On March 25, 2025, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received a School District Misconduct Report from the Douglas County School District (District) reporting that Jessalynn V. Hall (Hall) may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness.

After review of the matters alleged, Hall and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a Suspension of sixty (60) days and a Probation period of two (2) years with conditions.

This Order sets forth the Commission's facts upon which the sanction is to be imposed. Hall stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Hall waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

By signing below, Hall acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: (i) she has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Hall nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) she has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) she voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) she states that no promise or representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) she has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an

attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

STIPULATION OF FACTS

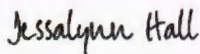
1. The Commission has licensed Hall since August 24, 2016. Hall holds a Preliminary Teaching License, with endorsements in Advanced Mathematics (PK-12), Biology (PK-12), and Health Sciences Career and Technical Education (CTE) (PK-12), valid from December 18, 2023, through January 21, 2027. During all relevant times, Hall was employed by Days Creek Charter School which is sponsored by the Douglas County School District (DCSD).
2. On March 25, 2025, the Commission received a misconduct report from the district reporting allegations that Hall may have engaged in conduct that may be considered gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, it was reported that on multiple occasions in February and March 2025, Hall allegedly took school and student property from her classroom at Days Creek Charter School without permission.
3. Investigation found that during a class on September 25, 2024, Hall made a comment to a student about an aspect of a student's Individualized Education Program. Hall's comment was heard by other students in the class. During the school's investigation, Hall denied making the comment. However, students interviewed reported that Hall made the comment. On December 9, 2024, Hall was given a letter of reprimand for the incident.
4. Investigation found that on March 3, 2025, a student reported to school office staff that his headphones were missing from the science classroom. Staff reviewed video from the classroom and observed Hall placing the student's headphones in a bag behind her desk. Staff observed on video Hall leaving campus with the bag later that day. During an interview with a law enforcement officer at Hall's residence, Hall said she had the headphones, retrieved them and then returned them to the officer. Hall explained to the officer that she placed the headphones in her bag because she was concerned that another group of students who would be using the classroom later in the day might take or damage the headphones.

5. Investigation found that following the report of the missing headphones, staff reviewed additional video footage from Hall's classroom and found that from the period of February 11-25, 2025, there were approximately eight (8) instances of Hall placing equipment and materials from her classroom into bags and boxes which Hall removed from campus. During the law enforcement investigation into the matter, Hall told the investigating officer that she was retrieving items she had personally purchased, not the school, to assist her in teaching science classes. Hall was able to provide receipts for some, but not all, of material she removed from her classroom and which she claimed to have purchased with personal funds.

6. At the conclusion of law enforcement's investigation into the facts four (4) and five (5) above, the Douglas County District Attorney's Office declined to file charges against Hall.

7. Investigation found that on February 25, 2025, Hall was observed on video teaching an eleventh-grade chemistry class. During the class, Hall entered a supply closet on several occasions, sometimes for less than a minute to several occasions of several minutes. During the class, students in the classroom were observed engaging in unsafe practices with Bunsen burners and not wearing required personal protective equipment

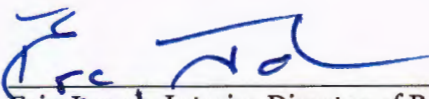

CONCLUSION OF LAW

Jessalynn V. Hall's conduct as described in section four (4) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (*Recognize the worth*

1 *and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual*), OAR 584-020-
2 0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (*Using*
3 *district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*).

4 Hall's conduct as described in section five (5) above constitutes gross
5 neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it
6 incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (*Recognize the worth and dignity of all*
7 *persons and respect for each individual*), OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use*
8 *professional judgment*), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(b) (*Using and maintaining*
9 *district property, equipment a, and materials appropriately*); OAR 584-020-
10 0040 (4)(a) (*Substantial unauthorized use of : school name or financial credit;*
11 *school materials or equipment for personal purpose; or school personnel to*
12 *provide personal services unrelated to school purposes*).

13 Hall's conduct described in section six (6) above constitutes gross neglect
14 of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it
15 incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), OAR 584-020-
16 0020(2)(d) (*Skill in the supervision of students*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e)
17 (*Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*).

18 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
19 ORS 342.175.

21 **ORDER**

22 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
23 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Suspension of sixty (60) days upon
24 Jessalynn V. Hall's Oregon educator license.

25 Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of two (2) years of probation
26 upon Hall's license to commence from the date the order is signed by the Commission
27 and subject to the following condition:

- 28 1. Hall shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical
29 Performance of Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules
30 Chapter 584, Division 020.
31 2. Within the first six (6) months of probation, Hall shall successfully
32 complete a Commission-approved training course on classroom

1 management and provide evidence to the Commission of such training
