Educator License of) FINAL ORDER OF PUBLIC
TYLER A. NEBEKER) REPRIMAND AND PROBATION

On May 8, 2024, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received a report from the Oregon Department of Human Services which contained allegations that Tyler A. Nebeker (Nebeker) may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness.

After review of the matters alleged, Nebeker and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a Public Reprimand and a four (4) year period of probation with conditions.

This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. Nebeker stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission’s files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Nebeker waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

By signing below, Nebeker acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Nebeker nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an

1 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of
2 the Stipulated Final Order below.



4 **STIPULATION OF FACTS**

- 5 1. The Commission has licensed Tyler A. Nebeker since February 7, 2022. Nebeker
6 holds a Preliminary Teaching License, with an endorsement in Social Studies
7 (PK-12), valid from November 14, 2025, through February 3, 2029. During all
8 relevant times, Nebeker was employed by the Woodburn School District (WSD).
9
- 10 2. On May 8, 2024, the Commission received a report from Oregon’s Department of
11 Human Services reporting that on May 7, 2024, Nebeker pushed a table into a
12 middle school student sitting in a chair causing the student and chair to fall
13 backward onto the ground resulting in the student suffering temporary shoulder
14 pain.
15
- 16 3. Investigation found that on April 22, 2024, Nebeker was issued a letter of reprimand
17 with directives for making unprofessional comments to two students.
18
- 19 4. Investigation found that during Nebeker’s second period social studies class at French
20 Prairie Middle School on May 7, 2024, a student in Nebeker’s classroom moved the
21 table at which he was assigned. Nebeker pushed the table to move it back to where it
22 belonged, and it made contact with the student who was leaning back in his chair,
23 causing the student and the chair he was seated in to fall backwards onto the floor.
24 Nebeker asked the student if he was okay. The student later reported that he had
25 experienced temporary pain in his shoulder immediately after falling to the floor.
26
- 27 5. Investigation found that on May 7, 2024, Nebeker was placed on administrative leave
28 pending the outcome of a district investigation into the incident. On June 17, 2024,
29 Nebeker signed a separation agreement with the WSD effective June 18, 2024.
30
- 31 6. Investigation found that on February 5, 2025, the Marian County District Attorney’s
32 Office accused Nebeker of one misdemeanor count of Harassment. On August 15,
33 2025, Nebeker signed a civil compromise agreement and the charge against Nebeker
34 was dismissed.
