On or about September 4, 1997, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission received a report from the Superintendent of Vernonia School District, indicating that Jeffery Aaron Smith entered into a Settlement Agreement, effective December 31, 1996, resigning his position subsequent to an investigation into allegations of inappropriate relationships with female students at Vernonia High School. On May 15, 1998, the Commission took action to charge Smith with violation of TSPC Standards. The Executive Director notified Smith of intent to revoke his Emergency Teaching license, and to inform him opportunity for hearing. The notice was dated May 20, 1998, and was signed by David V. Myton, Executive Director and sent by U.S. First Class and Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested to the two last known addresses in Smith's licensure file. All mailings were returned to TSPC marked "Moved Left no Address, Unable to Forward, Return to Sender." Under OAR 584-050-0042 educators are required to report changes of address to the Commission within 90 days of such change. Smith has not provided this information to TSPC. Smith did not request a hearing.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Jeffery Aaron Smith holds an Emergency Teaching License endorsed in technology education for Vernonia School District and valid from October 2, 1996 to October 2, 1998.
2. On November 7, 1997, Jeffery Smith contacted SJ, a female student from Vernonia High School, and asked her to meet him off campus for lunch in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(4).
3. On November 14, 1997, Jeffery Smith was alone in the shop with SJ, a female student from Vernonia High School. Smith told her that she is beautiful, has a lovely figure and that he would like to see her outside of school in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(4).
4. Smith made inappropriate comments to female students regarding their figure, appearance and size of breasts in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(4).
5. Smith engaged in discussions with female students regarding their personal problems and offered advice and counseling that exceeded his competence or role as an industrial arts teacher in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(4)(o).
6. Smith inappropriately revealed too much information about his personal life in discussions with students including sharing information with students about accusations by a 17-year-old regarding sexual comments to her in violation of OAR 584-020-0040(o).

ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

Jeffery Aaron Smith violated OAR 584-020-0040(4) in his inappropriate and overly personal relationships with female students at Vernonia High School.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Mr. Smith's conduct constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of OAR 584-020-004(4).

OPINION

Mr. Smith's conduct created an uncomfortable learning environment for female students at Vernonia High School. His comments to student SJ were an attempt to establish an inappropriate relationship in violation of trust placed in educators.

ORDER

The Commission revokes the Oregon Emergency Teaching License #298040, issued to Jeffery Aaron Smith, , for violation of OAR 584-020-0040 by his overly personal and inappropriate relationships with female students.

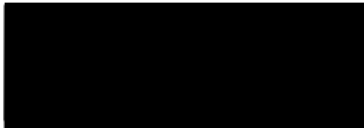
NOTICE OF APPEAL OR RIGHTS
