## 1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 4 Educator License of ) FINAL ORDER OF PUBLIC 5 ) SCOTT J. CLARK REPRIMAND AND PROBATION 6 7 8 On May 5, 2023, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received a School District Misconduct report alleging possible professional misconduct 9 10 on the part of licensed educator, Scott J. Clark (Clark). The report alleges that Clark failed to adequately supervise a student with a medical condition at recess time. The 11 12 report indicates that the student remained in the classroom unsupervised while the rest 13 of Clark's class was at recess. While alone in Clark's classroom, the student had a medical 14 episode. 15 After review of the matters alleged, Clark and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to 16 17 certain facts and the imposition of a Public Reprimand on Clark's Oregon educator's 18 license as well as a four (4) year period of probation. Additionally, the Commission and 19 Clark agree that Clark will attend and complete an approved Classroom Management 20 training. 21 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 22 sanction to be imposed. Clark stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the 23 Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set 24 forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Clark waives the right to a hearing to 25 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. By signing below, Clark acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the 26 27 following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the 28 findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally 29 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) 30 31 this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon 32 request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not 33 approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Clark nor the 34

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Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and

1 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or

2 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of

3 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has

4 been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has

consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully

advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an

attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of

the Stipulated Final Order below.

## STIPULATION OF FACTS

 1. The Commission has licensed Clark since November 14, 2019. Clark held an Emergency Teaching License with an endorsement in Elementary Multiple Subjects (PK-12) which was issued on November 1, 2023 and expired on June 30, 2024. Additionally, Clark previously held a Restricted Teaching License, with endorsements in Elementary Multiple Subjects (PK-12) which was valid from July 1, 2022 and expired on June 30, 2023. During all relevant times, Clark was employed by the Reedsport School District (RSD).

2. On May 5, 2023, TSPC received a School District Misconduct Report from the Superintendent of RSD, Jonathan Zwemke, (Zwemke) alleging professional misconduct against Clark, a teacher in the RSD. The report specifically alleged that Clark failed to supervise a student with a medical condition when the student remained in his classroom unattended while Clark and the rest of the class went to recess. While alone during recess in the classroom, the student had a medical episode and was found by another staff. Shortly after being discovered by the other staff, Clark and the rest of the class returned from recess, and Clark tended to the student. The school nurse was contacted who responded to Clark's classroom and moved the student to the front office.

3. According to RSD records and TSPC's investigation, the following events were substantiated:

1 On January 18, 2023, Clark was given a Letter of Reprimand by the RSD for 2 allowing his classroom of students to attend morning recess without any adult 3 supervision for approximately 15 minutes. On March 10, 2023, Clark and the RSD mutually agreed that Clark would 4 5 resign his position at the RSD via a Separation Agreement. On May 2, 2023, Clark released his students to the playground for afternoon 6 7 recess. Clark left the classroom with his students. 8 9 Student RR, a 12-year old male student with a medical condition, stayed behind in Clark's classroom. 10 Student RR was alone in Clark's classroom for approximately 15 minutes. 11 12 At an unknown time during the recess break, student RR suffered a medical 13 episode. (Seizure) Another school staff member dropped by Clark's classroom to make a delivery 14 and noticed RR on the floor having a seizure. 15 The staff member began rendering assistance to RR. 16 Shortly after RR was discovered by the other staff, Clark and his class 17 returned to the classroom. 18 Clark assisted the staff member with RR, who regained consciousness. 19 20 The school nurse responded to Clark's classroom to tend to RR, and he was removed to the front office to recover via wheelchair. 21 The events listed above were confirmed by a review of recorded video that 22 23 was recorded on the schools CCTV system. 24 On May 10, 2023, Clark was placed on administrative leave while this matter 25 was investigated by the RSD. 26 27 28 IT IS SONSTIPULATED: Scott J. 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1 CONCLUSION OF LAW 2 The conduct described in sections two (2), and three (3) above constitutes 3 gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional 4 5 judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and 6 7 regulations). 9 10 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon 11 ORS 342.175. 12 ORDER 13 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and 14 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on Clark's Oregon 15 educator license and four (4) years probation with a condition to complete an approved 16 Classroom Management course. The period of probation will become effective on the date of 17 adoption of this stipulated order. The period of probation is subject to the following 18 conditions: 19 1. Clark shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of 20 Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 21 020. 22 2.
