10	On May 31, 2016, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission)
11	issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Jessica Leigh Stapp (Stapp) in which the
12	Commission charged her with Gross Neglect of Duty. The Notice was sent via U.S. First
13	Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 7015 0640 0004 7539 6984 to the address on file
14	with the Commission. The Notice designated the Commission file as the record for purposes
15	of proving a prima facie case. The Certified Mail receipt was returned to the Commission
16	"signed" on June 10, 2016. The first class mail was not returned to the Commission. The
17	Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated May 31, 2016, and signed by then Executive
18	Director, Victoria Chamberlain, stated:
19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	"IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING OR IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR AT A HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER DISCIPLINE."
27	On June 13, 2016, Stapp requested a hearing. On November 15, 2016, the Commission
28	received an email from Stapp advising that Stapp was withdrawing her request for a
29	hearing. The Commission, therefore, finds Stapp to be in default and enters the following
30	findings of fact, conclusions of law, and final order, based on the files and records of the
31	Commission concerning this matter.
32	FINDINGS OF FACT
33	1. On or about May 29, 2014, Stapp made application to the Commission and was
34	approved for her Student Teaching / Practicum. Stapp does not currently hold an
35	Oregon educator license. On October 1, 2015, Stapp made application to the
36	Commission for a Charter School Registry.

- 2. On Stapp's October 1, 2015, application for a Charter School Registry, Stapp 1 2 answered "Yes" to character question number seven (7), that states; "Have you ever 3 been disciplined by any public agency responsible for licensure of any kind, including but not limited to educational licensure?" Stapp provided a written 4 5 explanation for her affirmative answer, explaining that she had been dismissed from the teaching program at Southern Oregon University (SOU) for issues surrounding 6 Stapp's student teaching experience. Upon appeal, Stapp was reinstated to the SOU 7 8 program and placed again into a practicum / student teacher placement. Stapp again 9 failed to successfully complete the practicum portion of the program. As an alternative to the SOU teacher preparation program, Stapp completed a Master's
- 10 Degree in Education. 11

13 3. Stapp's answers to the character questions as well as her written explanation prompted an investigation into Stapp's failed attempts at student teaching. 14 15 Investigation determined that while Stapp was placed at Orchard Hill Elementary School for her student teaching, the principal and the cooperating teacher contacted 16 17 SOU and requested Stapp be removed from their school. School officials advised that Stapp had demonstrated a lack of professionalism and a lack of regard for 18 19 confidentiality with respect to students and families in the community. SOU officials 20 advised investigators that around the same time Stapp was removed from the 21 student teaching placement, Stapp also had poor grades in classes that required a grade of "B" or higher. As a result, Stapp was removed from the teacher preparation 22 program. An appeal decision by an interim dean reinstated Stapp into the program 23 24 and SOU assigned Stapp to Jacksonville Elementary School to complete her student teaching block. The administration and cooperating teacher of Jacksonville also 25 contacted SOU and requested that Stapp be removed from the student teaching 26 position at Jacksonville based on similar complaints as experienced at Orchard Hills. 27 Both involved schools advised that Stapp demonstrated a lack of professionalism, 28 was disrespectful, and did not have a filter when speaking with people. Stapp was 29 30 described as lacking needed social skills and maturity for the teaching profession.

1	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
2	Jessica Leigh Stapp engaged in unprofessional conduct as described above. This
3	conduct is grounds for denial of your charter school registration application under ORS
4	342.143(2). The above conduct also constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS
5	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use
6	professional judgment); OAR 584-020-0030(1)(The competent educator works effectively
7	$with\ others-Students, staff, parents, and\ patrons.\ The\ competent\ educator\ is\ aware\ of$
8	the ways the community identifies with the school, as well as community needs and ways
9	the school program is designed to meet these needs. The competent educator can
10	communicate with knowledge, clarity, and judgment about educational matters, the
11	school, and the needs of students), OAR 584-020-0030(2)(a)(The competent teacher
12	demonstrates willingness to be flexible in cooperatively working with others), OAR 584-
13	020-0030(2)(b)(Skill in communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents, and
14	other patrons); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as is incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(a)
15	Keep the confidence entrusted in the profession as it relates to confidential information
16	concerning a student and the student's family).
17	
18	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS
19	342.175.
20	FINAL ORDER
21	The Commission hereby denies Jessica Leigh Stapp's application for licensure and
22	revokes Jessica Leigh Stapp's right to apply for an Oregon educator license.

13	Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 7015 0640 0004 7539 6984 to the address on file
14	with the Commission. The Notice designated the Commission file as the record for purposes

27	On June 13, 2016, Stapp requested a hearing. On November 15, 2016, the Commission

On Stapp's October 1, 2015, application for a Charter School Registry, Stapp 1 2 answered "Yes" to character question number seven (7), that states; "Have you ever 3 been disciplined by any public agency responsible for licensure of any kind, including but not limited to educational licensure?" Stapp provided a written 4 5 explanation for her affirmative answer, explaining that she had been dismissed from the teaching program at Southern Oregon University (SOU) for issues surrounding 6 Stapp's student teaching experience. Upon appeal, Stapp was reinstated to the SOU 7 8 program and placed again into a practicum / student teacher placement. Stapp again 9 failed to successfully complete the practicum portion of the program. As an alternative to the SOU teacher preparation program, Stapp completed a Master's

14	other patrons); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as is incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(1)(a)
15	Keep the confidence entrusted in the profession as it relates to confidential information
16	concerning a student and the student's family).

18	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS
19	342.175.
20	FINAL ORDER
21	The Commission hereby denies Jessica Leigh Stapp's application for licensure and
22	revokes Jessica Leigh Stapp's right to apply for an Oregon educator license.
