION OF LAW 20 Benjamin Hynes-Stone's conduct as described in sections three (3) and four (4) 21 above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-22 0040(4)(g) (Appearing on duty or at any district sponsored activity while under the 23 influence of alcohol, marijuana, or any controlled substance); and OAR 584-020-24 0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment) and 25 OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations). 26 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon 27 ORS 342.175. 28 29 ORDER 30 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and 31 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a sixty (60) day suspension upon 32 Benjamin Hynes-Stone's Oregon educator licenses. Upon reinstatement, there will be a 33 two (2) year period of Probation on Hynes-Stone's Oregon educator license. 34 Furthermore, Hynes-Stone is subject to the following conditions: 35 1. Hynes-Stone shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical 36 Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 37 584, Division 020.

1	2.	Within the first six (6) months of probation, Hynes Stone will provide evidence of	
2		a Commission approved drug and alcohol evaluation. If any treatment is	
3		recommended, evidence of participation in a treatment program.
