CARSON, NEWMAN N. ) REPRIMAND AND PROBATION

On October 30, 2023, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received an Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS/OTIS) cross report. The report alleged possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed educator, Carson N. Newman (Newman).

After review of the matters alleged, Newman and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a public reprimand of his Oregon Educator License and a period of probation.

This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. Newman stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission’s files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Newman waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

By signing below, Newman acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Newman nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has

1 consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully  
2 advised with regard to his rights thereto or waives any and all rights to consult with an  
3 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of  
4 the Stipulated Final Order below.

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6 **STIPULATION OF FACTS**

7 1. The Commission has licensed Newman since October 2, 2023. Newman holds  
8 a Restricted Teaching License, with an endorsement in Social Studies (PK-12)  
9 which was valid from October 2, 2023, to June 30, 2024. During all relevant  
10 times, Newman was employed by the Eagle Point School District (EPSD).

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12 2. On October 30, 2023, the Commission received an Oregon Department of  
13 Human Services (DHS/OTIS) cross report alleging misconduct on the part of  
14 Newman. Specifically, the report alleges that Newman was emotionally  
15 abusive towards students; screaming and cursing at them, calling them  
16 names, and throwing papers and punching walls. Additionally, it was reported  
17 that Newman told students that he was going to kill himself because of them.



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19 3. Investigation determined the following:

- 20 • On October 3, 2023, an instructional assistant reported to the school  
21 office that Newman was “losing it” and requested staff respond to  
22 Newman’s 8<sup>th</sup> grade social studies classroom immediately.
- 23 • Staff and administrators responded to Newman’s classroom, where  
24 students exiting his classroom expressed concern about Newman’s  
25 behavior.
- 26 • Later in the day on October 3, 2023, school administration received  
27 several complaints from parents about Newman’s behavior.
- 28 • On October 3, 2023, Newman was placed on administrative leave while  
29 the district investigated the matter.
- 30 • Witnesses reported that Newman told students that he was “so tired of  
31 this....I’m going to just off myself.”
- 32 • Witnesses reported that Newman gave students permission to slap

- 1 other students if they annoyed each other or were talking.
- 2 • Witnesses reported that Newman punched a wall because students got
- 3 up to sharpen their pencils.
- 4 • Witnesses report that Newman used explicit language in class;
- 5 frequently using the word “shit” and “fuck.”
- 6 • On October 15, 2023, Newman resigned his position with the EPSD.

17 **CONCLUSION OF LAW**

18 *Your conduct as described in section three (3) above, constitutes gross neglect of*

19 *duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR*

20 *584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district*

21 *lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (Skill in*

22 *communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents and other patrons) and*

23 *OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring*

24 *appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times).*

26 **ORDER**

27 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and

28 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a public reprimand and two (2) years of

29 probation on your Oregon educator’s license. The period of probation will become effective

30 on the adoption date of this Stipulated Order. The period of probation is subject to the


31 following conditions:

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1. Newman shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.
2. Newman will complete Classroom Management training within the first six (6) months of probation.
