9	issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to German Corona-Ruiz (Corona-Ruiz) in which the

11	First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt 7005 1160 0001 0494 2550 to the address
12	Mr. Corona-Ruiz provided to the Commission, together with a copy to Ralph Wiser, Attorney at
13	Law. The certified mail receipt was signed by Fabiola Camon and returned to the Commission
14	on September 18, 2006. The Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated August 15, 2006, and
15	signed by Victoria Chamberlain, Executive Director, stated:
16 19 20 21 22	"You, German Corona-Ruiz, are entitled to a hearing on the proposed action of the Commission. If you want a hearing, you must file a written request for a hearing with the Commission within 21 days of the date of this notice. Attached to this notice is a copy of the procedures, right of representation and other rights of parties relating to the conduct of a hearing as required under ORS 183.413(2)."
23	The Commission, therefore, finds Mr. Corona-Ruiz to be in default and enters the
24	following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order, based on the files and records of
25	the Commission concerning this matter.
26	FINDINGS OF FACT
27	1. Mr. Corona-Ruiz has been licensed by the Commission since August 23, 2000. The
28	Commission issued an Initial Teaching License to Mr. Corona-Ruiz on May 20, 2004, valid until
29	January 11, 2008, with a Spanish Endorsement.
30	2. Between August 21, 2000, and December 16, 2005, while teaching for Ontario
31	School District, Mr. Corona-Ruiz made sexual comments to students and had sexual contact
	with students.
