DRIGEN, JACLYNN J.	)	REPRIMAND AND PROBATION

On February 1, 2024, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received an internal referral from TSPC licensure staff. The referral alleged possible professional misconduct on the part of you, Jaclynn J. Drigen (Drigen), a licensed educator. Specifically, the report alleged that you worked without a valid Oregon teaching license from March 14, 2022 to January 4, 2024.

After review of the matters alleged, Drigen and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a public reprimand of her Oregon Educator License.

This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. Drigen stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Drigen waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

By signing below, Drigen acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Drigen nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) she has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully

2 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of
3 the Stipulated Final Order below.

5 **STIPULATION OF FACTS**

6 1. The Commission has licensed Drigen since August 31, 2005. Drigen holds a
7 Professional Teaching License with an endorsement in English to Speakers of
8 Other Languages (PK-12) and Elementary (PK-12), which is valid from
9 February 2, 2024, and expires on March 13, 2029. During all relevant times,
10 Drigen was employed by the Centennial School District (CSD).
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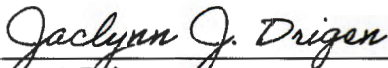
12 2. On February 1, 2024, the Commission received an internal referral from TSPC
13 licensure staff alleging that Drigen had worked without a valid license from
14 March 14, 2022 until January 4, 2024, a period of approximately one (1) year
15 and ten (10) months.
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17 3. Investigation by CSD and TSPC determined the following:
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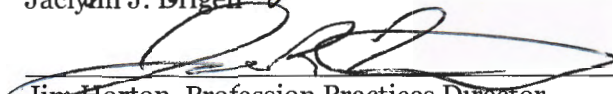
- 19 • Drigen was employed by the CSD as a teacher during the 2021-2022,
20 2022-2023, and 2023-2024 school years.
- 21 • On March 13, 2022, Drigen's Professional Teaching License expired.
- 22 • Drigen discovered the error and made contact with CSD Human
23 Resources in hopes of remedying the matter.
- 24 • On April 19, 2023, Drigen applied for renewal but owed a late fee.
- 25 • On April 19, 2023, TSPC licensure staff informed Drigen that she was
26 not eligible for the grace period regarding the late fee, and that the fee
27 would have to be paid.
- 28 • On September 5, 2023, TSPC closed Drigen's application due to the
29 outstanding late fee.
- 30 • Drigen states that her TSPC account was linked to an old email address
31 that she no longer used so she did not receive the emails TSPC sent her
32 regarding the late fees.

- On January 4, 2024, Drigen applied for licensure renewal again.
- On February 2, 2024, Drigen's renewed license was issued.
- During the period Drigen's license was expired, she continued to teach for a period of one (1) year and ten (10) months.
- During Drigen's interview with TSPC investigative staff on April 1, 2026, she admitted to allowing her licensure to lapse and cited the stress and confusion of COVID as well as some medical complications she had experienced as the reason for her failure to renew.
- During Drigen's interview with TSPC staff she reported that she has taken steps to make sure that her license doesn't lapse in the future by setting reminders on her smart phone calendar.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The above conduct described in section three (3) above, constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(r) (Working without a license); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), and OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations).

ORDER

The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a public reprimand and two (2) years of

1 probation. The period of probation will become effective on the date of adoption of this
2 stipulated order. The period of probation is subject to the following conditions:

- 3 1. Drigen shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical
4 Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules
5 Chapter 584, Division 020.
