10	On May 28, 2024, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission					
11	(Commission) received two Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) cross reports.					
12	The reports alleged possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed educator,					
13	Casey R. Baarson (Baarson).					
14	After review of the matters alleged, Baarson and the Commission agree that their					
15	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to					
16	certain facts, a public reprimand, and a period of probation and/or training.					
17	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the					
18	sanction to be imposed. Baarson stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the					
19	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set					
20	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Baarson waives the right to a hearing to					
21	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.					
22	By signing below, Baarson acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to					
23	the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest					
24	the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally					
25	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of					
26	Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order);					
27	(ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public					
28	upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent					
29	upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does					
30	not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Baarson nor the					
31	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and					
32	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or					
33	duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of					
34	the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has					
35	been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has

consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully

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1	ad	ivised with regard to his rights thereto or waives any and all rights to consult with an				
2	attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of					
3		the Stipulated Final Order below.

5		STIPULATION OF FACTS				
6	1.	The Commission has licensed Baarson since December 20, 2013. Baarson				
7		holds a Preliminary Teaching License with endorsements in Health, Physical				
8		Education and Legacy Middle Level (PK-12) which was issued on April 8,				
9		2023 and expires on April 7, 2026. During all relevant times, Baarson was				
10		employed by the Salem-Keizer School District (SKSD).				
11						
12	2.	On May 28, 2024, TSPC received two DHS screening reports that outlined				
13		allegations made against Baarson, a Physical Education (PE) teacher at				
14		Harritt Elementary School (HES) in the SKSD. The first allegation alleged				
15		that on May 20, 2024, Baarson grabbed a 7-year-old student by her				
16		arm/wrist, stepped on her foot and told her to "shut your mouth." The second				
17		DHS report documented an alleged incident that occurred on May 13, 2024				
18		This report alleged that Baarson pulled a different 7-year-old student onto his				
19		lap and would not let him go. DHS conducted a child abuse and wrongful				
20		restraint investigation for this matter, which resulted in an "unfounded"				
21		determination.				
22						
23						
24	3.	According to SKSD records and TSPC's investigation, the following events				
25		were substantiated:				
26		On May 20, 2024, Baarson grabbed 7-year-old HES student A, by her				
27		arm/wrist and stepped on her foot to prevent her from running and				
28		acting out in PE class.				
29		 Student A reported the incident to her parents, who in turn notified the 				
30		administration at HES.				
31		The SKSD investigated this matter and provided recorded CCTV video				
32		footage of the incident to TSPC.				

3	•	The video also shows Baarson step on the top of student A's right foot		
4		for approximately two seconds.		
5	•	The video shows student A leaning away from Baarson and attempting		
6		to push him off of her foot.		
7	•	After Baarson removes his foot and student A begins pulling away,		
8		Baarson walks alongside her, holding her hand.		
9	•	During the SKSD interview, Baarson admitted that he had gotten		
10		frustrated with student A and had told her to "shut her mouth."		
11	•	On May 13, 2023, 7-year-old HES student B had reported to his family		
12		that Baarson had pulled him on to his lap and would not let him go.		
13	•	SKSD provided TSPC with recorded CCTV video footage of the		
14		incident. The footage shows Baarson sit down in a chair, lift student B		
15		by the armpits onto his left leg and engage in conversation with student		
16		В.		
17	•	In his TSPC interview, Baarson explained that other students were		
18		escalated, and he was trying to prevent student B from getting involved		
19		in their escalation, given student B's previous involvement in physical		
20		altercations with other students.		
21	•	The recorded video footage of the incident shows that Baarson held		
22		student B against his will on his left leg with his arm around student		
23		B's waist for approximately one and one-half minutes, after which time		
24		Baarson put student B down, stood up and walked across the gym.		
25				
26 27	4. Durin	g the course of TSPC's investigation into the incidents listed above, the		
28	following events were also reviewed and substantiated:			
29	•	In February of 2024, the SKSD Instruction Tech Support (ITS) found		
30		several chat messages between Baarson and his students on the		
31		district's school-based online platform, Clever.		
32	•	The messages ITS found were from 2023 and 2024 and occurred

1		during the evening hours, after school.		
2	•	In some of the Clever messages from students, one student told		
3		Baarson that they loved him, another calle	ed Baarson "cute" and yet	
4		another called Baarson "sexy." Another stu	ident said in a message to	
5		Baarson that she wanted to "marry" him a	_	
6	•	Baarson did not respond to these statemen		
7		these statements back to students.	•	
8	•	The SKSD did find other messages that she	owed that Baarson engaged	
9		in personal conversations with students and confirmed that Baarson		
10		had previously occasionally played Fortnit		
11		outside of school hours.		
12	•	The students Baarson engaged in conversa	ation over Clever were	
13		students that were between the ages of 8-9.		
14	•			
15		admitted to receiving inappropriate messa	ages from students, but	
16		clarified that he did not respond to them.		
17	 During Baarson's SKSD interview he also admitted that he had never 			
18		notified district administration about the	inappropriate messages he	
19		had received from students over Clever.		
20	•	On February 21, 2024, Baarson received a	Letter of Directive from the	
21		SKSD outlining their expectations for mai	ntaining appropriate	
22		boundaries with students at all times. The	letter referenced SKSD	
23		policy PCP-Woo6 "Maintaining Appropria	ate Staff-Student	
24		Boundaries."

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CONCLUSION OF LAW

The conduct described above in sections two (2) and three (3) constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), and 584-020-0040(4)(d)(Unreasonable physical force against students, fellow employees, or visitors to the school, except as permitted under ORS 339.250)..

The conduct described in section four (4) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations) and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times)

19 ORDER

The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand of Baarson's Oregon Educator License as well as a two (2) year period of probation. The period of probation will become effective on the date of adoption of this stipulated order. The period of probation is subject to the following conditions:

1. Baarson will complete a certified Boundaries training within the first year of probation.

Baarson will complete a certified De-Escalation training within the first year of
 probation.

 Baarson shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.
