## ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT Douglas Scott Wagers violated Standards of Competent and Ethical Performance for 3 Oregon Educators in April 1998 by using McMinnville School District equipment and 4 5 electronic networks to display personal, non-educational, and sexually explicit materials in violation of school district policies. 6 7 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW 8 9 Under ORS 342.175 to 190, the Commission may revoke or suspend a license or impose 10 other disciplinary sanctions when an educator violates Standards of Competent and 11 12 Ethical Performance for Oregon Educators. 13 ORDER 14 15 The Commission suspends the Teaching License of Douglas Scott Wagers for thirty (30) 15 days from the date of this order, for gross neglect of duty. Prior to reinstatement of his 17 license, the Commission shall require Mr. Wagers to undergo, at his own expense, an 18 evaluation by a mutually acceptable medical professional who can attest to Mr. Wagers' 19 20 fitness to work with children and/or teenagers. Upon reinstatement of his license, Mr. Wagers shall be on probation for a period of two years. During probation Mr. Wagers 21 22 shall: 23 Conduct himself as a law-abiding citizen. 1. 24 2.
