6   **STIPULATION OF FACTS AND**  
7   **FINAL ORDER OF PUBLIC**  
8   **REPRIMAND AND PROBATION**  
9

10           On December 12, 2024, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission  
11 (Commission) received a School District Misconduct Report from the Seaside School  
12 District (SSD). The report alleged possible professional misconduct on the part of  
13 licensed educator, Jaclyn L. Marchioro (Marchioro).

14           After review of the matters alleged, Marchioro and the Commission agree that  
15 their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a  
16 stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a public reprimand of her Oregon  
17 Educator License, a period of probation, and required Boundaries training.

18           This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the  
19 sanction to be imposed. Marchioro stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in  
20 the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law  
21 set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Marchioro waives the right to a hearing  
22 to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

23           By signing below, Marchioro acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees  
24 to the following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to  
25 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and  
26 finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this  
27 Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and  
28 Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to  
29 the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is  
30 contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the  
31 Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither  
32 Marchioro nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read  
33 this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily,  
34 without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to  
35 issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or  
36 representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and



1 (vii) she has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and  
2 has been fully advised with regard to her rights thereto or waives any and all rights to  
3 consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and  
4 issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

#### 6 **STIPULATION OF FACTS**

7 1. The Commission has licensed Marchioro since August 31, 2022. Marchioro holds  
8 a Preliminary Teaching License with endorsements in Music (PK-12) which was  
9 issued on August 31, 2022 and expires on August 5, 2026. During all relevant  
10 times, Marchioro was employed by the Seaside School District (SSD).  
11

12 2. On December 12, 2024, the Commission received a School District Misconduct  
13 Report from the SSD alleging professional misconduct on the part of Marchioro,  
14 a teacher at Seaside High School (SHS). The report alleged that Marchioro  
15 crossed physical boundaries by rubbing and scratching student's backs, as well as  
16 touching students with student's arms, legs, backs and thighs. It was also alleged  
17 that Marchioro told students that they looked "sexy" and "hot" when talking  
18 about how students dressed. Additionally, it was alleged that Marchioro treated  
19 students more like friends than students, and that Marchioro maintained an  
20 inappropriate relationship with a male student who she allowed to feed her food  
21 in front of a classroom of students. Finally, it was alleged that Marchioro  
22 communicated with students using social media and group chat applications and  
23 played inappropriate songs with explicit language in class which caused some  
24 students to feel uncomfortable and leave class.  
25

26 The Commission received a second School District Misconduct report on January  
27 21, 2025, alleging additional misconduct. This report alleged that Marchioro had  
28 been seen on recorded video licking a student's hand in class.  
29

30 3. The Commission conducted an investigation and concluded that Marchioro  
31 engaged in the following conduct:  
32

- Investigation determined that Marchioro engaged in inappropriate behavior with students by commenting on their physical appearances and referring to one student as a "stud muffin" when discussing his role in a school play.
- Marchioro engaged in communication with students via her personal cell phone and "group chats."
- While engaging in horseplay, Marchioro inadvertently made contact with a student's hand with her tongue. The contact made the student feel uncomfortable.
- Marchioro accepted gifts from a student in the form of food and drinks they would brought her on two occasions.

### CONCLUSION OF LAW

*The conduct described in section three (3) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times).*



1 **ORDER**

2 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and  
3 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a public reprimand and a three (3) year  
4 period of probation. The period of probation will become effective on the date of adoption of  
5 this stipulated order. The period of probation is subject to the following conditions:

- 7 1. Marchioro shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical  
8 Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter  
9 584, Division 020.  
10 2. Marchioro shall complete a certified Boundaries training within the first year of  
11 probation.
