Educator License of)	REVOCATION OF RIGHT TO
JENNIFER A. RADULESK)	TO APPLY FOR LICENSURE

On January 19, 2023, and March 17, 2025, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) received reports alleging Jennifer A. Radulesk (Radulesk), may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, it was alleged Radulesk violated teacher/student boundaries.

After review of the matters alleged, Radulesk and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a revocation of Radulesk's right to apply for an Oregon educator license.

This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the sanction to be imposed. Radulesk stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Radulesk waives the right to a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.

By signing below, Radulesk acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the following: (i) Radulesk has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of revocation of her right to apply for an Oregon educator license (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Radulesk nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) Radulesk has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) Radulesk voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) Radulesk states that no promise or representation has been made to induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) Radulesk has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised

1 with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney
2 prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the
3 Stipulated Final Order below.

5 **STIPULATION OF FACTS**

6 1. The Commission has licensed Radulesk since May 15, 2009. Radulesk held a
7 Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Social Studies (PK-12),
8 English Language Arts (PK-12), Health (PK-12), Legacy Middle Level (PK-12) and
9 Family and Consumer Science (PK-12), valid from March 21, 2018, through
10 October 17, 2023. Radulesk also held a Principal License, with an endorsement
11 in Principal (PK-12), valid from January 31, 2020, through October 17, 2023. On
12 January 11, 2023, Radulesk submitted applications for renewal of her
13 Professional Teaching License and her administrator license. On October 29,
14 2025, Radulesk withdrew her pending licensure applications. During all relevant
15 times, Radulesk was employed by the Corbett School District (CSD) at Corbet
16 High School (CHS).

17
18 2. On January 19, 2023, the Commission received a School District Misconduct
19 report from the CSD with allegations Radulesk failed to report misconduct she
20 was aware of involving a CHS teacher Brandon Aye's alleged inappropriate
21 physical contact with two (2) female CHS students; his furnishing alcohol and
22 non-prescribed medications to CHS students; and his drinking alcohol at parties
23 with minor-aged, CHS students and under-aged, former CHS students. In the
24 report, the CSD alleged Radulesk attempted to interfere in the District's
25 investigation of Aye. The CSD also alleged Radulesk failed to maintain
26 appropriate teacher/student boundaries by disclosing to some CHS students
27 details of her relationship with Aye; socializing with CHS students away from
28 school; and transporting CHS students in her personal automobile.



30 On March 17, 2025, the Commission received a public complaint from a former
31 CHS student with allegations that Radulesk allowed a minor-aged student to
32 reside in Radulesk's home and while there, Radulesk provided the student
33 alcohol and marijuana.

- 1 3. Investigation found that on December 6, 2021, Radulesk was counseled by the CSD
2 superintendent for an incident involving a student in a challenging situation. On a
3 weekend in late November or early December 2021, a CHS student contacted
4 Radulesk via social media about the student needing a ride and not having a place to
5 go. Radulesk arranged a ride home for the student through a transportation service.
6 The superintendent counseled Radulesk that in the future, students in danger need to
7 be reported to DHS. Radulesk was also counseled that communicating with students
8 should only occur through district email with her supervisor and the student's parents
9 being included. Radulesk was cautioned about interacting with students on social
10 media.
11
- 12 4. Investigation found that on January 9, 2023, Student 1, a former CHS student,
13 contacted Radulesk by phone in advance of a meeting between Student 1 and a CHS
14 administrator. In that call, Student 1 shared with Radulesk that Aye had massaged
15 her and that he had provided alcohol to and inappropriately touched another minor-
16 aged female CHS student. During Radulesk's District interview, she acknowledged
17 that after her phone conversation with Student 1, Radulesk admitted to failing to
18 report this to the proper authorities and school administrators.
19
- 20 5. On January 9, 2023, when Radulesk learned Student 1 would be meeting with a
21 school administrator, Radulesk requested Student 1 not tell the administrator that
22 Radulesk and Student 1 talked that day. Investigation found that during the
23 investigation of the CHS teacher, Radulesk was in contact by phone and text with a
24 current and former CHS students who were part of the investigation, to learn what
25 was being shared with the district regarding the investigation.
26
- 27 6. Investigation found that on an unspecified school day during the 2021-22 school year,
28 Radulesk transported two (2) students in her personal vehicle to a shopping mall in
29 violation of CSD policy EEAE *Student Transportation in Private Vehicle*.
30
- 31 7. Investigation found that during Radulesk's tenure at CHS, she was observed
32 socializing with CHS students, purchasing lunches for students, meeting with
33 students at location off-campus and engaging students in social media and digital
34 communication about non-school related topics.

1 8. Investigation found that January 2020, Student 2, a female student who was a junior
2 at CHS and in a challenging home situation, was brought to Radulesk's house by her
3 father to temporarily live with Radulesk. The district was aware of the arrangement.
4

5 9. Investigation found that in 2020, while Student 2 temporarily resided with Radulesk,
6 Radulesk furnished and used alcohol with the student at Radulesk's home. After the
7 Student 2 graduated and while still under the age of twenty-one (21), she regularly
8 spent time with Radulesk who continued to provide and consume alcohol with
9 Student 2.

22 **CONCLUSION OF LAW**

23 Jennifer A. Radulesk's conduct as described in section four (4) above constitutes gross
24 neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(s) (*Failing to*
25 *report child abuse pursuant to ORS 419B.010*); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it
26 incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e)
27 (*Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*).

28 Radulesk's conduct as described in section five (5) above constitutes gross neglect of
29 duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR
30 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (*Using district*
31 *lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*).

32 Radulesk's conduct as described in section six (6) above constitutes gross neglect of
33 duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates, OAR
34 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional judgment*), and OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (*Using district*
35 *lawful and reasonable rules and regulations*); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it
36 incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (*Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with*
37 *students in conduct and conversations at all times*).

1 Radulesk's conduct as described in section seven (7) above constitutes gross neglect of
2 duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o) as it incorporates OAR
3 584-020-0035(1)(c)(A) (*Not demonstrating or expressing professionally inappropriate*
4 *interest in a student's personal life*), OAR 584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (*Honoring appropriate*
5 *adult boundaries with students in conduct and conversations at all times*); and OAR 584-
6 020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (*Recognize the worth and dignity*
7 *of all persons and respect for each individual*) and OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use professional*
8 *judgment*).

9 Radulesk's conduct as described in section nine (9) above constitutes gross neglect of
10 duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e) (*Admission of or*
11 *engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a conviction*); and
12 OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(1) (*Recognize the worth*
13 *and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual*) and OAR 584-020-0010(5) (*Use*
14 *professional judgment*).

15 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS
16 342.175.

18 ORDER

19 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and
20 conclusions of law, and based thereon, revokes Jennifer A. Radulesk's right to apply for an
21 Oregon educator license.
