RADULESK) TO APPLY FOR LICENSURE 8 9 On January 19, 2023, and March 17, 2025, the Teacher Standards and Practices 10 Commission (Commission) received reports alleging Jennifer A. Radulesk (Radulesk), 11 may have committed acts of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, it 12 was alleged Radulesk violated teacher/student boundaries. 13 After review of the matters alleged, Radulesk and the Commission agree that 14 their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a 15 stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a revocation of Radulesk's right to apply 16 for an Oregon educator license. 17 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 18 sanction to be imposed. Radulesk stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in 19 the Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law 20 set forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Radulesk waives the right to a hearing 21 to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 22 By signing below, Radulesk acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to 23 the following: (i) Radulesk has been fully advised of her rights to notice and a hearing to 24 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and 25 finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this 26 Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of revocation of her right to apply for an Oregon 27 educator license (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a 28 public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this 29 Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and subject to approval and adoption by 30 the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and 31 Final Order, then neither Radulesk nor the Commission are bound by the terms herein; 32 (iv) Radulesk has fully read this Stipulation and Final Order, and understands it 33 completely; (v) Radulesk voluntarily, without any force or duress, enters into this 34 Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final 35 Order below; (vi) Radulesk states that no promise or representation has been made to

induce her to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) Radulesk has consulted

with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised

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with regard to her rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the 3 Stipulated Final Order below.

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STIPULATION OF FACTS

1. The Commission has licensed Radulesk since May 15, 2009. Radulesk held a Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Social Studies (PK-12), English Language Arts (PK-12), Health (PK-12), Legacy Middle Level (PK-12) and Family and Consumer Science (PK-12), valid from March 21, 2018, through October 17, 2023. Radulesk also held a Principal License, with an endorsement in Principal (PK-12), valid from January 31, 2020, through October 17, 2023. On January 11, 2023, Radulesk submitted applications for renewal of her Professional Teaching License and her administrator license. On October 29, 2025, Radulesk withdrew her pending licensure applications. During all relevant times, Radulesk was employed by the Corbett School District (CSD) at Corbet High School (CHS).

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2. On January 19, 2023, the Commission received a School District Misconduct report from the CSD with allegations Radulesk failed to report misconduct she was aware of involving a CHS teacher Brandon Aye's alleged inappropriate physical contact with two (2) female CHS students; his furnishing alcohol and non-prescribed medications to CHS students; and his drinking alcohol at parties with minor-aged, CHS students and under-aged, former CHS students. In the report, the CSD alleged Radulesk attempted to interfere in the District's investigation of Aye. The CSD also alleged Radulesk failed to maintain appropriate teacher/student boundaries by disclosing to some CHS students details of her relationship with Aye; socializing with CHS students away from school; and transporting CHS students in her personal automobile.

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On March 17, 2025, the Commission received a public complaint from a former CHS student with allegations that Radulesk allowed a minor-aged student to reside in Radulesk's home and while there, Radulesk provided the student alcohol and marijuana.

33 34 3. Investigation found that on December 6, 2021, Radulesk was counseled by the CSD superintendent for an incident involving a student in a challenging situation. On a weekend in late November or early December 2021, a CHS student contacted Radulesk via social media about the student needing a ride and not having a place to go. Radulesk arranged a ride home for the student through a transportation service. The superintendent counseled Radulesk that in the future, students in danger need to be reported to DHS. Radulesk was also counseled that communicating with students should only occur through district email with her supervisor and the student's parents being included. Radulesk was cautioned about interacting with students on social media.

4. Investigation found that on January 9, 2023, Student 1, a former CHS student, contacted Radulesk by phone in advance of a meeting between Student 1 and a CHS administrator. In that call, Student 1 shared with Radulesk that Aye had massaged her and that he had provided alcohol to and inappropriately touched another minoraged female CHS student. During Radulesk's District interview, she acknowledged that after her phone conversation with Student 1, Radulesk admitted to failing to report this to the proper authorities and school administrators.

5. On January 9, 2023, when Radulesk learned Student 1 would be meeting with a school administrator, Radulesk requested Student 1 not tell the administrator that Radulesk and Student 1 talked that day. Investigation found that during the investigation of the CHS teacher, Radulesk was in contact by phone and text with a current and former CHS students who were part of the investigation, to learn what was being shared with the district regarding the investigation.

6. Investigation found that on an unspecified school day during the 2021-22 school year, Radulesk transported two (2) students in her personal vehicle to a shopping mall in violation of CSD policy EEAE Student Transportation in Private Vehicle.

7. Investigation found that during Radulesk's tenure at CHS, she was observed socializing with CHS students, purchasing lunches for students, meeting with students at location off-campus and engaging students in social media and digital communication about non-school related topics.
